

Tips for Families





Updates to the following guideline regarding school lunch payments for charged meals will be implemented starting Monday, October 8, 2018. Please note there has been a change in the amount of debt a student can accrue and what can be charged when a student has a negative balance.

When the school year starts, a student's free and reduced lunch status carries over from the previous year. The deadline to turn in a new application for free and reduced lunch will be the end of the first week of October.

Students can charge up to \$7.00 of debt or \$1.00 of debt if they are at reduced status for daily featured school meals (these amounts would allow the student to charge up to two (2) meals). No a-la-carte or snack items will be allowed to be charged to an account with insufficient funds. Once a student exceeds these limits, they will be provided an alternative meal to be determined by the school district and will no longer be able to charge on their account.

Once the account is paid in full, the cycle starts over again. All meal balances (positive or negative) carry over from the previous school year.

Special Education

Special education means specially designed instruction, at no cost to the parent, to meet the unique needs of a handicapped child. Special Education Programs are provided for all children who have a handicapping disability. A disability in this instance means conditions such as: hearing impairments, visual impairments, speech or language impairments, learning disabilities, mental retardations, other health impairments, physical impairments, autism, and traumatic brain injury. Every handicapped child in Ohio is entitled to services provided by the school district in which they reside, including **children with disabilities who are homeless children or are wards of the state**. These services include: evaluation services for all children birth through twenty-one years, diagnostic services for all children birth through age twenty-one years of age, and educational programs for children three through twenty-one years of age. If you know of a child who is handicapped or at risk and NOT receiving services, please contact the Willoughby-Eastlake City School District's Pupil Service Office at 440-975-3800.

Edison Elementary School is partnering with the American Red Cross to help save lives! Edison will host a blood drive on <u>Oct. 10th from 2:00 to 7:00 PM at Edison Gym</u>. We will be participating in the Pint-Size Hero program, which is designed to teach elementary students about the importance of blood donation by hosting a blood drive as a school community service project. We want to help the Red Cross create a future generation of blood donors by getting students involved at a young age. Although they are too young to donate blood themselves, our students can invite eligible blood donors to donate on their behalf at the upcoming blood drive. In order for this program to be a success, we need your help!

Every student who recruits at least one person to come out to donate at the blood drive will be recognized as a Pint-Size Hero and will receive a fun appreciation item from the Red Cross. Students will take part in a Pint-Size Hero educational presentation at school and will receive a letter requesting parents, family members and other adults to donate blood on their behalf. The letter will include a donor appointment request form for those interested in donating to complete and return to school with their student.

If you are able, please support our school by donating blood, recruiting blood donors or volunteering at the blood drive. You can also make an appointment to donate by visiting redcrossblood.org, by downloading the Red Cross Blood Donor App or by calling 1-800-RED CROSS.
