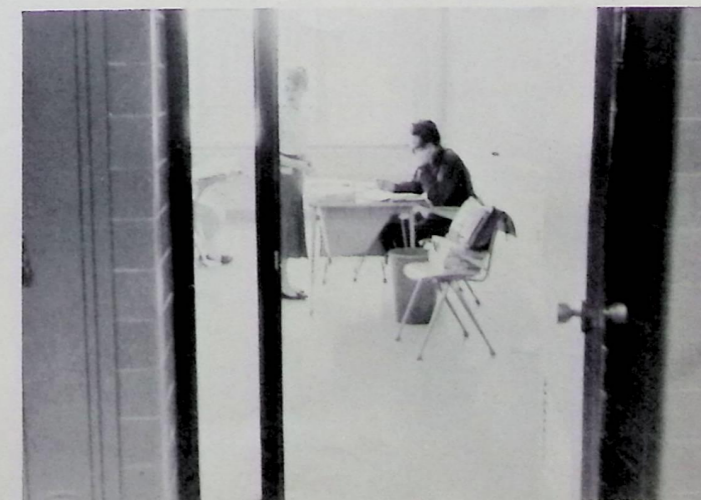
For thinkers, philosophers, poets, however, thinking is not enough. They must communicate. Pulse was set up to give them that opportunity.

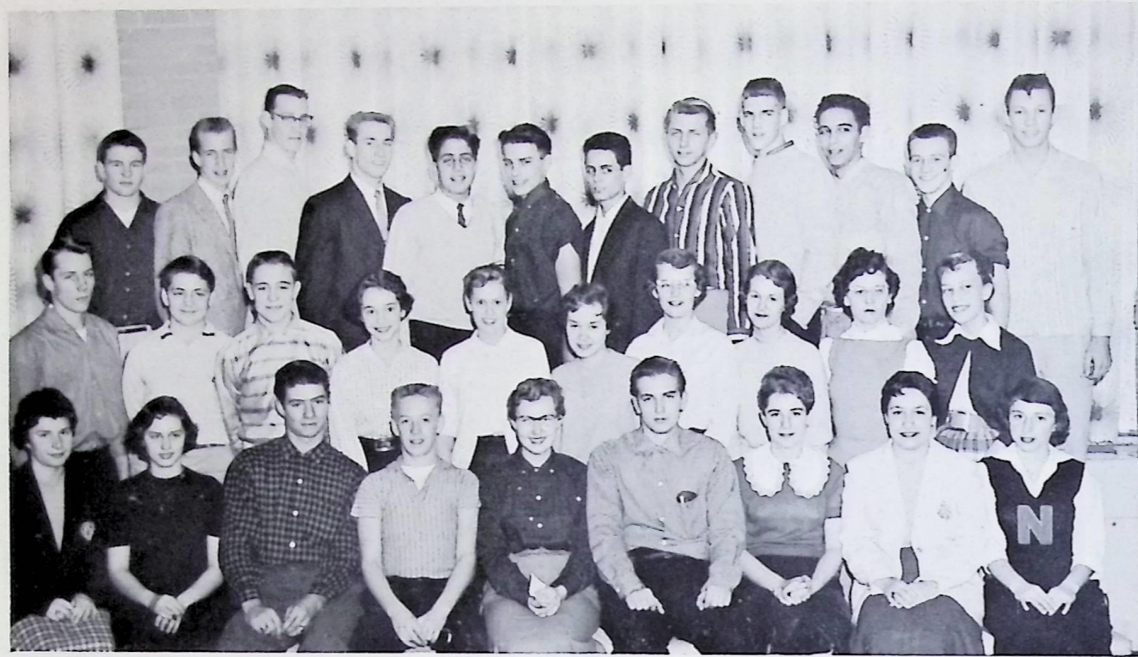
Short stories, essays, articles, poetry, and original student art work is featured in the magazine. Pins signalling outstanding literary achievement will be awarded in June.

