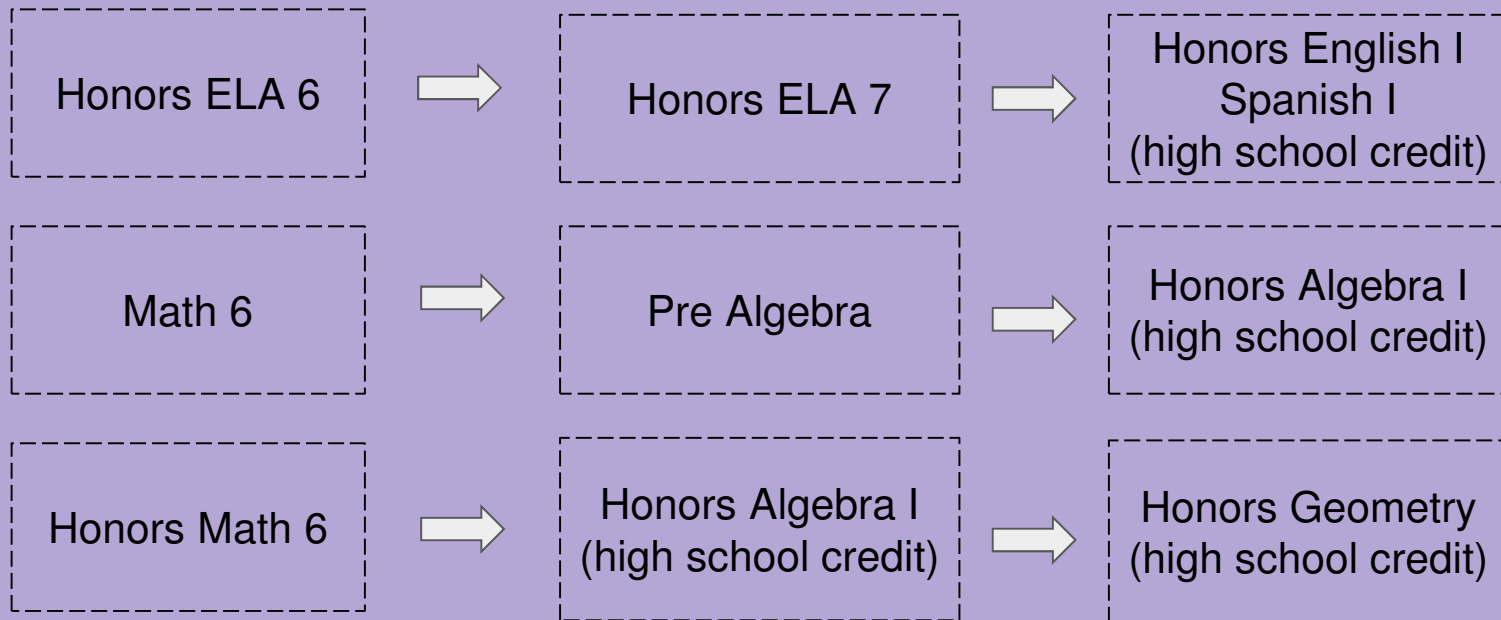

There are no high school credit classes available for Science or Social Studies

Honors Classes Criteria

Honors ELA 6

Students who earn an A or B in ELA 5 AND the following:

- Map Reading Score > 79%
- Minimum Lexile > 825

Honors Math 6

Students who earn an A or B in Accelerated Math 5

OR the following:

- Students with an A or B in Math 5 AND the following:
 - Map Math Score > 79%
 - IAAT score > 77% (7th Stanine)

Honors Science 6

Students who earn an A or B in Science 5 AND the following:

- Map Math Score > 79%

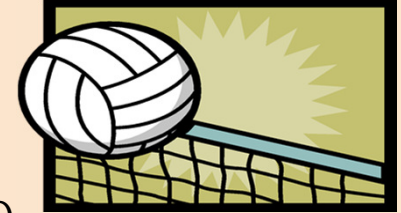
Honors Social Studies 6

Students who earn an A or B in SS 5 AND the following:

- A grade of an A or B in ELA 5
- Map Reading Score > 79%



Electives:



- **PE**--Everyday for $\frac{1}{2}$ year
 - Uniforms are for sale at the school for \$20.00 (\$8 for the shirt, \$12 for the shorts)

Art--Everyday for $\frac{1}{4}$ year

Computer Literacy I - Everyday for $\frac{1}{4}$ year

Exploratory Music—Everyday for $\frac{1}{4}$ year

Instrumental Music (Band) - Everyday all year

- If enrolled in Instrumental Music, student will not take Exploratory Music
 - Evening performances are required





BREAKFAST and LUNCH

Students will eat lunch during 4th period.

- Students will only eat with other 6th graders.
 - Students will eat for half the period.
- Students will have study hall for the other half.
 - Cost \$3.10 (\$0.40 for reduced lunch)

We also serve breakfast before school begins.

- Available from 8:00 - 8:25 AM daily.
- Cost \$1.90 (\$0.30 for reduced breakfast)



Lockers

Students will receive a locker with a lock.

- Please encourage your child not to share their combination.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES



- Students are allowed to bring them to school; **HOWEVER**, personal electronic devices are **STUDENTS'** responsibility.
- Devices must be powered off and placed in their lockers for the entire day.
 - If you need to get in touch with your child, please contact the school's main office.
- It is **NOT** the school's responsibility if electronic devices are lost or stolen.

How are schedules created?

- Requests are entered into the computer based on your child's Course Selection Guide.
 - Please choose classes carefully as these are used to create the master schedule.
- Schedule changes are often NOT available once school starts.

When do I get my schedule?

- Students may pick up their schedule the week before school starts.
 - Students must bring in their pink emergency form in order to get their schedule.
