Student Council

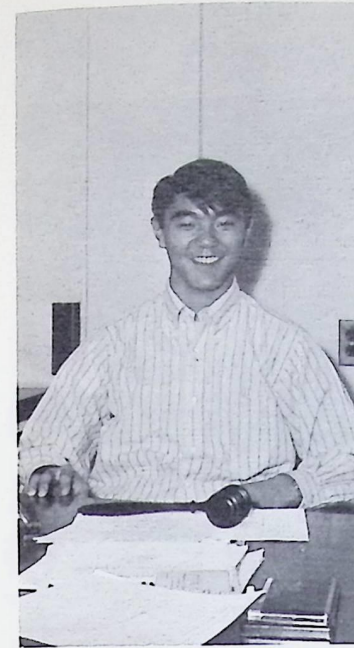

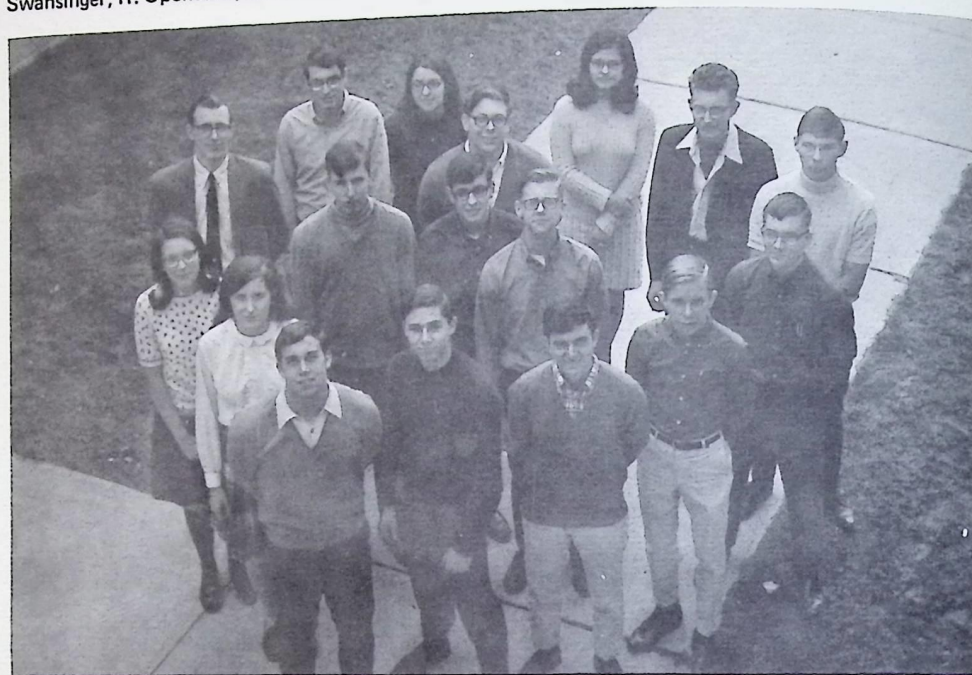


German Club