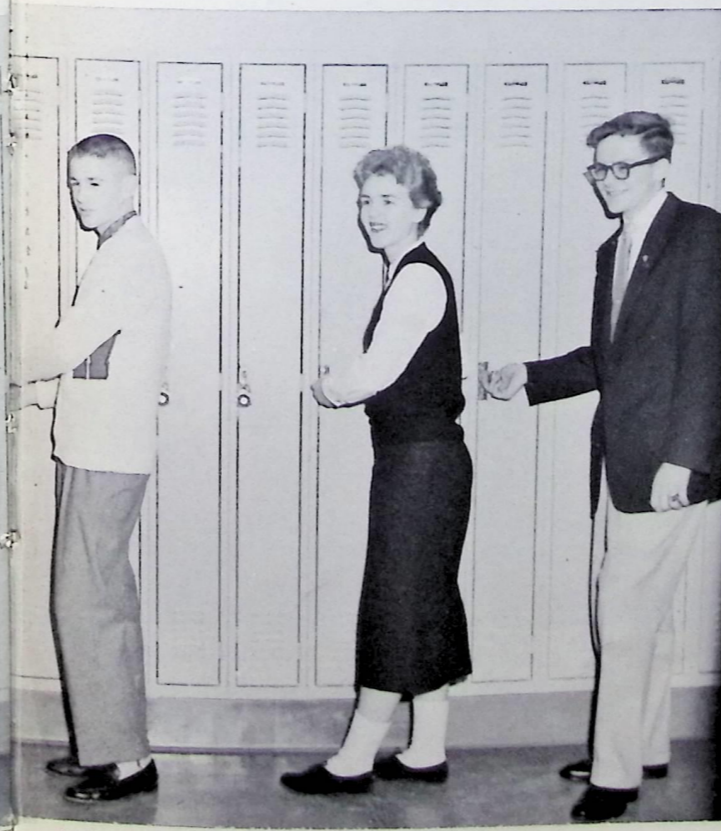
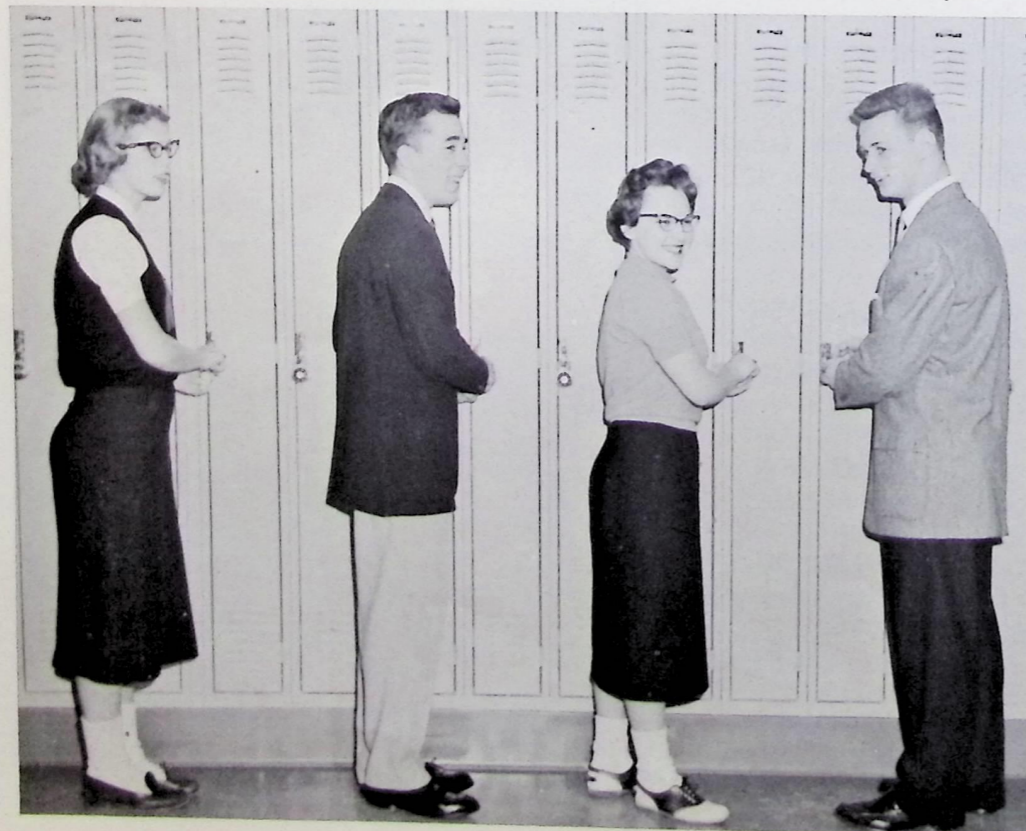

