Distinguished Citizens

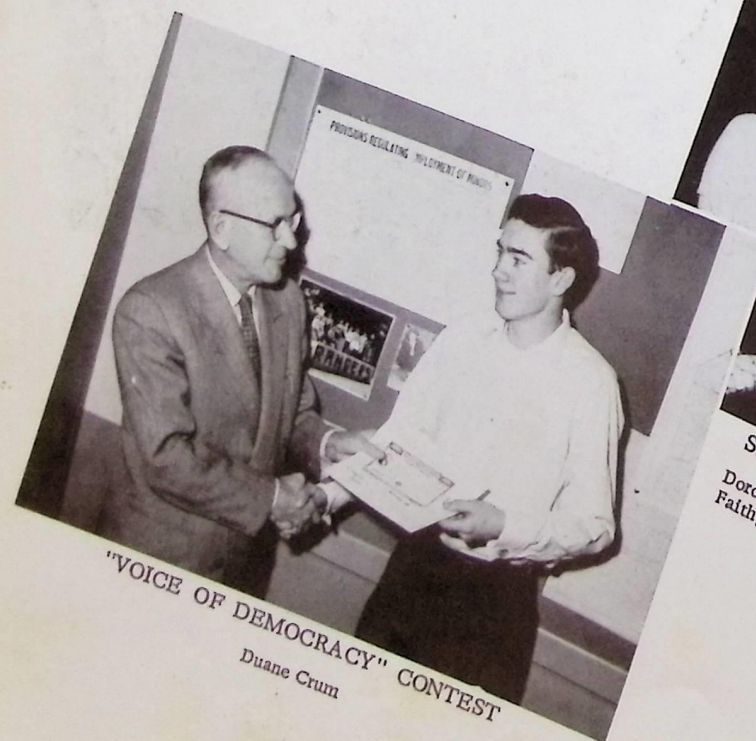

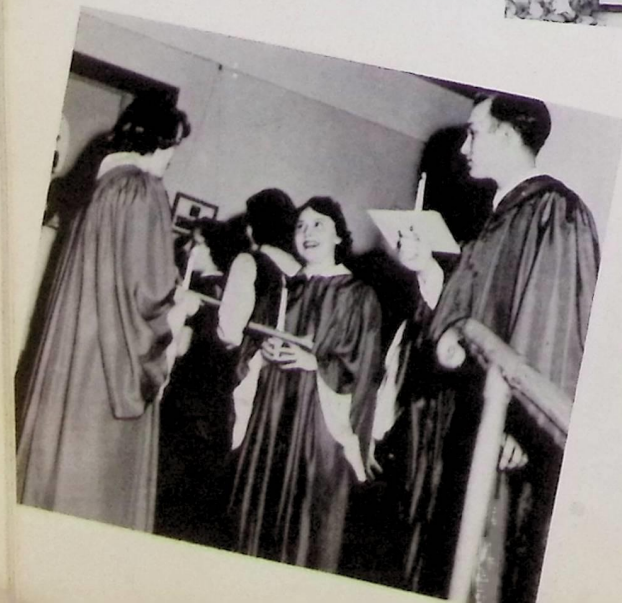
National Honor Society

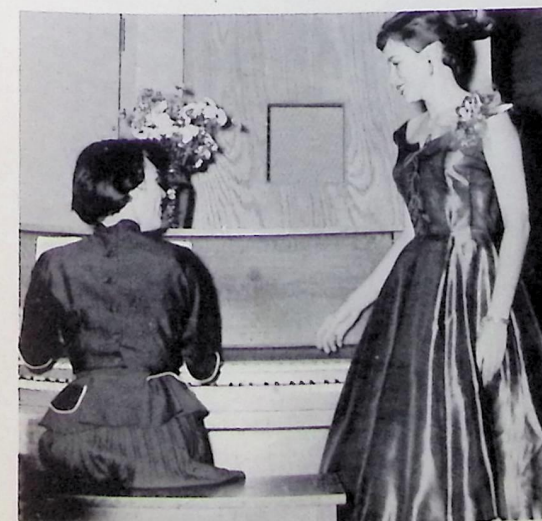