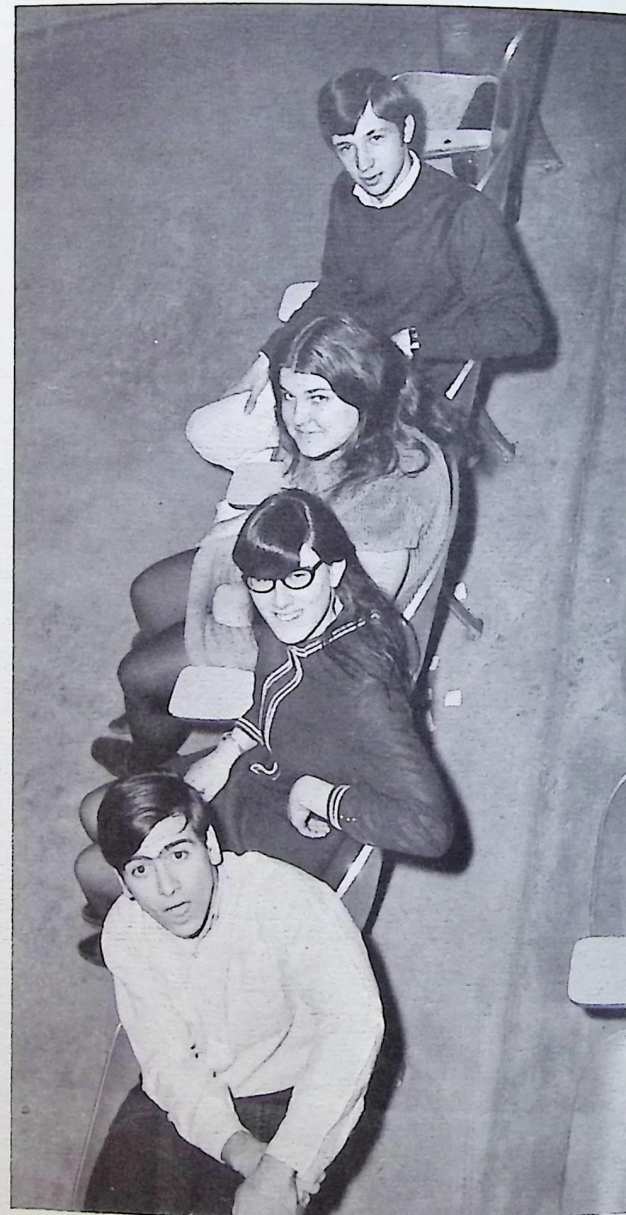


Thespians

Home Ec. Club

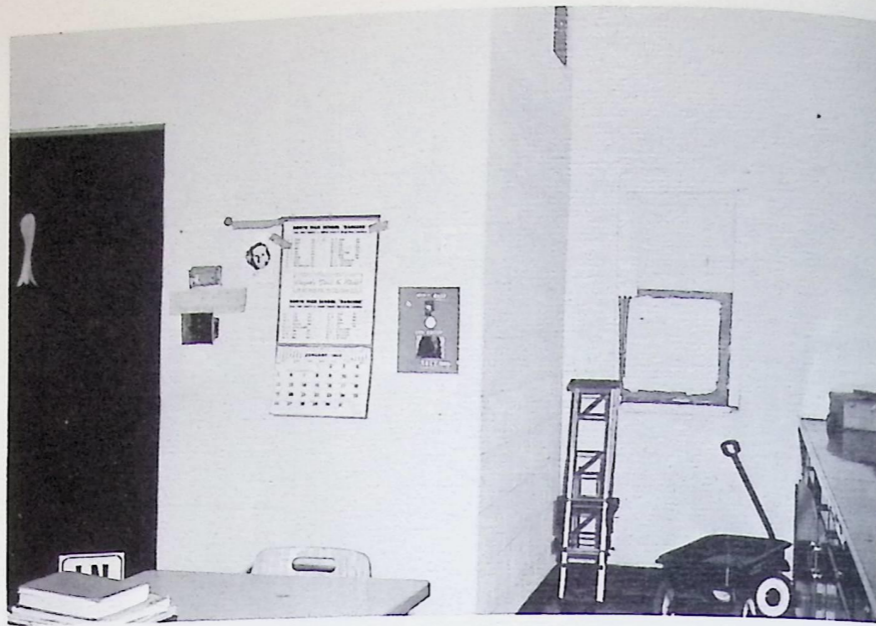

