A. School of Innovation Admission Criteria Recommendation

Be it resolved upon the recommendation of the Superintendent that the School of Innovation Admission Criteria for the 2015-16 school year be approved.

For the 2015-2016 school year, the district will follow an established Admission Criteria and Application Process for the School of Innovation students entering grades 3, 4 and 5. Admission is limited to Willoughby-Eastlake City School District residents. Students

identified as Gifted and Talented based upon the district's policy for Superior Cognitive Ability and a Reading and/or Math ID will be invited. Remaining slots will be open for any current students in grade 2, 3 and 4 who apply via the Open Lottery system. Using a random number generator, student applicants will be chosen and invited to attend. An additional 20 names will be chosen through the lottery system, at each grade level to be placed on a Waiting List. All students invited to attend the School of Innovation, whether by Gifted status or via the lottery, have the option to accept or decline. The criteria and process as proposed in the presentation to the Board of Education is being submitted to the Board for approval. Once approved, the appropriate documents will be completed and posted on the district website.