Scholarship Club

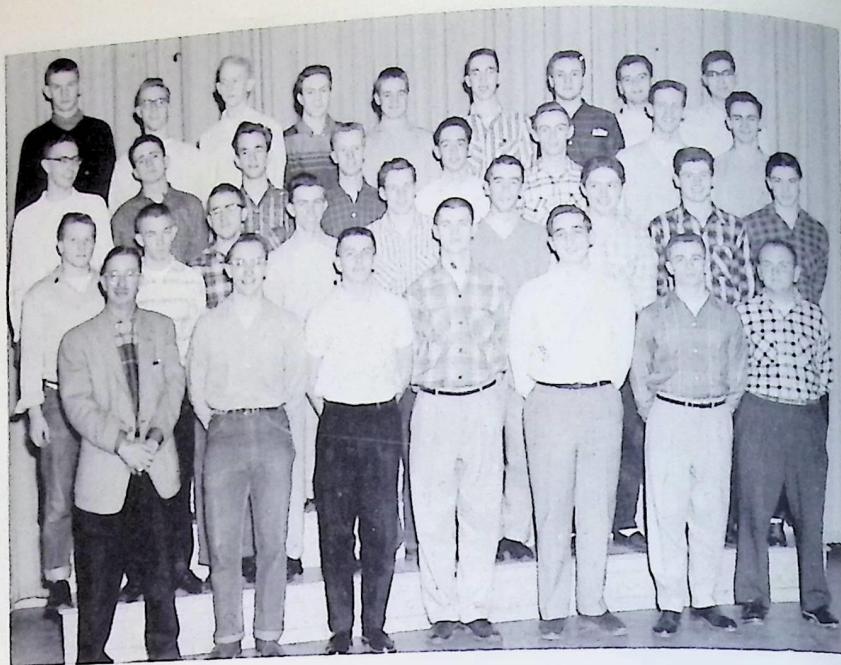

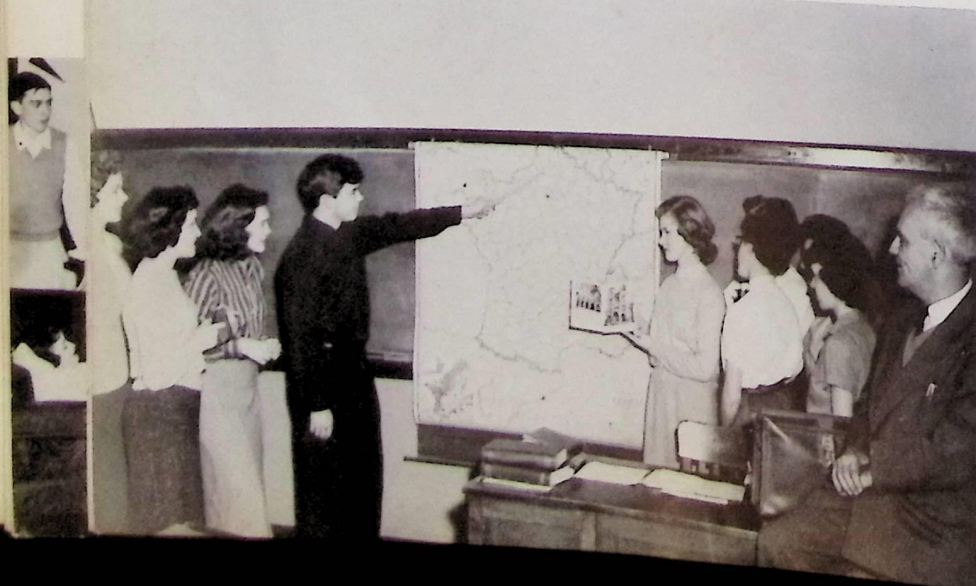

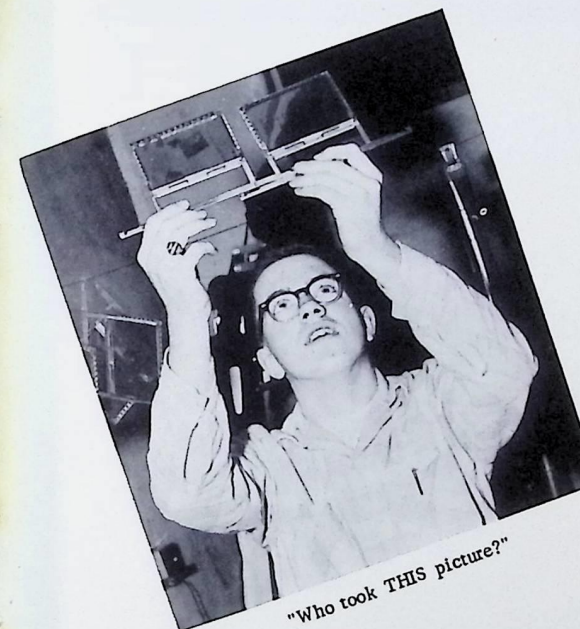


Camera Club

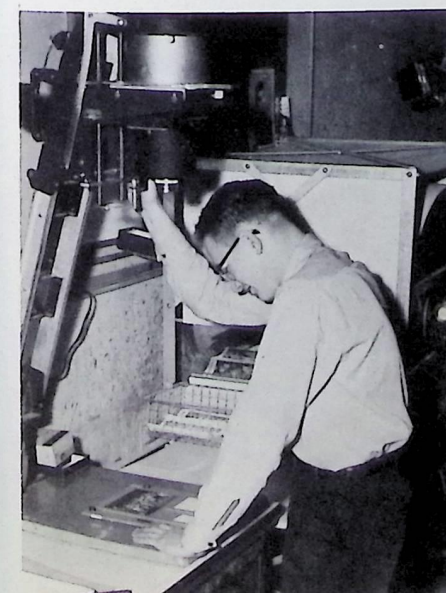
The purpose of the club is to increase the interest in photography among the students and provide the school paper and yearbook with illustrations of student activities.