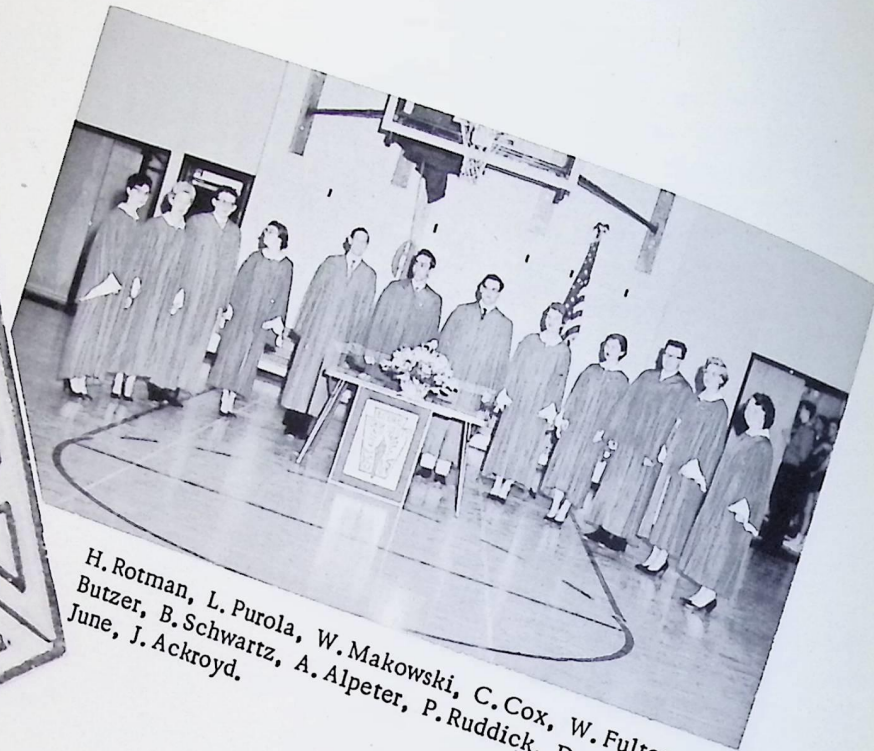

Scholarship Club

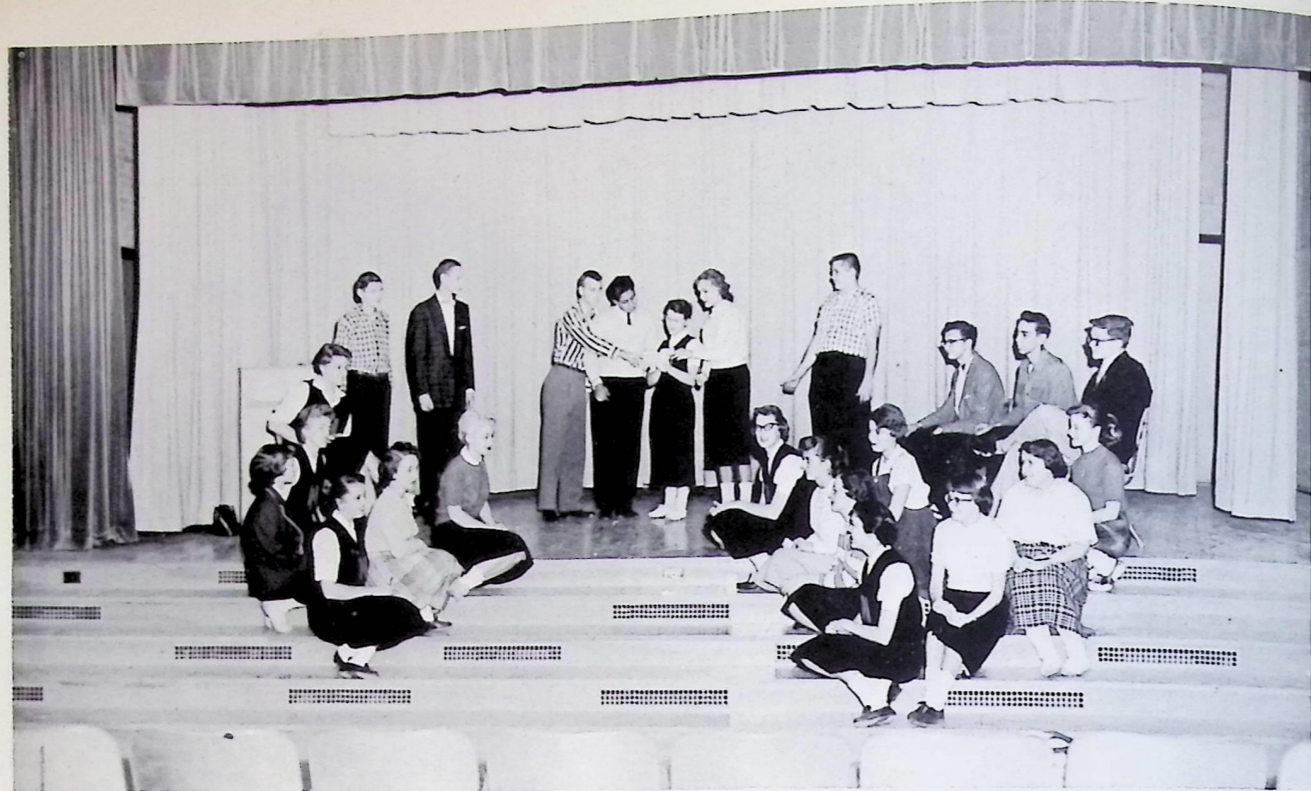
The Scholarship Club, one of the school's largest organizations, is composed of the upper ten per cent of each class.

