1970 LENS TRIBUTE

The construction of North High School was completed in 1957. After four years of being Principal of Willoughby Union High School, Mr. Farrar became the first Principal of North High School, one of the largest in the state. The position demanded a man of executive caliber, one who would administer over a hundred professional personnel and over two thousand students each year. The job is a difficult one, but Mr. Farrar has successfully met the challenge of the position. Over the years, he has contributed more than any other single individual to the fine reputation that North enjoys throughout the State of Ohio.

Mr. Farrar has participated in the graduation of twenty-five thousand students. He has watched them pass through the North High academic and extra-curricular program, which he has had an integral part in forming, to assert themselves in the world of today.

Mr. Farrar was well prepared for the instrumental role of North's Principal. He was valedictorian of his high school class and proceeded to secure a Bachelor's Degree at Ohio University in chemistry and physics. He went on at Ohio University and received a Master's Degree in 1939. Initially he was employed as an engineer for the B.F. Goodrich Company. But his keen interest in young people prompted him to become a chemistry and physics instructor at Logan High School in Logan, Ohio.

As an innovator and an effective leader, his abilities were soon recognized. He became a high school administrator at Sugar Grove, Ohio and shortly thereafter acceded to the position of Superintendent of Schools for the Mount Gilead School System in Mount Gilead, Ohio. In 1953 he came to Willoughby as Principal of Willoughby Union High School.

Outside of his professional activities, Mr. Farrar is active in the Boy Scouts, Red Cross, Kiwanis, Rotary Club, and Masonic Lodge.

His professional talent has been recognized by his peers. He has served as the President of the Ohio High School Principal's Association and as President of the Greater Cleveland Conference.

With the retirement of Mr. Farrar passes an era. An era of curricular innovation, of expansion, and of tremendous growth. Providing the stimulus for this process, and guiding it in an orderly fashion with forcefulness and authority, tactfulness and poise, has been the first principal of North High, and its greatest strength, Mr. O.H. Farrar, Mr. North High!

Anyone visiting the main office has probably seen a petite lady calmly coping with any task at top speed. Mrs. Mills is secretary to Mr. Farrar, the Principal of North. She is trusted with any and all amounts of money, with valuable keys, and with important papers. She handles the incoming mail, absence of personnel at North, and the regular duties of a secretary; filing, typing, and answering the busy phones. Her ability to use the English language correctly and tastefully, plus her desire to do everything neatly and accurately, makes her an indispensable secretary. Last year Mrs. Mills won the "Office Employee of the Year" award.

Mrs. Mills attended the Westhampton College, University of Richmond, Virginia and Otterbein College and received an A.B. Degree in Voice. She was also an alto soloist and a member of the college church choir. Her sorority was Kappa Phi Omega of which she organized an alumni group after her graduation.

Mrs. Mills has a separate and busy life outside of school. She has assisted in the organization of the local OAPSE Chapter; helped organize a Provisional League of Women Voters; held many offices and served on many committees in the PTA; organized and directed a PTA mother singing group; participated in many minstrel shows and amateur theatricals; directed Blue Bird and Campfire Girls Groups; is also a member of the Business and Professional Women's Organization; taught women's classes of Sunday School for many years; is an elder in the Presbyterian Church where she served as ruling elder for two terms, and clerk of sessions for eight years. She is a member of the Women's Circle in the Church; the missionary reporter for the Women's Association of the Church, and has participated for many years in the soliciting for fund raising drives. In between all these activities, Mrs. Mills raised a family, and now has four grandchildren.

Mrs. Mills' service could never be measured for she has gone beyond the call of duty. She is ready to help anyone who needs it. She supplies aid, with much kindness, no matter what the cost in time, money or self. She thinks of all the nice little things to do such as; a Valentine dish of candy for office pages, a birthday cake for another secretary, her own homemade candy for a Christmas party, or a plant for an ill custodian. She is a great lady, and will be sorely missed. Mrs. Mills is respected and admired by all who know her.

