Purple - hopes and dreams for son/daughter


Orange – wildcard (pass)

Expectations Change as We Grow



Aligning School Expectations with Family Expectations

Expectation	Morning Meal	Homework Time	Grocery Store
Be Respectful	Acknowledge others (wave, smile, say hello) in the room Chew with mouth closed	Follow time schedule for homework time Work quietly Ask for help when needed	Ask for items not on list Accept if Mom or Dad say no
Be Responsible	Put dishes in the sink Throw trash in trash can	Put finished work away in bookbag	Help carry groceries into the house
Be Ready to Learn	Wash hands Use utensils appropriately	Put bookbag away out of walking path	Walk in parking lot Stay with Mom or Dad

Focus on the Positive

Increase ratio of positive to negative interactions

- -At least 5 to 1
- Positive reinforcement for expected behavior
- Look for the positive




Show, Teach, Practice and Praise

- Show the behavior
- Teach the behavior
- Practice the behavior
- Praise the appropriate attempts

The quickest way to change behavior is by praising what they are doing right.



Rewarding Positive Behavior at Home

- Cook favorite dinner
- Extra Computer time
- Get out of chores
- Have a friend over

- Read an extra book at bedtime

- Play a board game of choice
- Pick an outdoor activity to do with someone special
- Stay up late
- TIME with...