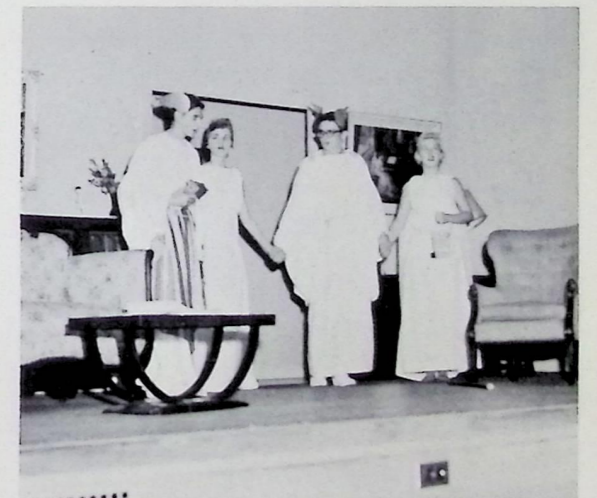

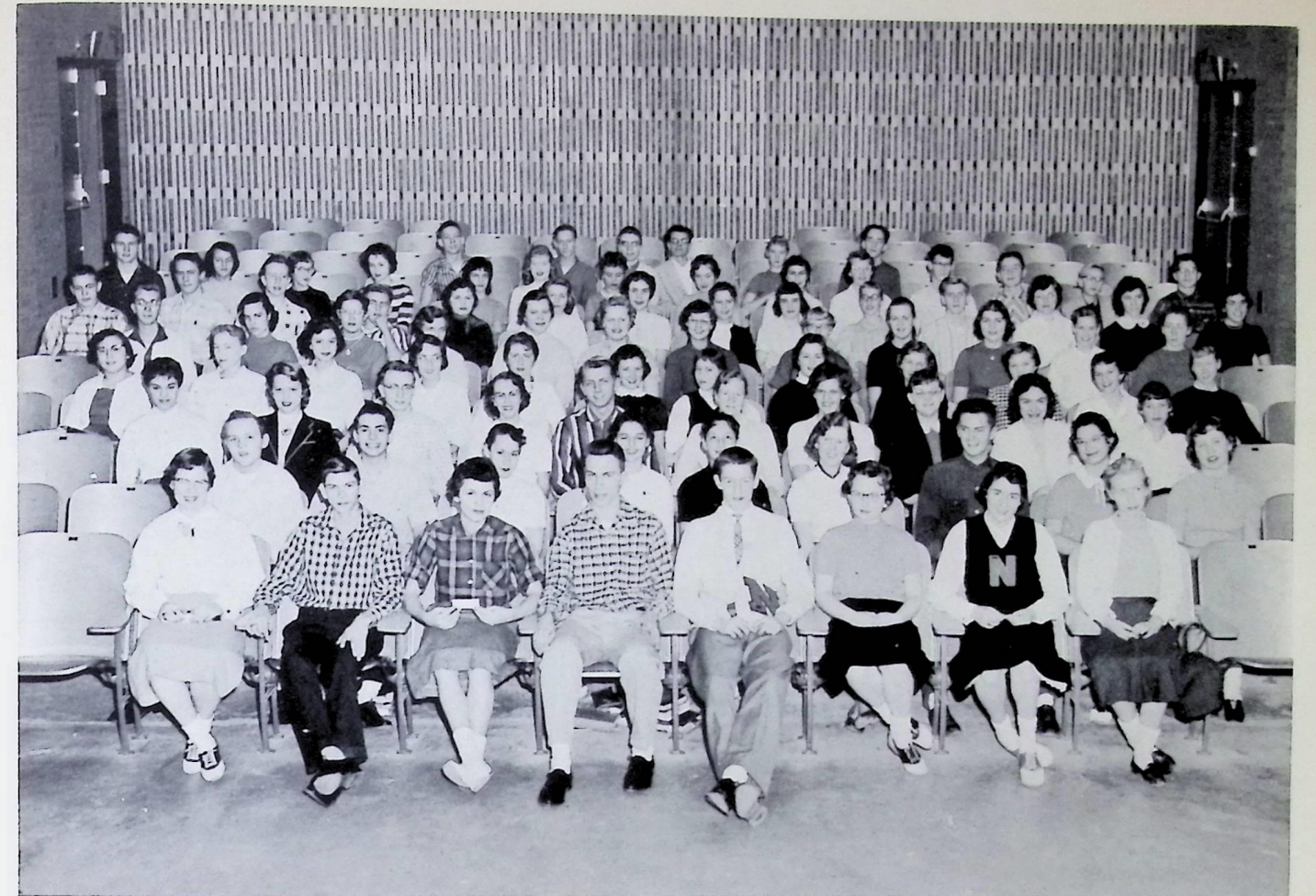

Plans for extra-curricular activities include a picnic and bowling. There