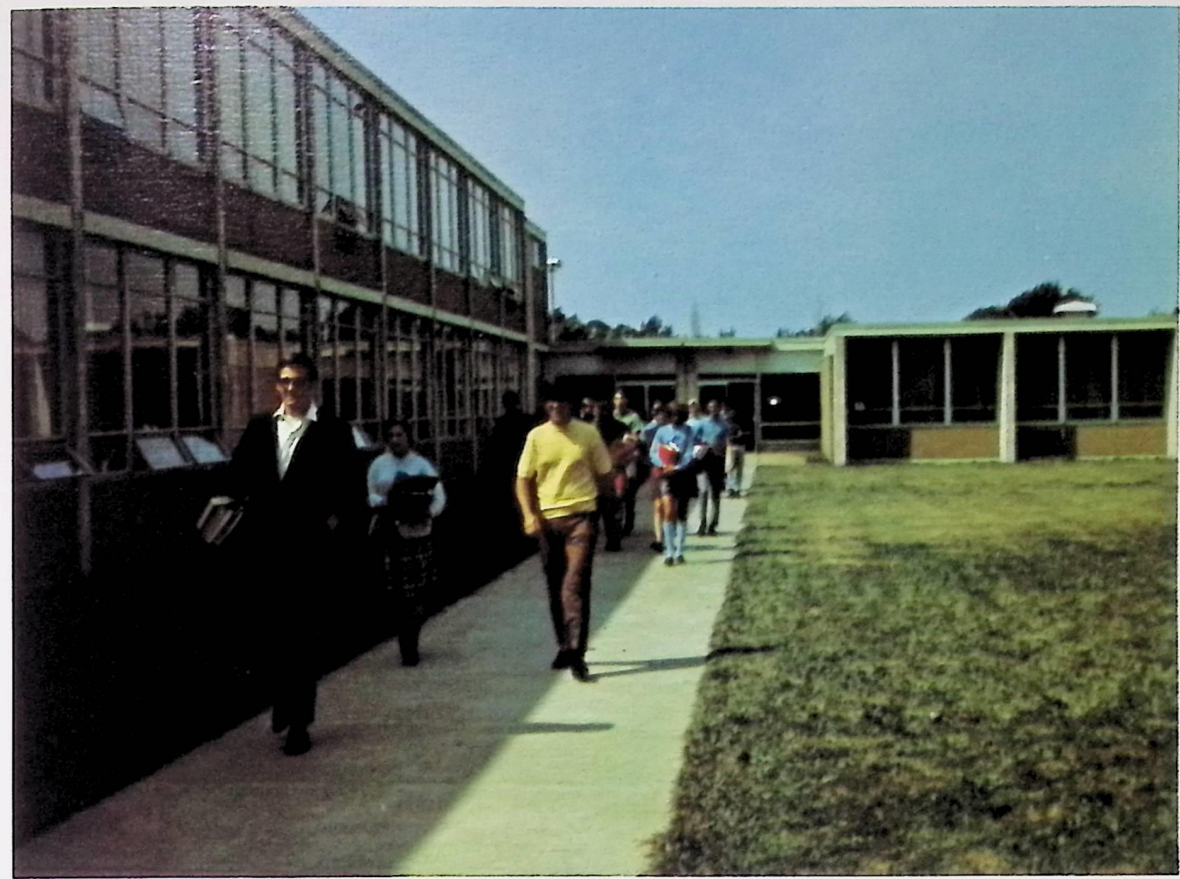
The man who has climbed the ladder to success; has continuously brought enjoyment and enrichment to the lives of others; has opened the door to many rewarding careers; and who has a special niche in the memories of four decades of students is Mr. Charles Ruddick. His name is synonymous with accomplishment, enthusiasm, and music. Although somewhat less than statuesque in his proportions, his record makes him a giant among men.

A native of Cincinnati, Mr. Ruddick attended Ohio Northern University where he received an A.B. degree and a B.S. degree in Education. He studied at the Cincinnati Conservatory of Music and earned his M.A. from Western Reserve. He has been with the Willoughby-Eastlake School System for forty years.

The first full time instrumental director in Lake County has made a habit of being the first in other ways as well. He was the first president of the Lake County Music Educators Association which he helped to organize. He also helped organize the Willoughby Community Orchestra, which he has directed for seventeen years.