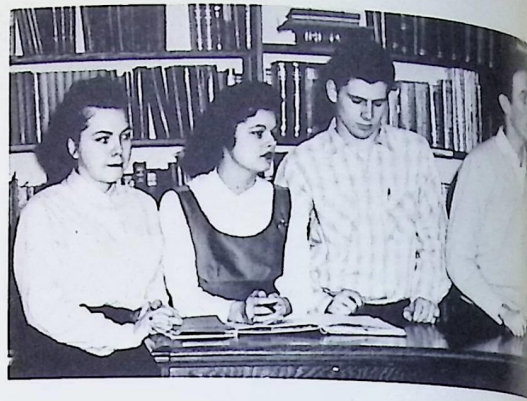

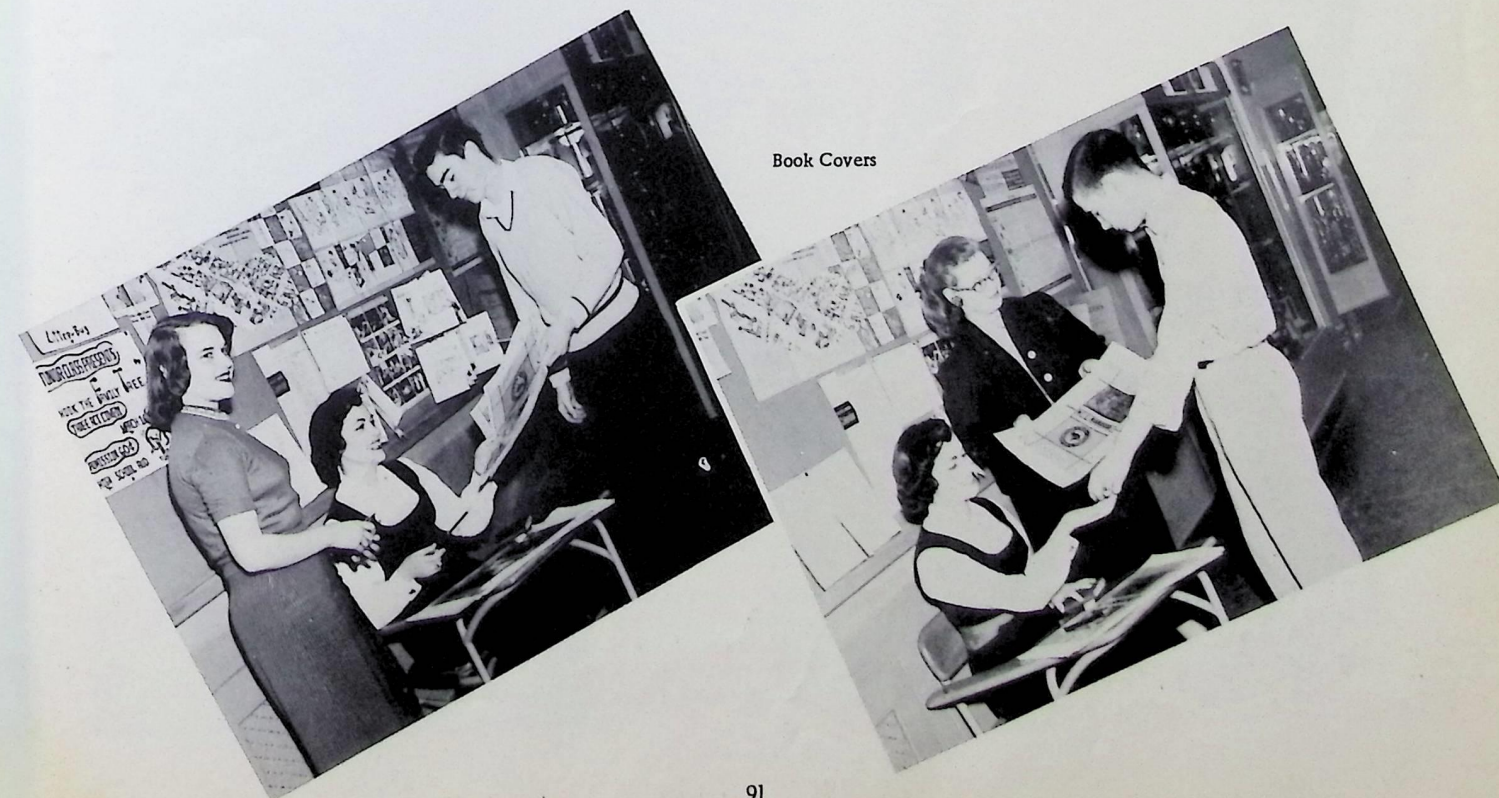

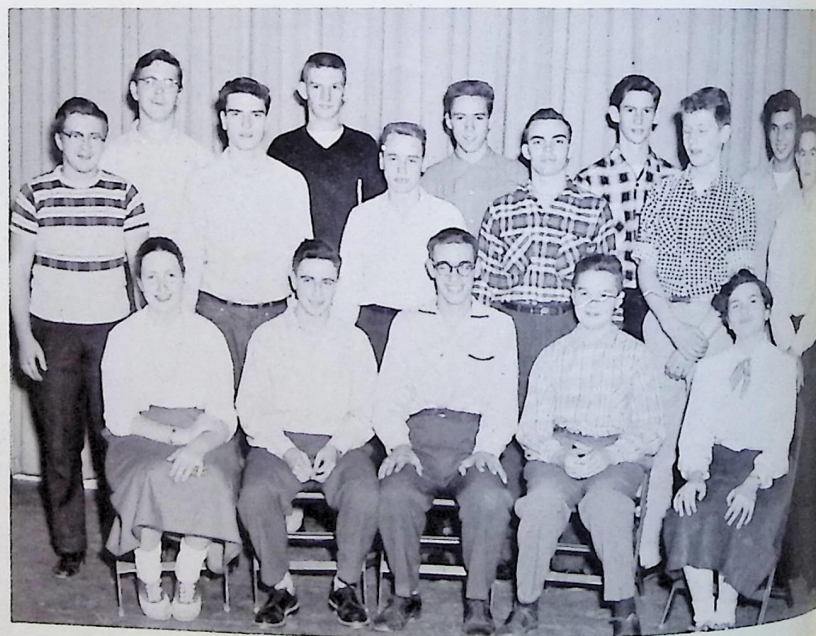

Audio-Visual Aids

