The organizational/regular meeting of the Board of Education of the Willoughby-Eastlake City School District was held Monday, **January 13, 2020** at 6:45 p.m. at the Administration Building located at 35353 Curtis Blvd., Eastlake, Ohio with the following members present: Thomas Beal, Brian Jones, Mike Merhar, John Roskos, and Amy Zuren.

All members of the Board and media were notified of this meeting in compliance with \$121.22 of the ORC, effective November 28, 1975.

A tax hearing took place prior to the beginning of the organizational/regular meeting.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. and the pledge of allegiance was given.

OATH OF OFFICE TO ELECTED BOARD MEMBERS- MIKE MERHAR, JOHN ROSKOS

ELECTION AND OATH OF OFFICE – BOARD OF EDUCATION PRESIDENT TO ONE-YEAR TERM (§3313.14)

Mr. Merhar nominated Dr. Beal as President.

Mr. Merhar nominated Mr. Jones as Vice- President.

*ESTABLISHMENT OF SERVICE FUND FOR FY 2020

According to §3315.15 ORC, the Treasurer of the Board of Education has certified that the number of pupils enrolled in the Willoughby-Eastlake City School District is **8,044** as of December 1, 2019.

By law, a sum not to exceed \$2.00 for each child so enrolled or \$20,000, whichever is greater, may be set aside from the General Fund to be known as the "Service Fund" to be used only in paying the expenses of the members of the Board of Education actually incurred in the performance of their duties, or of their official representatives when sent out of the school district for the purpose of promoting the welfare of the schools under their charge (§3315.15).

Be it resolved upon the recommendation of the Superintendent that a service fund be established by the Board of Education in the amount of \$20,000.

*RECOMMENDATIONS BY BOARD OF EDUCATION TO AUTHORIZE THE TREASURER

- A. To request advances on taxes collected in CY20.
- B. To reinvest available funds for CY20 in accordance with Board Policy and established administrative procedures. Summary of such investments will be reported monthly throughout the year.
- C. To pay bills within the adopted appropriations in CY20.

*LEGAL COUNSEL APPOINTMENTS

Be it resolved upon the recommendation of the Superintendent that the Superintendent of Schools and his designees be authorized to contact legal counsel as necessary for the successful performance of their duties. Legal counsel is designated to be: Squire Patton Boggs; Hoover Kacyon, LLC; Wachter Kurant, LLC; Walter Haverfield LLP; Fisher & Phillips LLP; and The Riley Law Firm.

*RESOLUTION REQUESTING NOTIFICATION

Be it resolved upon the recommendation of the Treasurer to approve the resolution requesting that the Board of Education be notified by the Tax Commissioner of any application for exemption from taxation for any property located within the district. The resolution is pursuant to §5715.27.

District PBIS Award Presentation

In 1997, an amendment of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) included the language, "Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports" which described methods used to identify and support desired behaviors in the school setting. The educational research community has been

developing and studying Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) ever since. PBIS seeks to reduce or eliminate poor behavior school-wide through the encouragement of positive behaviors. The goal of PBIS is to create a positive school climate in which students learn and grow.

Seven schools in our district received the Silver or Bronze PBIS award: Grant and Longfellow received the Silver award and Edison, Royalview, Jefferson, Willowick Middle and Eastlake Middle received the Bronze award.

Additionally, we received a district award. Only eleven school districts of the 600 plus districts in Ohio are PBIS Award recipients.

Ken Adams, Facilities & Transportation Manager, was present to provide a building maintenance update.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT- Resolutions

A. <u>Resolution Opposing the State of Ohio EdChoice Scholarship (Voucher) Program</u>

WHEREAS, the Ohio legislature has recently made amendments which greatly increase the number and availability of vouchers for students to attend private/parochial schools at public tax expense, and

WHEREAS, such vouchers will be available to numerous families and students who have never attended Willoughby-Eastlake City School District or any other public schools and for whom state funding has never been provided to Willoughby-Eastlake City School District or any other public schools, and

WHEREAS, the Willoughby-Eastlake City School District's state funding will be unjustly decreased by the amount of the vouchers provided to such families and students who have not and will not attend public schools and others who transfer to private/parochial schools, and

WHERAS, private/parochial schools accepting students with public tax vouchers would not be required to accept all students but would be permitted to retain their selective admission policies without enforcement of other laws applicable to public schools, and

WHEREAS, private/parochial school students are not subject to the testing standards required of public school students so that the actual performance of private/parochial schools subsidized with public tax dollars will not be known, relative to equivalent public school evaluation standards, and

WHEREAS, this Board believes that the EdChoice voucher program as it currently exists presents serious constitutional issues regarding the separation of church and state and the funding of religious institutions with public tax dollars, and

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio has the constitutional responsibility to secure a thorough and efficient system of common schools, and

WHEREAS, the EdChoice voucher program will have exactly the opposite effect by providing funding to private/parochial schools at the expense and to the detriment of public schools and their students.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Willoughby-Eastlake City School Board of Education that this Board reaffirms its commitment to free accessible public schools which are adequately and equitably funded to guarantee a comparable education for ALL children and therefore opposes and respectfully requests the repeal of the ill-conceived EdChoice voucher program of the State of Ohio.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Board opposes any funding programs, vouchers or otherwise, that have the effect of diverting public tax dollars from public schools to private/parochial schools.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to forward copies of this Resolution to all Ohio state legislators, the Superintendent of Public Instruction and Governor of the State of Ohio. Exhibit 6A