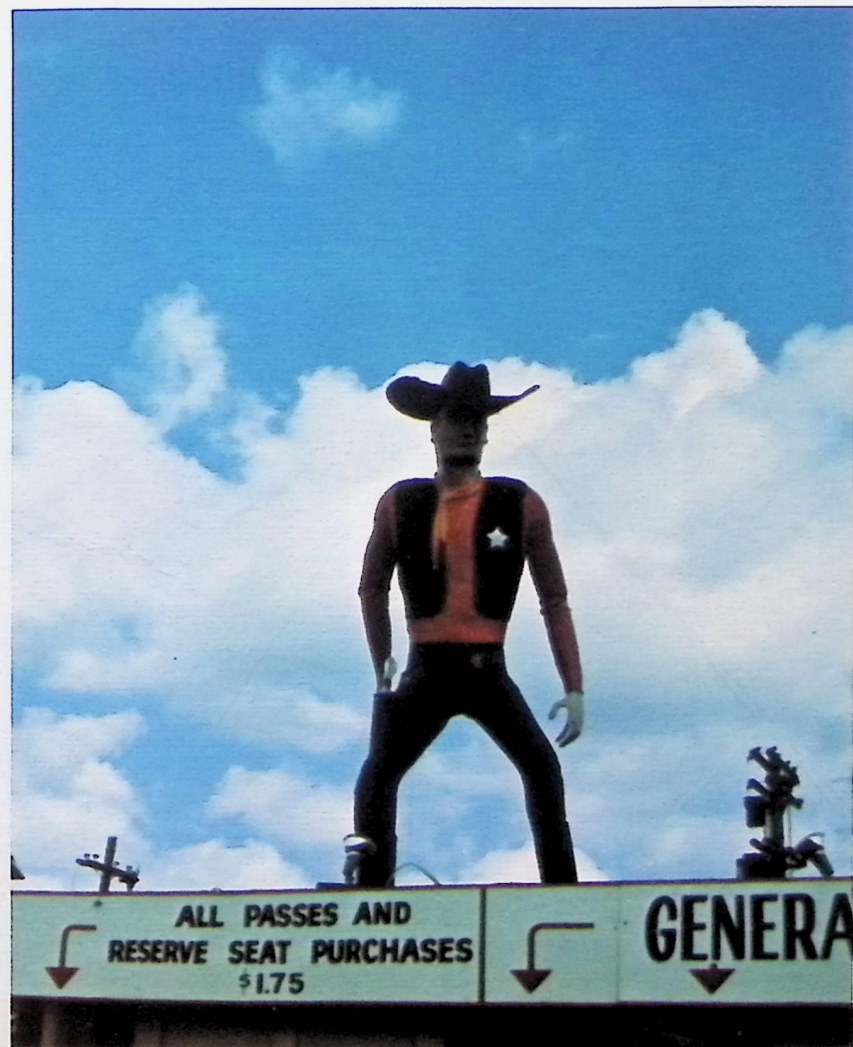
Mr. Ruddick's awards are also numerous. The Western Reserve Bands gave him a recognition award for contribution to the advancement of public school music in 1963. Two years later he was awarded the Teacher's Medal by the Freedoms Foundation at Valley Forge. In 1966 he was one of three chosen as distinguished citizens by the Willoughby Chamber of Commerce and the following year was listed in Who's Who in American Education. In 1968 the School Musician Magazine named him one of the ten most outstanding school music directors of the year. As an undergraduate, Mr. Ruddick became a member of Kappa Kappa Phi, the honorary music fraternity and more recently he was given an honorary life membership in Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, the professional music fraternity. The bands he has directed at North have also won many awards in district and state competition, and have been invited to perform on many occasions outside of the educational circle. Mr. Ruddick maintains his position in the community in other ways, too. He is a member and a past district governor of Lions International.

Many students are not aware of the celebrity in our midst. The serious music students soon learn what an advantage it is to have studied under him when they go on to higher education. We are sure they join us in saying with complete conviction, Mr. Ruddick, you ARE six feet tall!



