

Auto Collision SWAT Rehab






Sources of Revenue for FY 2018

Receives State Accolades



The State Board of Education of Ohio recognized one district and four schools with the All A Award for earning straight A's on their 2016 - 2017 Ohio School Report Cards. In addition, 64 districts and 214 schools received the Momentum Award for exceeding

expectations in student growth for the year.

"These districts and schools are doing a wonderful job providing students with the tools to succeed - and their students are rising to the challenge," said the State Board of Education Tess Elshoff. "The State Board of Education is proud to recognize these students, teachers, administrators and parents for their accomplishments."

Any Ohio school or district is eligible for the <u>All A Award</u> if it received A's on all of its applicable report card measures. Beginning in the 2017 - 2018 school year, the State Board of

Education will recognize any school or district that earns an A on its report card overall component score. Any Ohio school or district is eligible for the Momentum Award if it receives straight A's on all Value - Added



measures on the report card. The school or district must have at least two Value - Added subgroups of students, which include gifted, lowest 20 percent in achievement and students with disabilities.

PROJECT UPDATES

Thanks to the mild Fall, the construction at North, South and Longfellow continues to be on time and on budget. At Longfellow Elementary School, the building pad is completed and the water line for the first phase is also complete. The installation of the storm line at Longfellow has also been finalized along with extra paving at the parent pick up and drop off points. In





addition to this work, two fire hydrants have been installed on this site and the FDC (Fire Department Connection) at the building will be set this week.


At North High, the storm tie ins at Glenn Drive will soon be complete and the testing will be done once that work is finished. During the next week, water lines will be put in place to the new building and the foundations for the building will begin to be constructed.

At South High, the site excavation continues along with necessary remediation. It is expected that the building pad will be completed during the next week. The utility materials (piping and storm detention structures) will continue to be installed along with the material lay down areas and road excavation.

At a recent City Council meeting, the City of Willoughby authorized the construction of the Senior Center. This portion of the construction will be paid for by the City of Willoughby.


