MATH with Mrs. Wadsworth

Math 1 and 2 - We are diving deeper into multiplication, using properties, single and multi-digit numbers, and estimating/rounding.

Math 3 - Multiplication is our focus! We are looking at multiplication strategies, arrays, and other helpful strategies when solving multiplication problems.

All math groups are working on making up a song to help us learn multiplication facts. We presented these to our classes this week- they turned out great!

LITERACY with Mrs. Rosciszewski

We started our Novel Study of Fantastic Mr. Fox by researching some background information about the author, Roald Dahl. Students were introduced to Cornell Notes. This is a district wide initiative to improve comprehension of informational text. I explained it as a type of graphic organizer we use when note taking with non-fiction.

DISCOVERY with Mrs. Reed

Our local government field trip was very informative! We met people from the courthouse, Mayor's Office, police department, fire department, and library. If your child does not already have a library card, they were given an application. These can be returned to any Willoughby-Eastlake public library. We took some of our experience from our trip to begin looking at the structure of the local government. We talked about services provided by the government, how the government protects our laws, and how they make and enforce laws. We are working on locating key details under subheadings in Ohio Studies Weekly 10.

4th Grade Update

TECHNOLOGY/ ENGINEERING/ PBL

We are continuing to work on our new book room and began to pick out our carpet and paint selections. Our new PBL was introduced to the students on Health and Wellness. We will be working as teams to fight heart disease and help our community be heart healthy.

what Are We Learning?

MATH - Students in Mrs. McKito and Ms. Leyde's math classes are dividing with two digit divisors. They are also continuing to design a movie theater. Please make sure your child is practicing their math facts at home. Students in Mrs. Goodrich's class are finishing work on their cider mill project. They just began chapter 4 and are multiplying two digit by one digit numbers.

SOCIAL STUDIES - In social studies students will be learning about the historic Native American tribes that were present in Ohio.

SCIENCE - In science the students finished up their brochures based on an ecosystem of their choice. Next week, we will be focusing on producers and consumers and their important role within our ecosystem.

ELA - We are well into our new novel, Hoot. Ask your child their ideas on what we have read so far. We also finished our grammar packets, focusing on parts of speech.

Science/Social Studies/STEM

Science/STEM: Next week, the students will be assessed on the planets in our solar system. They have packets with information on these. They will need to know things such as; the order of the planets, characteristics of them as well as moons, general composition. In STEM, the students continued to work on Floorplanner to create blueprints for a room at SOI. Additionally, the students are using their knowledge of the planets to create their own planet for our solar system. They will be using the technology program, Scratch, for their creations.

Social Studies: Simple Booklets Due on TUESDAY! Students tested on Central America, the Caribbean, and North America this week and did GREAT!!

<u>ELA</u>

Alvord: We began The Westing Game this week! This book has a lot of characters and will take some concentration to understand. However, the students seem excited to be reading a mystery! **Bonick:** Students shared their awesome mysteries that they wrote with each other! Check them out! **McCullough:** The Westing Game continues to get more interesting as more clues are revealed in the novel. In writing, we have finished our mystery drafts and will edit and revise next week. The final copies are due next Friday. Using dialogue correctly has been a main focus this week, along with prepositions.

<u>Math</u>

Alvord: We continue working on division, only this time with two digit divisors. Estimating and then checking with multiplication is key in mastering this concept.

Bonick: We finished the 5th Grade fraction section and are reviewing for the test next week. 6th grade fractions and Ratios and Proportions are next!

McCullough: We learned about equivalent rates and ratios this week and applied the concepts to story problems. We will be wrapping up this chapter next week with a test on Tuesday.

As our new 6th graders entered the world of middle school, we immediately began our first capstone, "New Beginnings." Over the next few weeks, the SOI 6th grade will be looking at the Ancient River Civilizations of Mesopotamia, India, China and Egypt and exploring their (GRAPES) Government, Religion, Arts & Achievement, Politics, Economics and Social Structures. We will be learning about how and why these civilizations started, how the resources they had influenced them, and how their people formed governments and religions. As we learn about these historical civilizations, we will be reading about utopian and dystopian civilizations. We will be looking at the same GRAPES categories of these fictitious societies and trying to draw parallels. In the end, the students will have learned enough about civilizations to be able to create their own civilization and market it at a Trade Expo.

In **Math** - This past week was dedicated to nailing down work in the basic operations with decimals. We moved through addition, subtraction and multiplication with many getting a solid start in division. We will continue to work towards mastery with these! Please keep up with Khan!

sixth Grade

In **Honors Math**: We will be finishing up our unit on expressions by investigating adding and subtracting linear expressions. We will be completing a test on Expressions (chapter 5) the end of next week. It's never too soon to begin studying! We will continue to review 6th grade standards using Khan.

Pre-Algebra: This week we started our unit on rational numbers and reviewed the basics of multiplying and dividing fractions in order to prepare us for the algebraic fractions we will be working with next week. Currently we are about 80% completed with 6th grade Khan.

In **Social Studies** -We are working our way through India and learning about the development of the Indus River Civilization. We will be testing on India next week before moving on to our last of the 4 civilizations--China. <u>Question of the Week:</u> How are the people of the Indus Valley similar to the people of Ancient Mesopotamia and Egypt? How are they different?

In **Science** - Due to the upcoming Capstone project, we are currently doubling up on Social Studies content to learn about the 4 Ancient River Civilizations.

In **ELA** - We continued working on the Word Masters Challenge this week! The students have practiced analogies and verbal reasoning using the online "gaming" program Quizalize. The first official word "challenge" will be held at the end of November, so remember to study your blue/gold word lists and analogy relationships!

New Beginnings

> *We focused on the different characteristics of fiction and nonfiction writing this week. Students were able to analyze two selections with a common "topic" and compare/contrast them.

> *Question of the Week: What is the difference between 3rd person limited and 3rd person omniscient points of view?