are no officers this year as each member works equally hard. Mr. Albert Dolan is advisor of the group



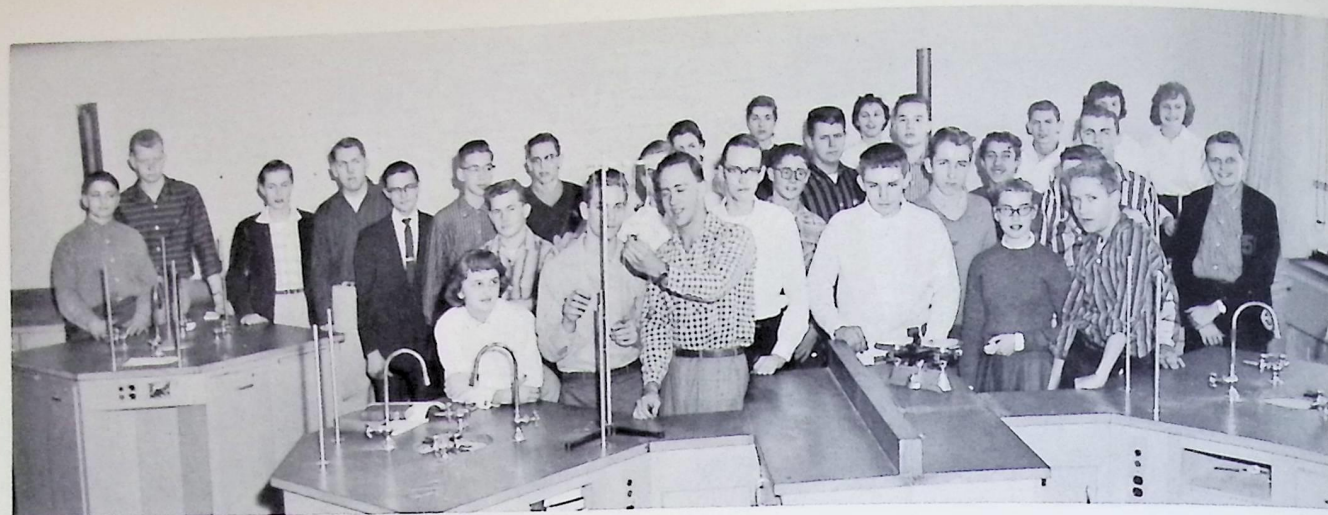