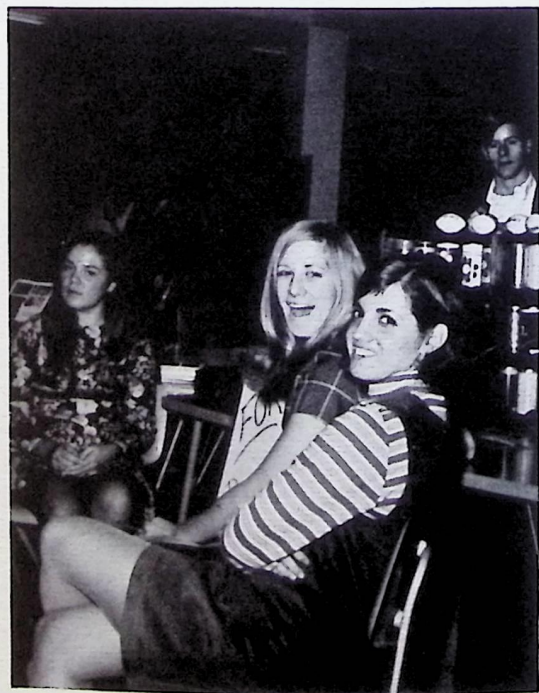
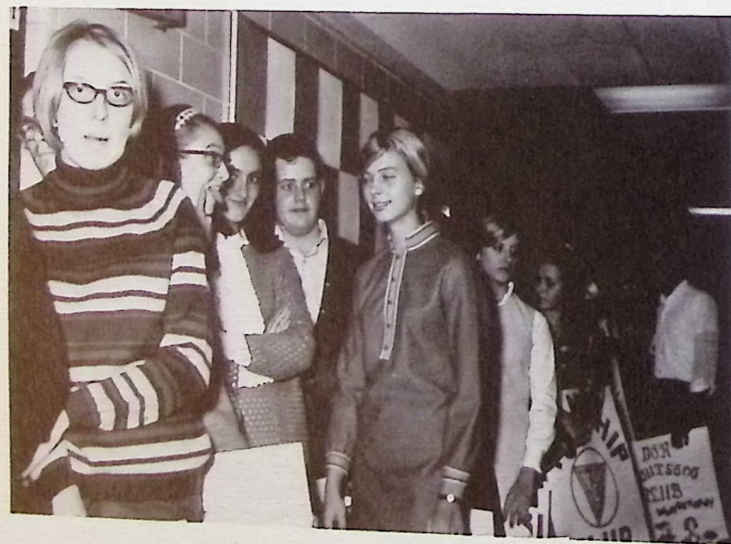
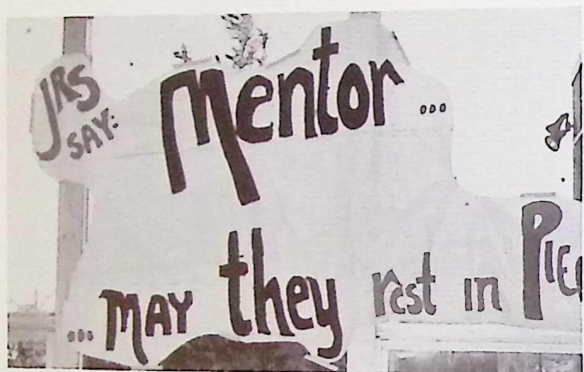