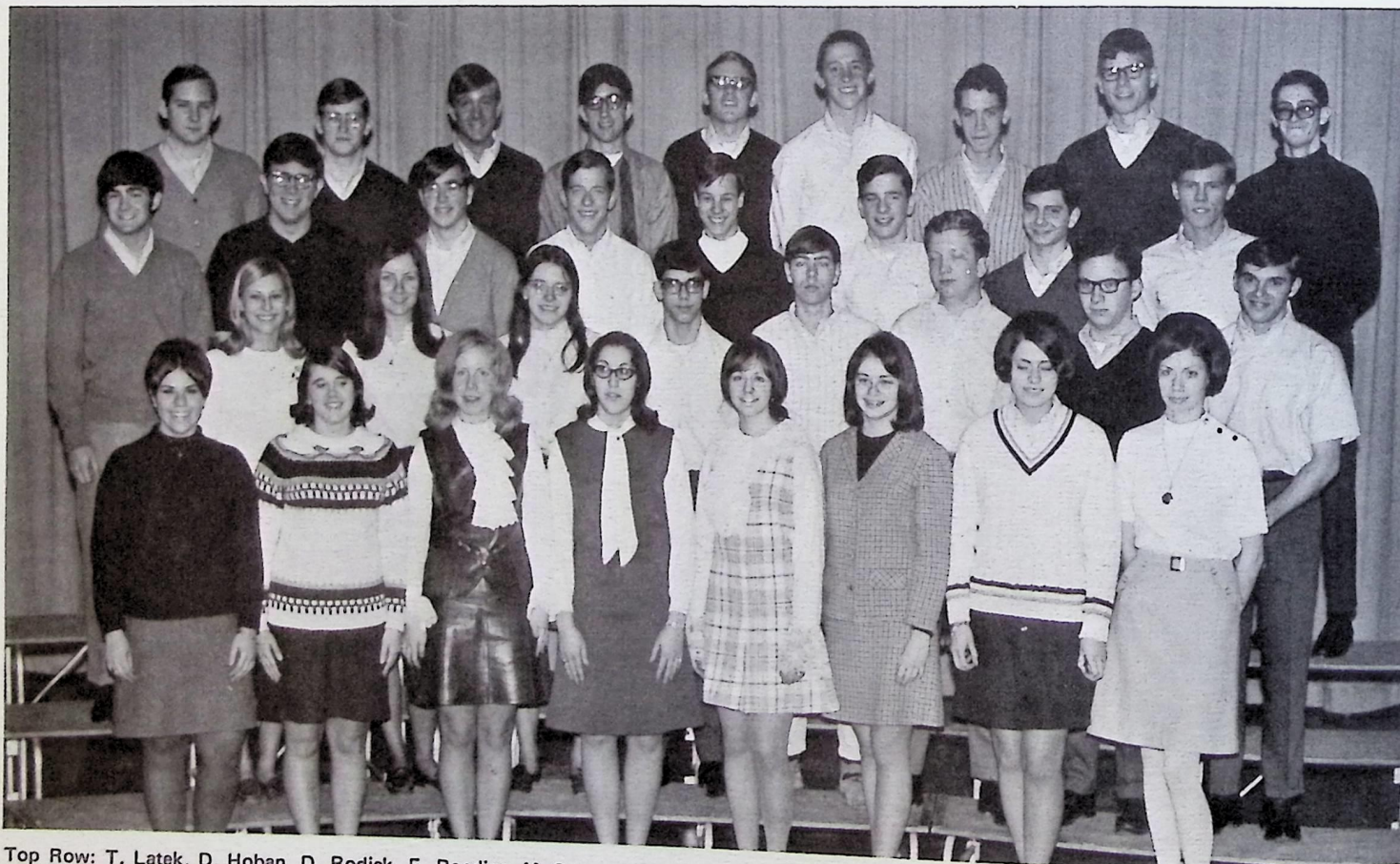
Searchlight

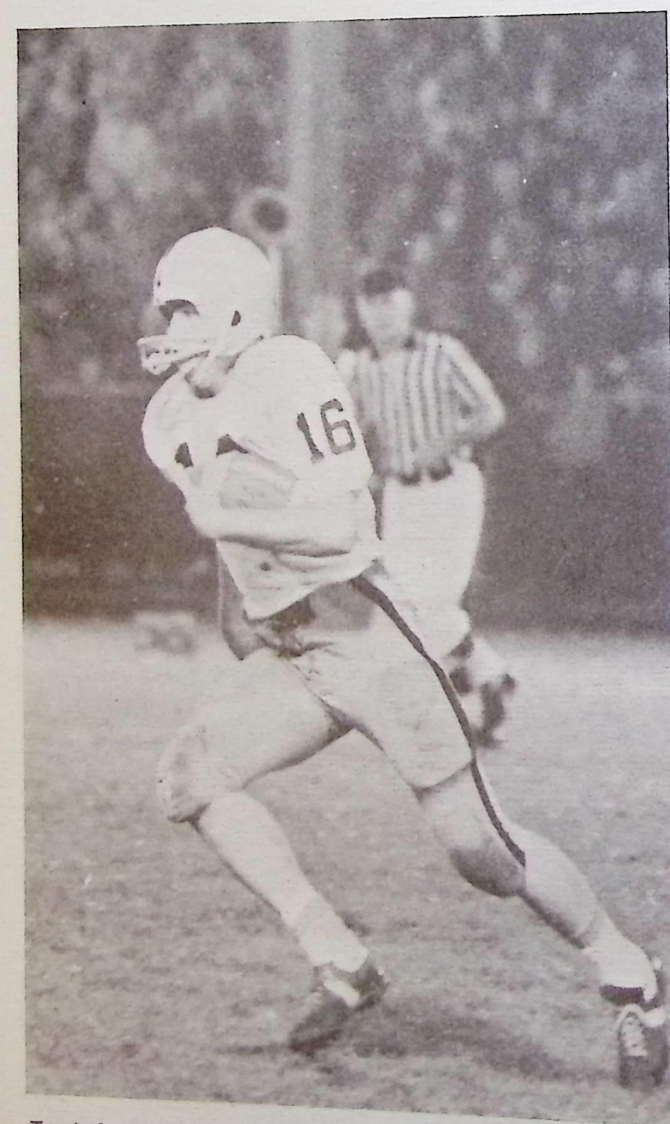
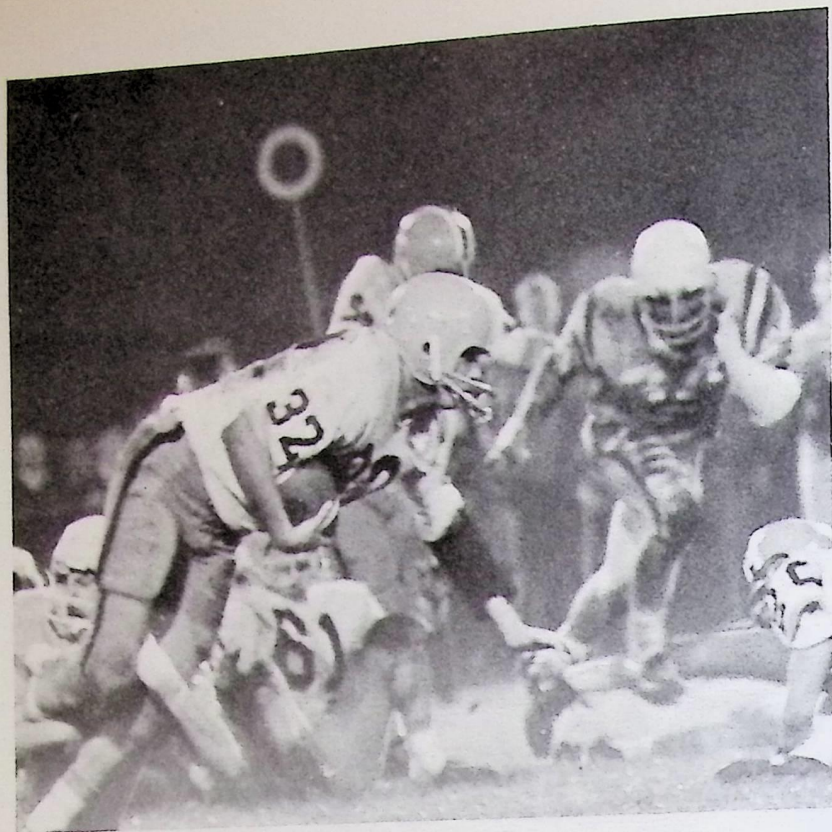