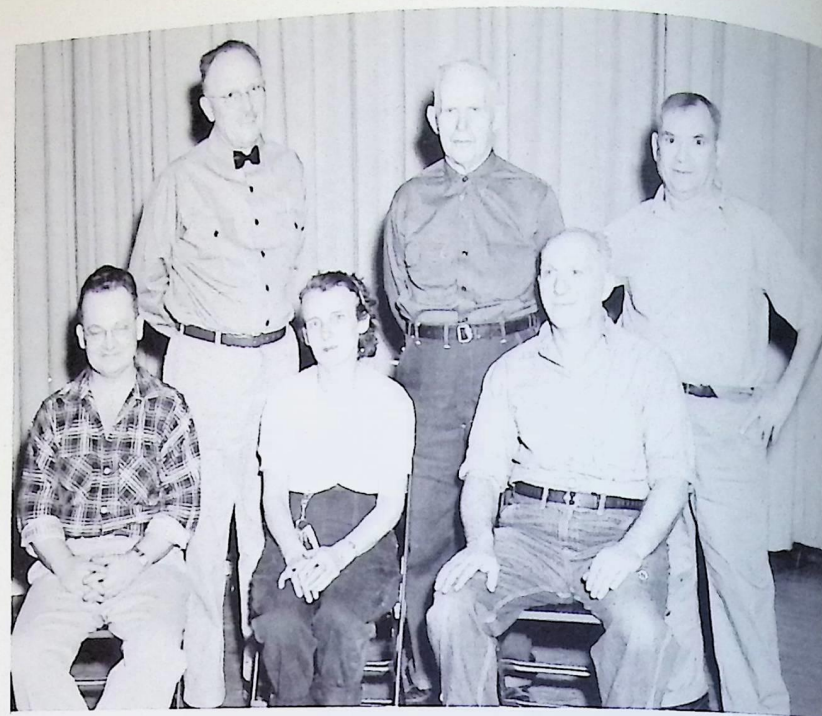

With the return of fifteen juniors next year Coach Winters is looking forward to a successful season in 1956.

