Happy New Year to everyone and welcome to the second half of the 2013-14 school year! We have a lot of ground to cover before the Ohio Achievement Testing begins in April. With the weather extending our winter break and then giving us an extended weekend this past week, our time frame to meet the demands of curriculum schedules created extra stress for staff and students.

Please remember that the policy of the Willoughby-Eastlake Schools is to make every effort to hold classes 180 days per school year. The decision to close schools during inclement weather is made by the Superintendent of Schools, Mr. Steve Thompson, and is based primarily upon the capability of our buses to run their respective routes and/or excessively low wind chill temperature factors. Realizing the varied nature of weather conditions between and among our communities, some parents may decide to keep their children home because of weather conditions in their neighborhoods. Although these children will be counted as absent from school, they will not be penalized for being absent. Parents are reminded to check local media outlets including radio, tv and the internet for the latest school closing information. You should have also signed up on the Parent Portal for closing alerts.

February is a busy month at WMS. Students are pursuing both academic and athletic endeavors, as the second semester begins.

This month, on the academic front, staff and students continue to prepare for the Ohio Achievement Assessments that will be given to 6^{th} , 7^{th} and 8^{th} graders in April. For some students new electives began the third grading quarter.

Parents may not only view grades but see assignments, contact teachers, and request automatic updates. Our students also have access to the Student Portal.