VARSITY FOOTBALL

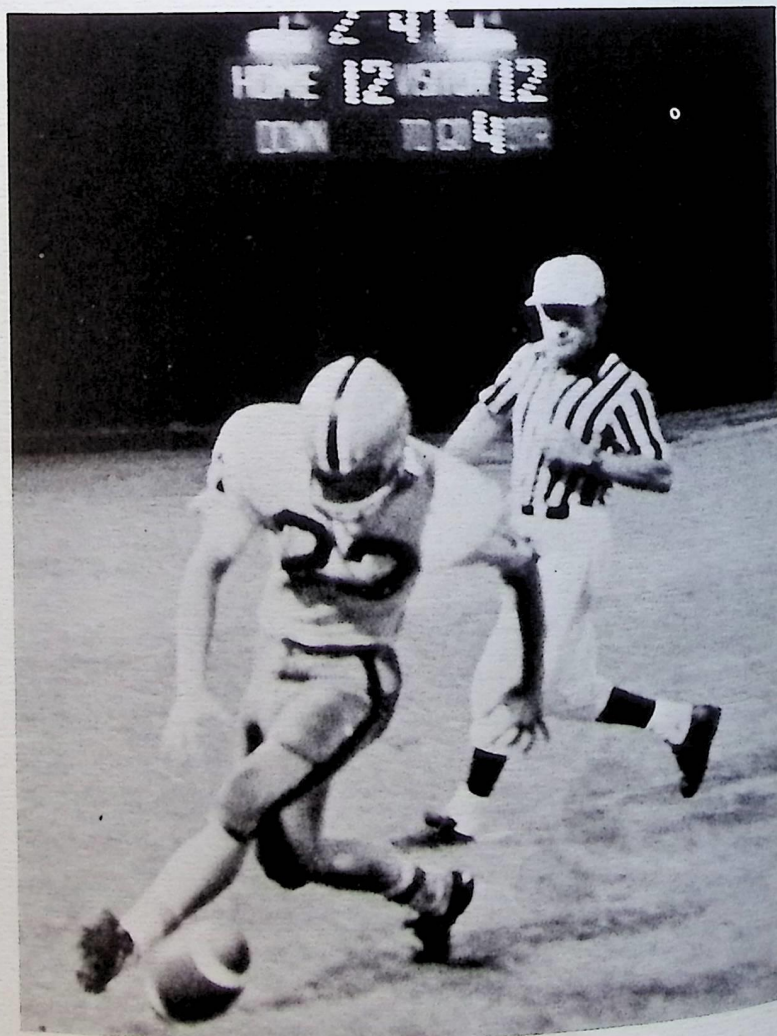
With the revamping of the G.C.C. this year, the North High Rangers faced the most impressive array of opponents in the school's history. Against such outstanding teams as Lorain Admiral King and Mentor (2nd in the state), the varsity team posted a 6-4 season record. Pacing the Rangers was star senior, half-back Gary Schlappal. Averaging 6.9 yds. per carry, he led the offense with 98 points. 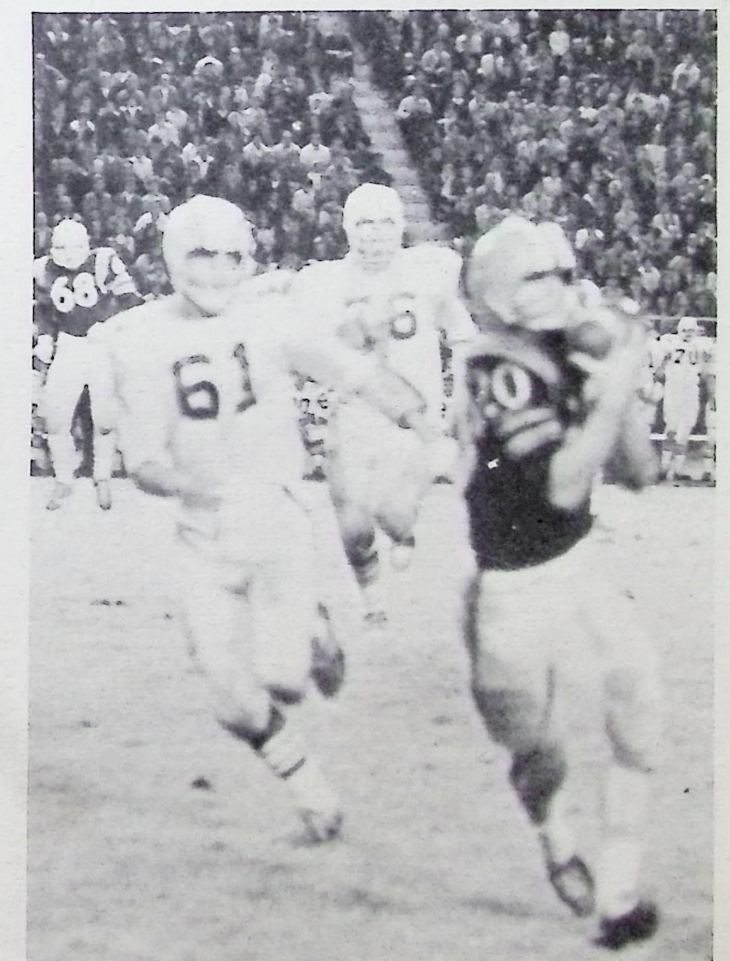