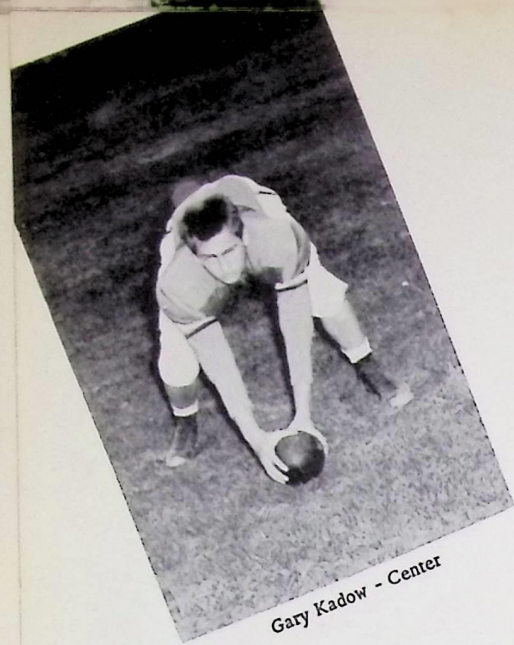

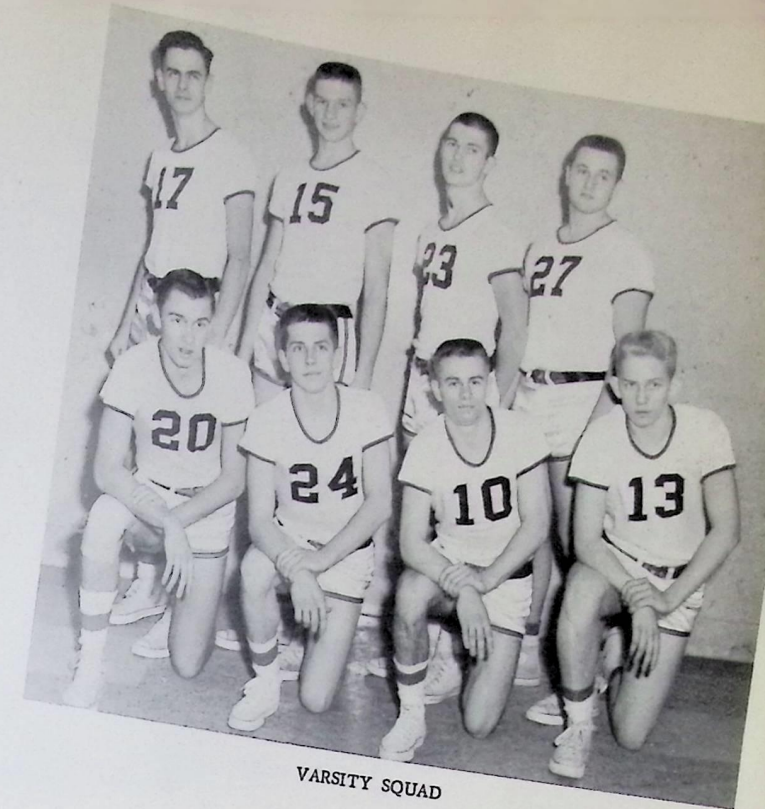
They then won the remainder of their conference games and this, coupled with Brush's loss to Garfield, put them in a first place tie with Maple.

In addition to Miller, Cupp will have Dave Pelz and Jim Rauker back next year and is looking forward to a fine season in '57.

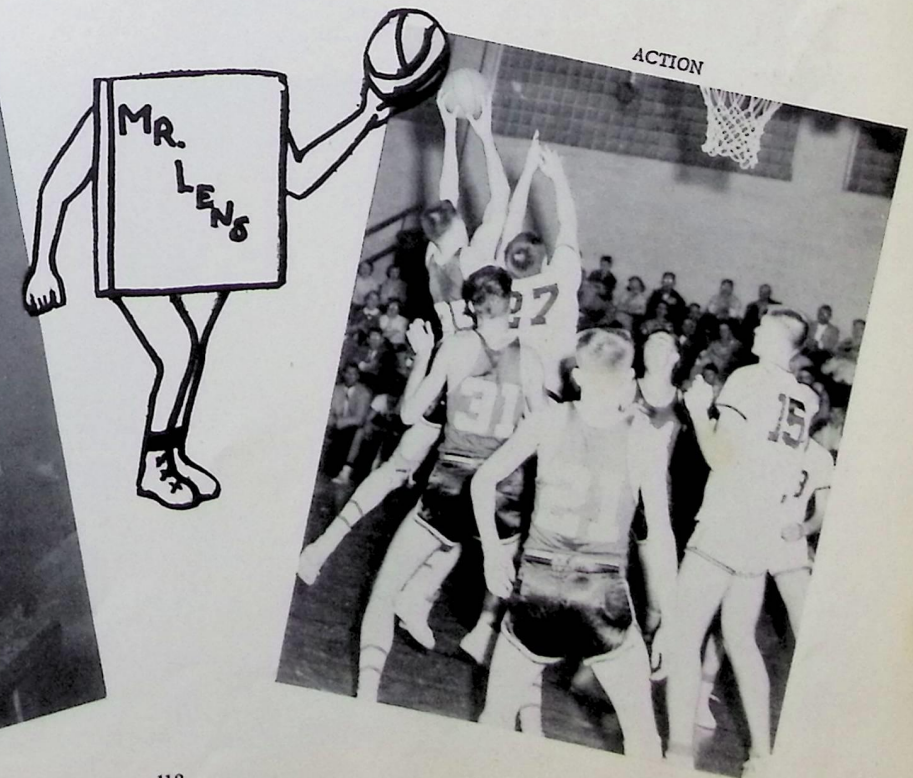

Of the regulars, both Butch Lauderback and George Korpi had over a 300 batting average with 352 and 333 respectively.

