As a staff we will continue our initiative to educating the whole child by emphasizing our Positive Behavior Intervention Support program, the WEB (Where student Everyone Belongs) leadership and mentoring program for in-coming 6th grade students and continue to emphasize Above the Line Behavior and the "R Factor" supported by Mr. Tim Kight and his Focus 3 program. Mr. Kight believes that success determined by implementing a simple, yet effective framework for life that includes strategies for how you think, behave and make decisions. Success is not determined by the Events in our lives, but rather how we choose to respond to those events; the R Factor! We call this F + R = O

and that stands for Event + Response = Outcome!

Studies have demonstrated that performance the an individual and/or organization is very dependent on behavior. Winning behavior is Intentional, On-purpose, and Skillful. yielding outstanding and positive results. This is what we call Discipline-driven behavior. Unfortunately, students and adults often resort to Defaultdriven behavior where we behave impulsively and become resistant to change.

We are emphasizing Focus Driven behavior with all of our Willoughby Middle School students as we work diligently Improve Academic Achievement by placing Students First. Ultimately the biggest variable in every event is behavior, not circumstances. The E + R = O philosophy is the physics of Discipline-Driven behavior!

SPECIAL EDUCATION

Special education means specially designed instruction, at no cost to the parent, to meet unique needs of handicapped child. Special Education **Programs** are provided for all children who have a handicapping disability. A disability in this instance means conditions such hearing impairments, visual impairments, speech language impairments, learning disabilities, mental retardations, health other impairments, physical impairments, autism, and traumatic brain injury. Every handicapped child in Ohio is entitled to services provided by the school district in which they reside, including children with disabilities who are homeless children or are wards of the state. These services include: evaluation services for all children birth through twentyone years, diagnostic services for all children birth through age twenty-one years of age, and educational programs children three through twentyone years of age. If you know of a child who is handicapped or at risk and NOT receiving services, please contact the Willoughby-Eastlake City School District's Pupil Service Office at 440-975-3800.