Cross Country

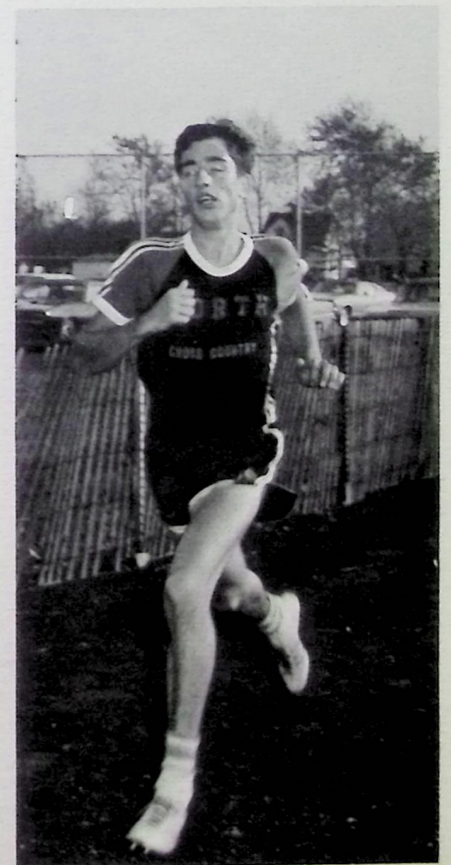

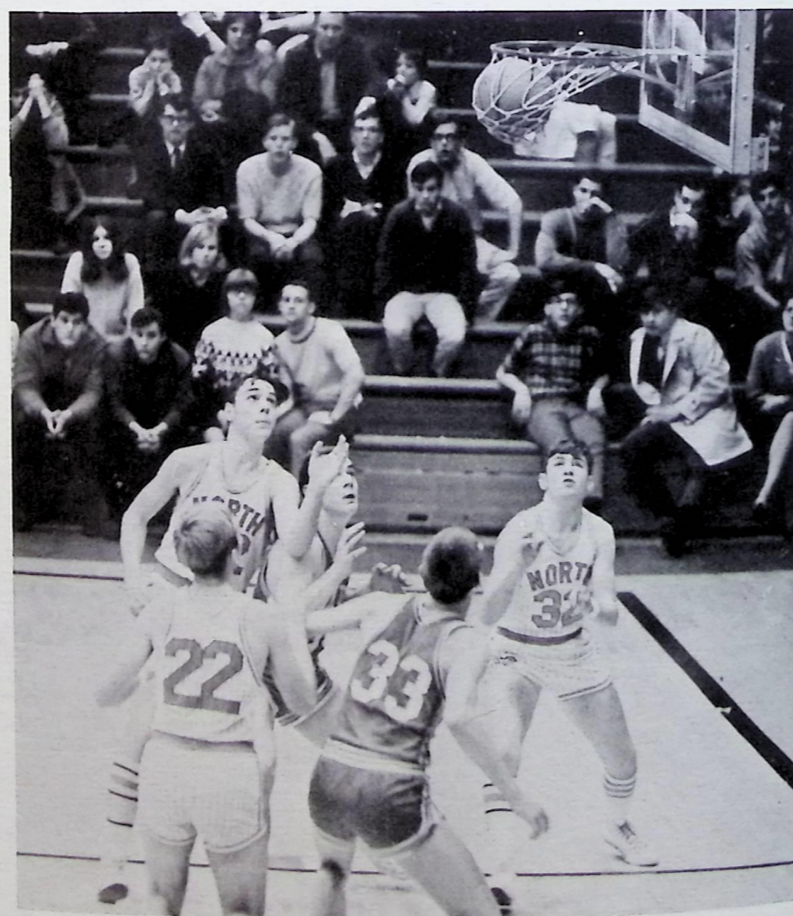


Shown above is George Bevington (41), as he drops in a foul shot against Warren Harding. North sank 237 such free throws during the regular season.

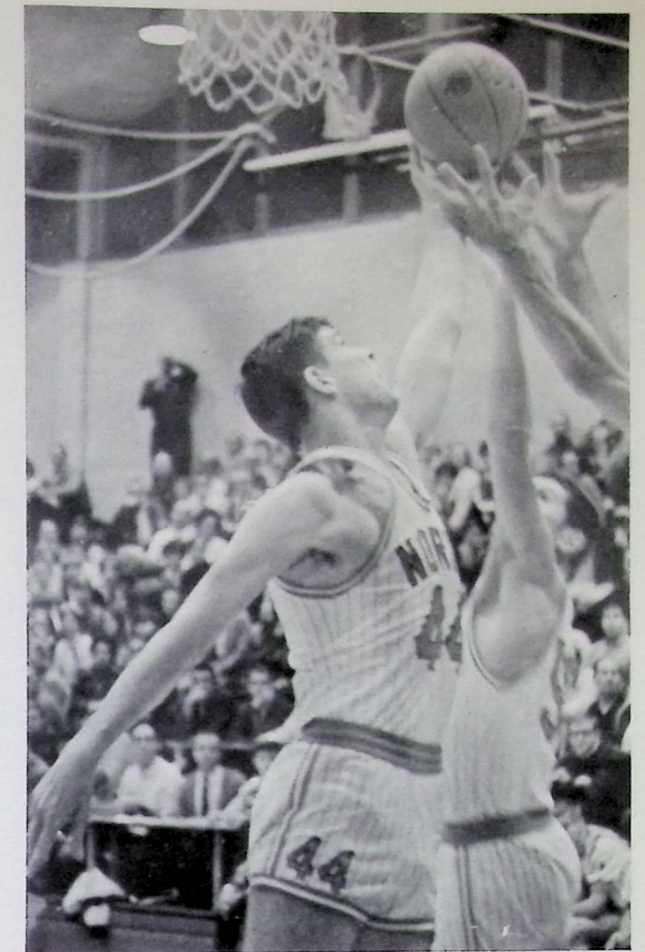
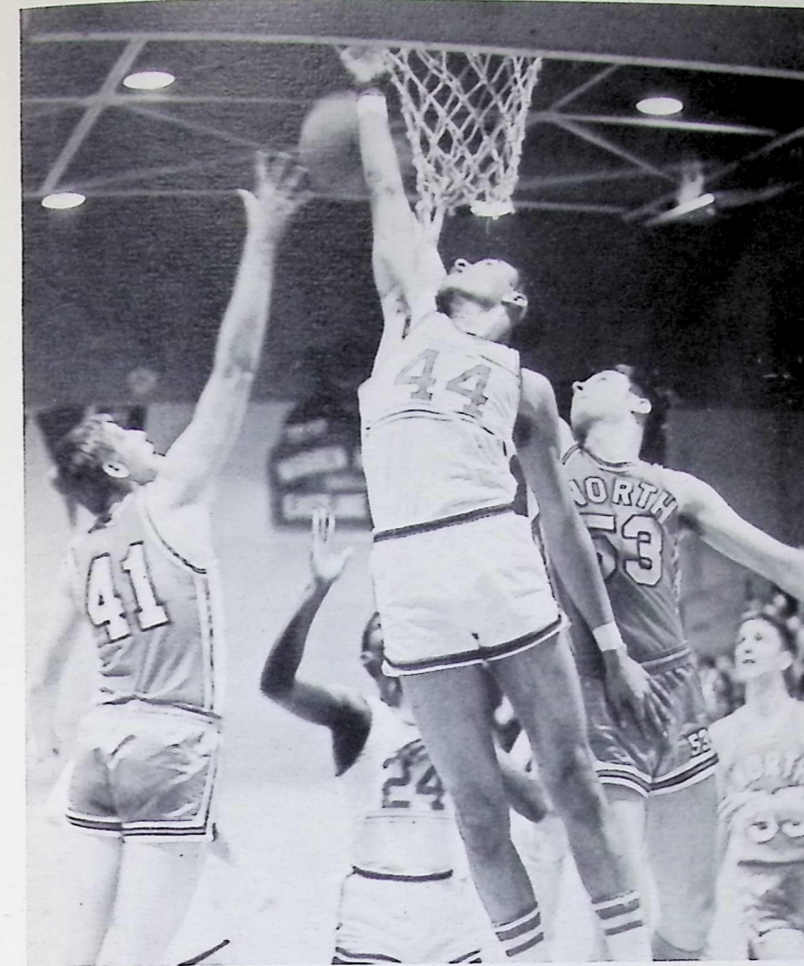