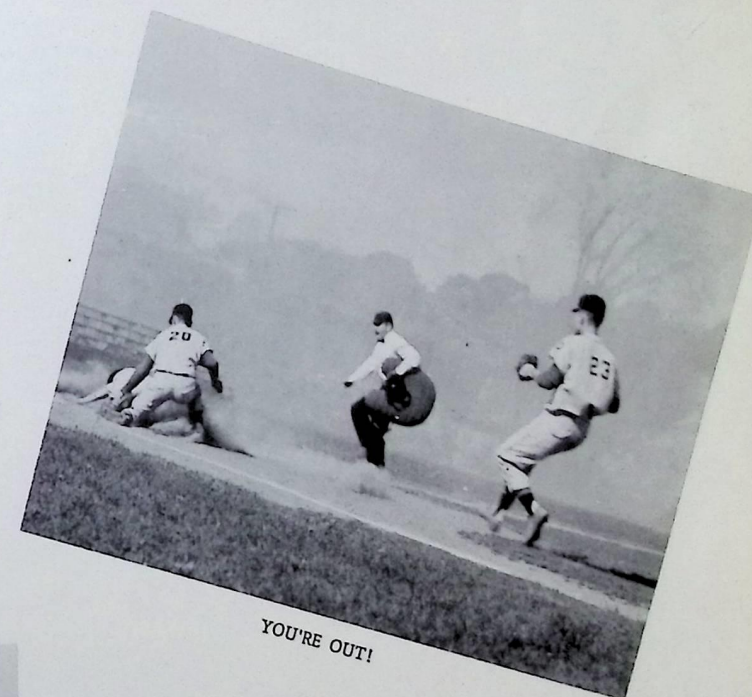
Doug Pringle led the Ranger's pitching staff, winning six and dropping four. He was also named to the All-Conference team.

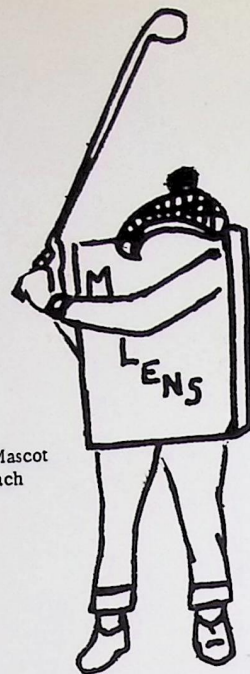

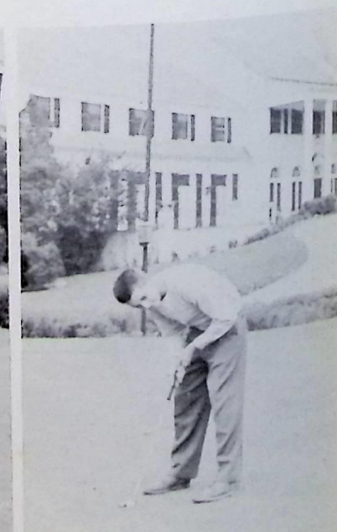

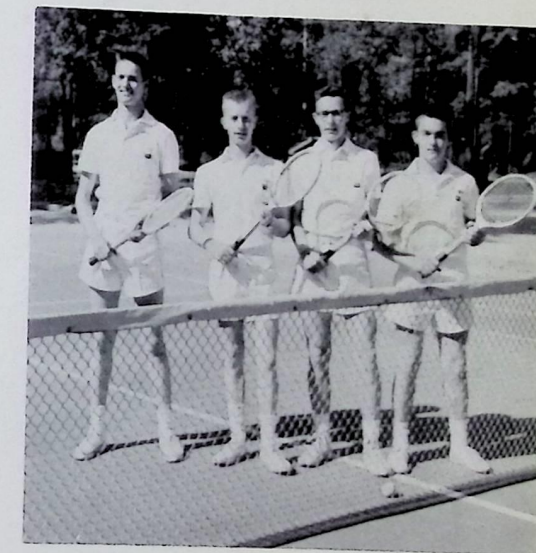

Even with the loss of four seniors, Coach Potter is looking forward to a very successful season in 1956.

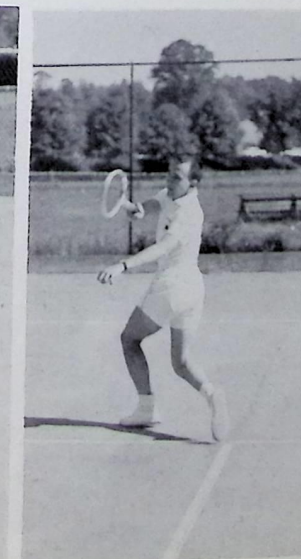
