CALAMITY DAY PLAN FOR HIGH SCHOOLS ONLY

As you are aware, when the beginning of the school year was delayed, we knew that we would have to create an action plan to prepare for possible calamity days. In addition to the delay, the shortened school year for seniors in May means that we have used all of our allotted calamity days for this year. The following schedule



highlights how we will make up all subsequent calamity days for the remainder of the year:

- We have one day "in the bank" from the November PD Day.
- On January 17, 2020, instead of having another PD Day, the high schools will have a normal school day. This will put a second day "in the bank."
- President's Day, February 17, 2020, will also be a regular school day for the high schools. This will put a third day "in the bank."
- Monday, April 13, 2020, is a comp day. We will run a normal school day for staff and students at the high schools ONLY if we have used a fourth calamity day between now and then. If we need to make up additional calamity days beyond the four mentioned above, we will make up calamity days five through seven on May 13th, 14th and 15th in that order. Since school is already in session on those days, the make-up days will be for seniors because they will miss additional days at the end of the year

BUILDING ACCESS AFTER SCHOOL

Students need to leave the building by 3:00 PM unless a staff member (extra help, making up a test, disciplinary reason, etc) is supervising them. We do not have the capability to provide supervision for students after that time. If a student is planning to attend a sporting event in the evening, he or she needs to leave and return. Our winter sporting events won't begin until 6:30 PM during the week.

VOTER REGISTRATION

On March 17, 2020, Willoughby-Eastlake City Schools will place a 4.99 mill Emergency Operating Levy on the ballot (SEE ATTACHMENT). If passed, the funds generated by this levy will be used for general operating expenses, will support daily classroom instruction and assist to support several athletic and non-athletic supplementals. As you know, the district has had



to implement several cost saving measures during the past months and these cuts have deeply impacted our students. If the March levy passes, the district will have an opportunity to review items that they may be able to reinstate. If you are not registered to vote, please consider registering. ATHLETIC UPDATE



ALL ATHLETES must have a current physical on file in order to participate in a sport. You can find the forms at www.rangernation.org by clicking on "Final Forms" under the Forms tab or at https://willoughbyeastlake-oh.finalforms.com/. There you will also find instructions on registering your child on Final Forms, which is a mandatory requirement of our district. In order to play any sport, your child must have a passing grade in a minimum of 5 first quarter classes, not including Physical Education.

PARTICIPATION FEES FOR WINTER SPORTS WERE DUE DECEMBER 6th. Athletes will not be permitted to participate in practices/competitions until their payment has been received. Fees can be paid online on Final Forms or in the athletic office. All winter sports fees are \$90. Reduced fees for winter sports are as follows: \$20 for those qualifying for free lunch and \$45 for those qualifying for reduced lunch.