This year North High had one of its finest basketball teams ever. While compiling a 14-4 regular season record, and a 16-5 season overall, the cagers treated North fans to many exciting games. Only one team (Berea) managed to defeat the Rangers twice. The squad scored an average of 66 points per game, while limiting the opposition to a mere 51. Led by the two "Big Men", Bob Reichert and George Bevington, North also managed an impressive 44 rebounds per contest. 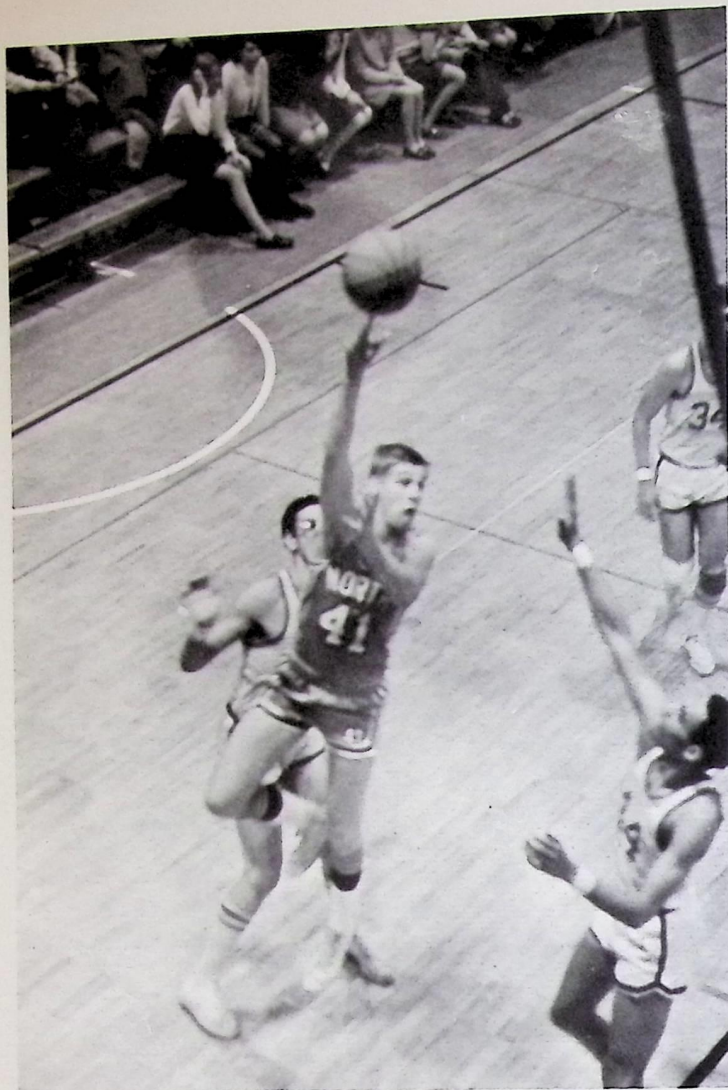

