SAFE SCHOOLS AND SCHOOL BUS BEHAVIOR

Now that we have reached the end of the first academic quarter of the 2018-2019 school year, most students have settled into their daily school routine. As students become more comfortable with their academic schedule, teachers, classes and fellow students, we also need to address the issue of student conduct on school buses. There is much that students can do to help create a safer, more desirable school environment and following the Student Code of Conduct while riding buses to and from Willoughby Middle School is a large part of that initiative.

During grade-level meetings in August, Mr. Wilson reminded students about the 3-R's, Respect, *Responsibility* and Readiness to Learn and the importance of Above the Line Behavior. Student conduct while riding the buses is an important part of the school day and bookends the academic activities that occur between 8:30 AM and 3:06 PM.

Above the Line behavior on buses is school an important component to the beginning and end of each school dav. Students should refrain from behaviors that tease, bully and/or intimidate classmates and distract or disrupt the bus driver's concentration. Instead. focus on staying seated with legs and feet out of the aisle and inside the bus windows, listen to music on their headphones and/or

talk quietly with a seat partner. To keep our buses clean, please refrain from eating food and/or drinking beverages on the bus. Avoid horseplay and pushing and shoving as these actions can also lead to students being hurt while riding the bus. Students should support actions that promote a peaceful and harmonious atmosphere on the school bus.

Please do your part to make the school buses a safe environment for everyone.