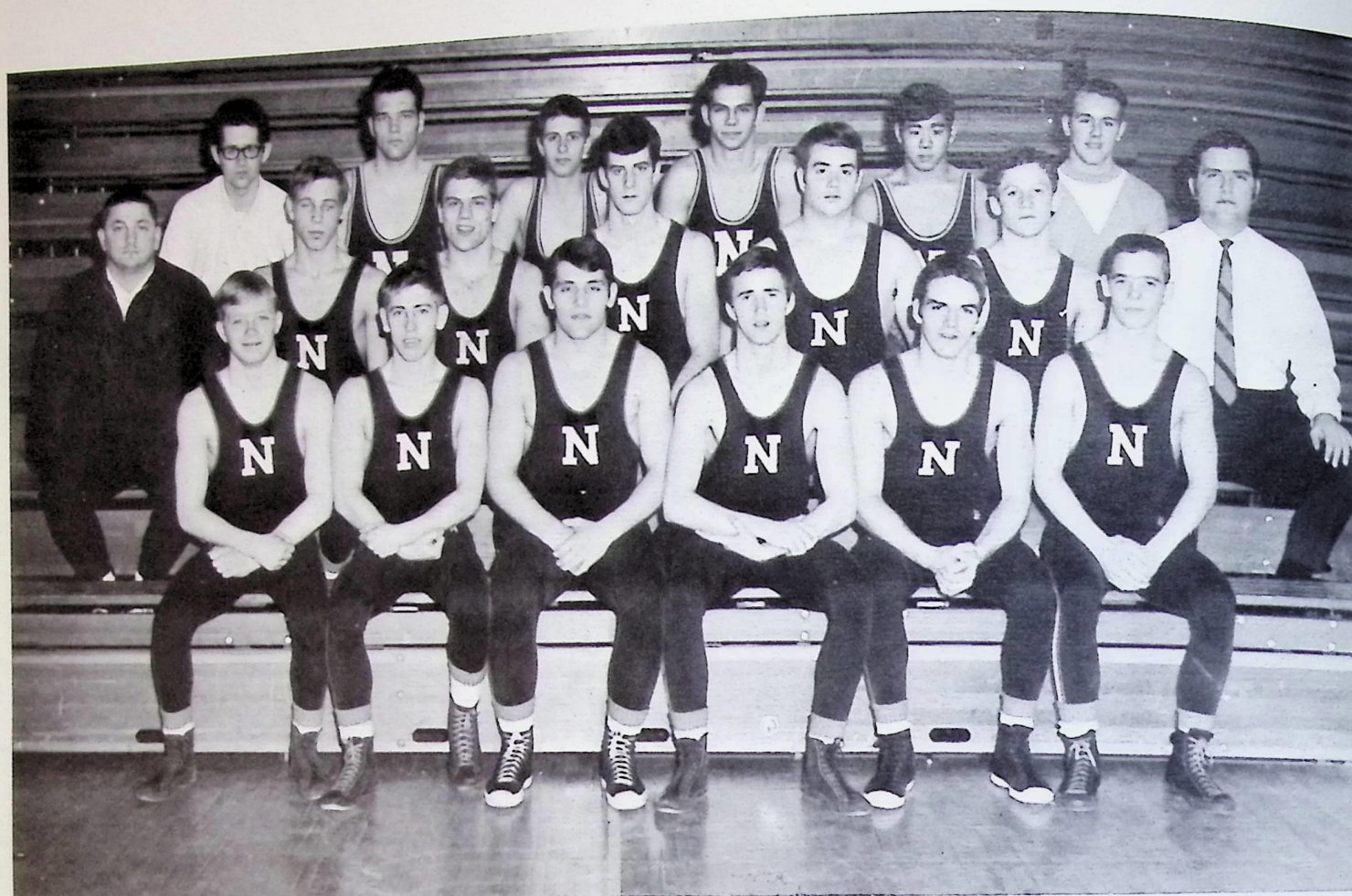
The North Junior Varsity raced to a share of the G.C.C. championship in 1969. The team compiled an 11-3 conference record and finished 14-4 overall. This year's J.V.s featured an excellent offense, averaging 48.4 points per game. Team leader was Howie Cavell with his 13.2 point average. Howie also led all foul shooters with his fine 71%. Complementing Cavell at the guard positions were Rich Wysocki (captain), Tim Crowe, and Roger Said. Under the boards were Tom Jones and Fred Pakis. Jones was the second leading rebounder with 109 grabs and contributed a 7.9 ppg. average. The spotlight of the J.V. season undoubtedly rested on Fred Pakis. This tall, talented sophomore was the leading rebounder with 237 (a remarkable 17.5 'bounds per game) and the second leading scorer at 11.9 ppg. Coach Stern and his team should be congratulated for their tremendous year.



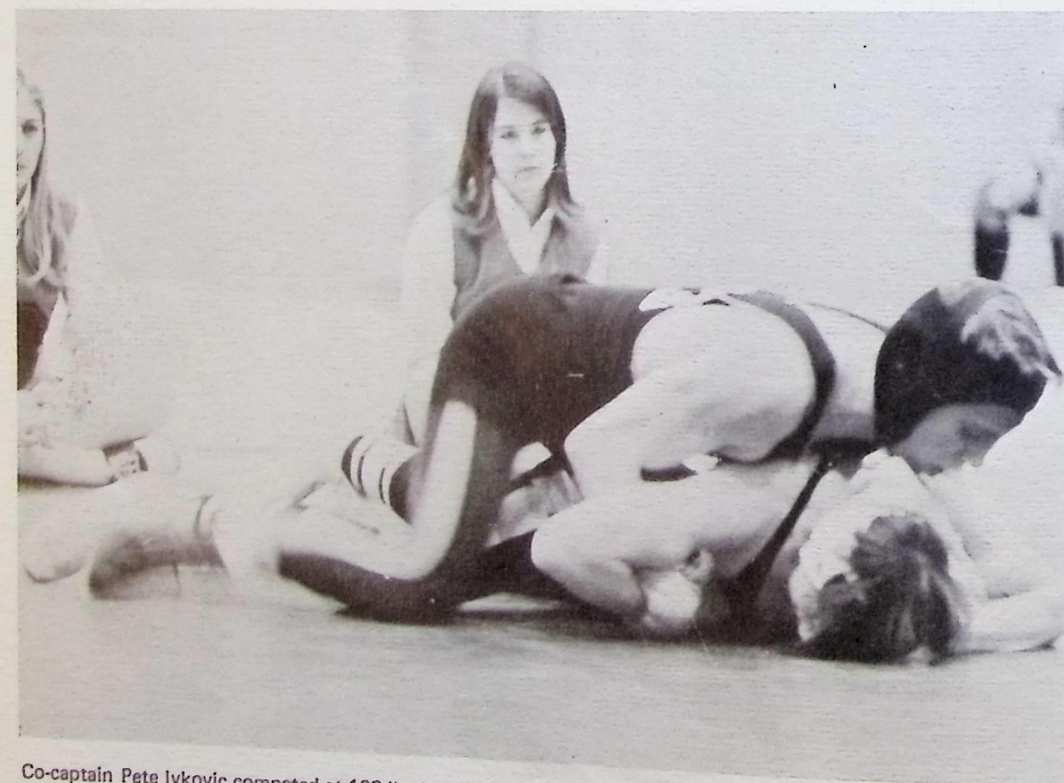

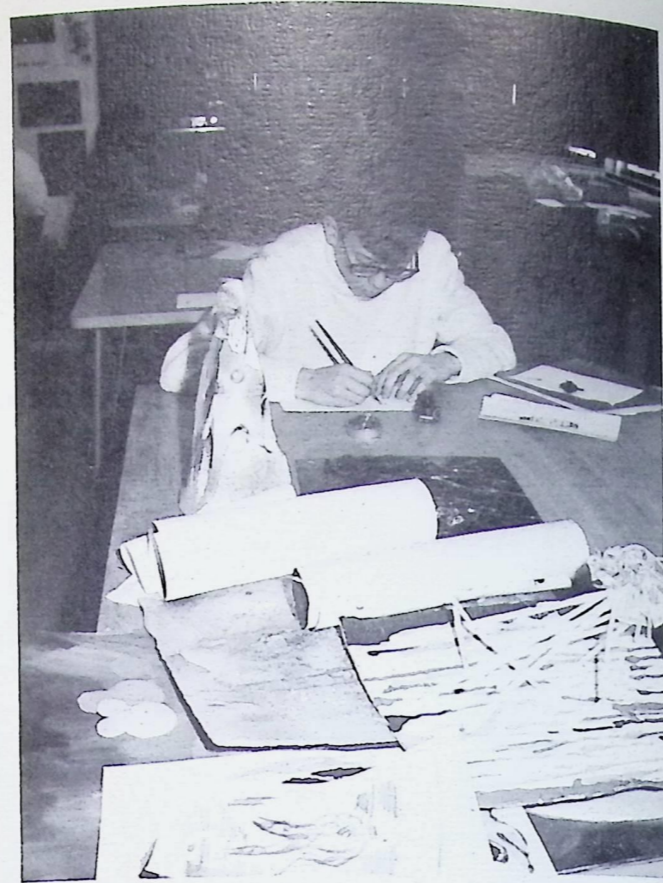


Art I & II

Art I is a year spent in introduction to the different methods and media of art, and in the establishment and evaluation of the student's style.

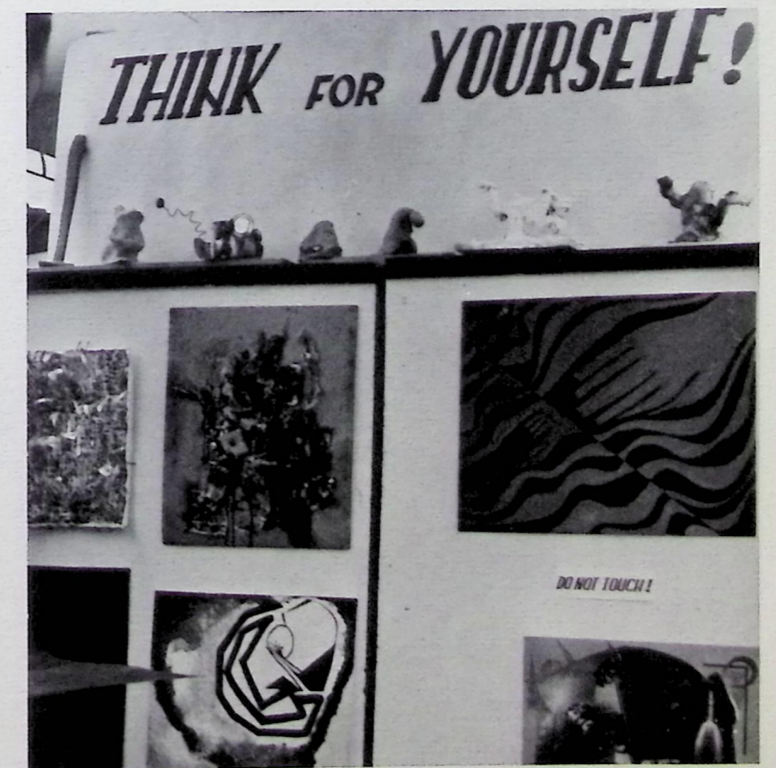
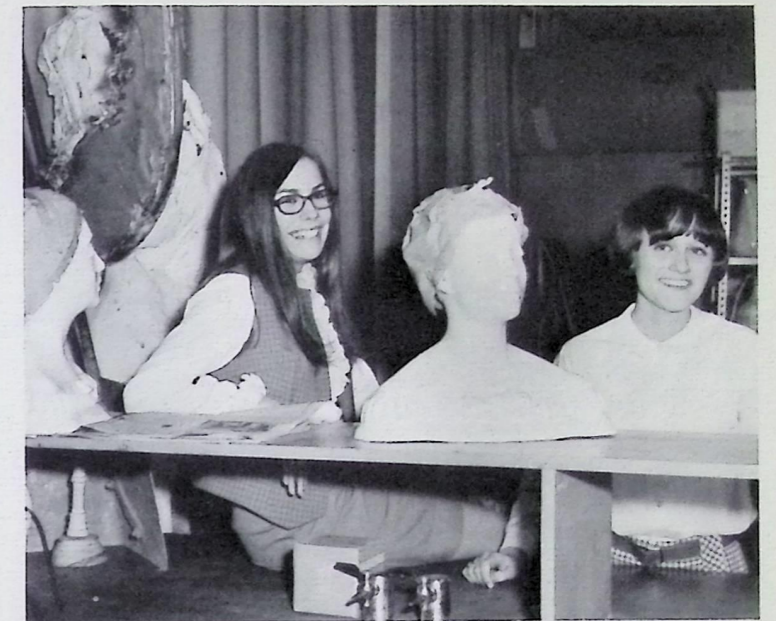

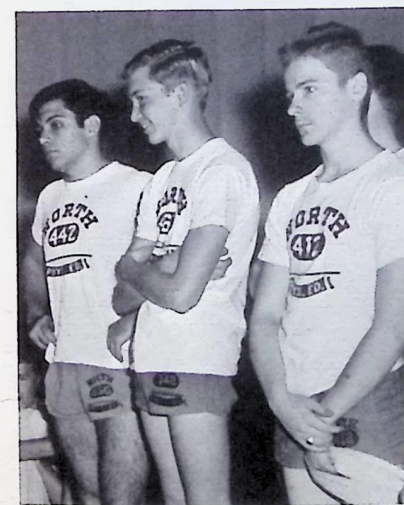
Cosmetology