National Honor Society

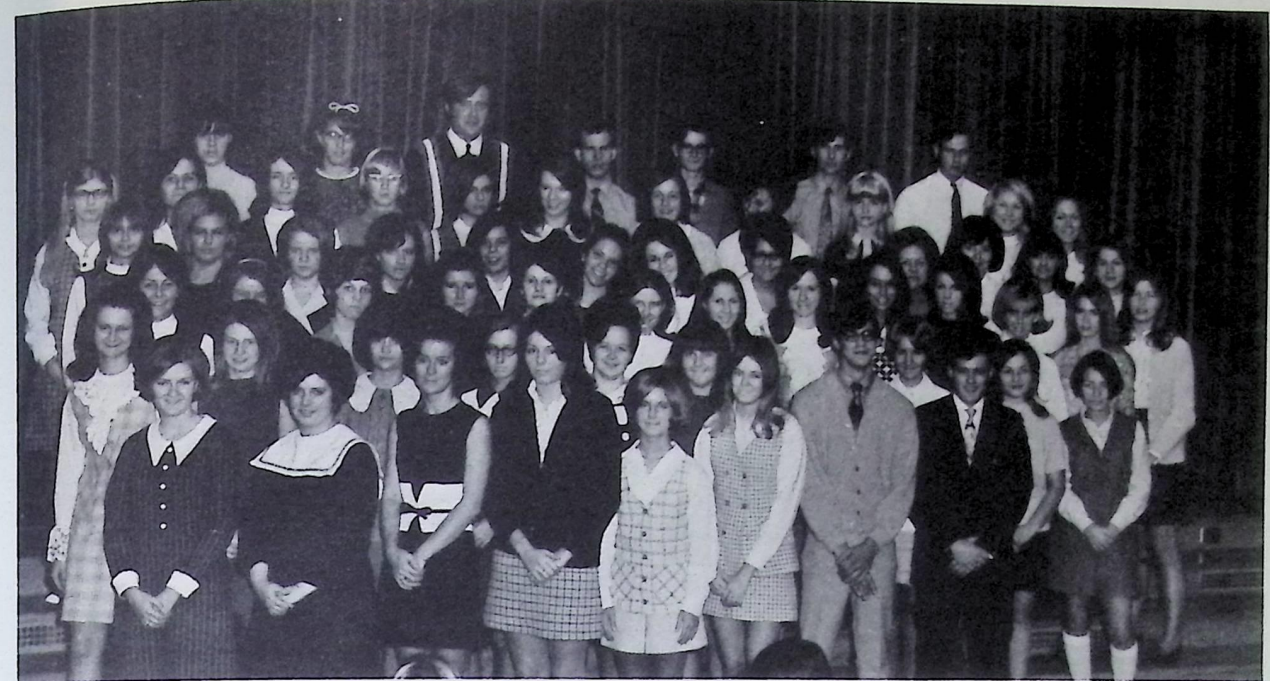

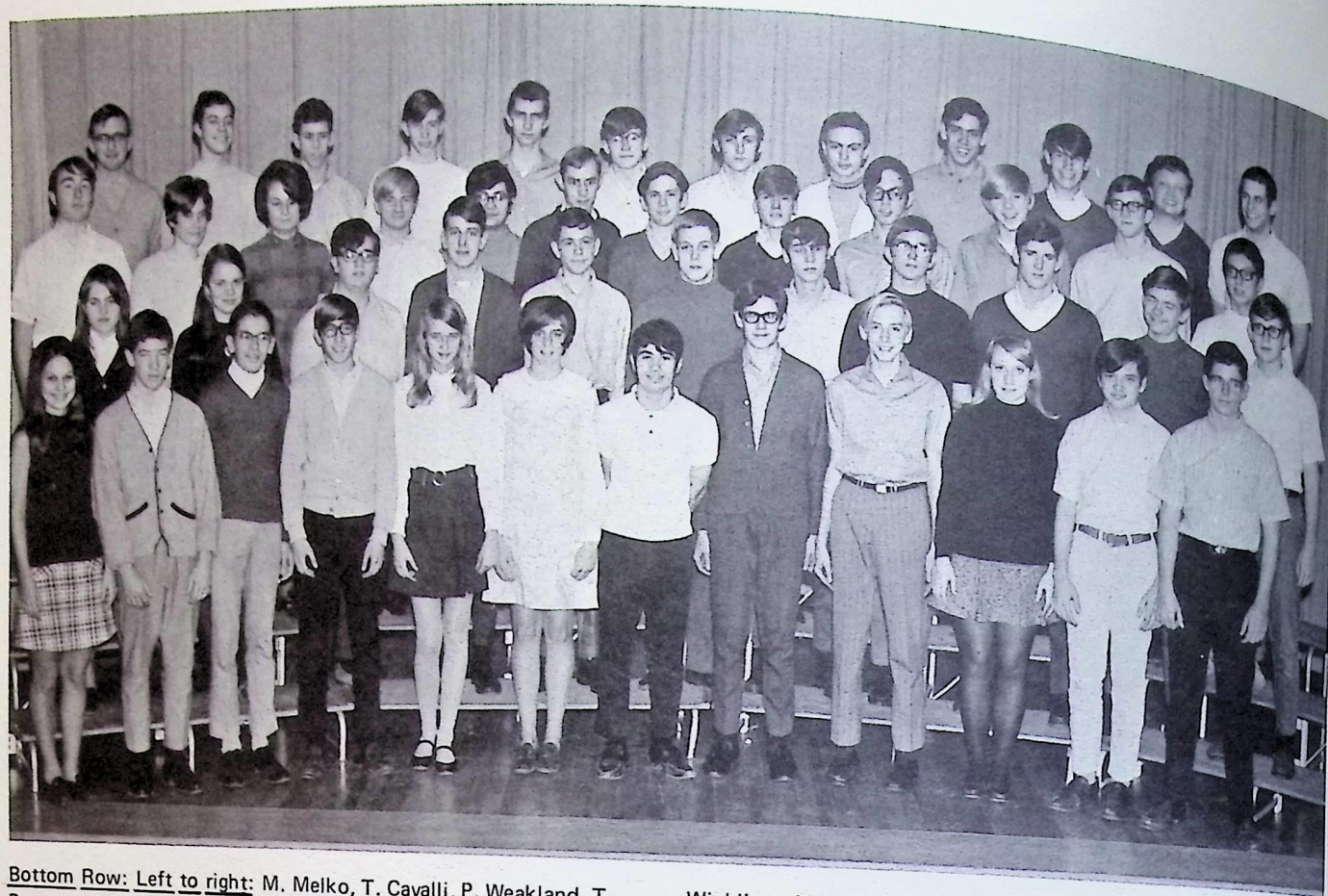


Thespians

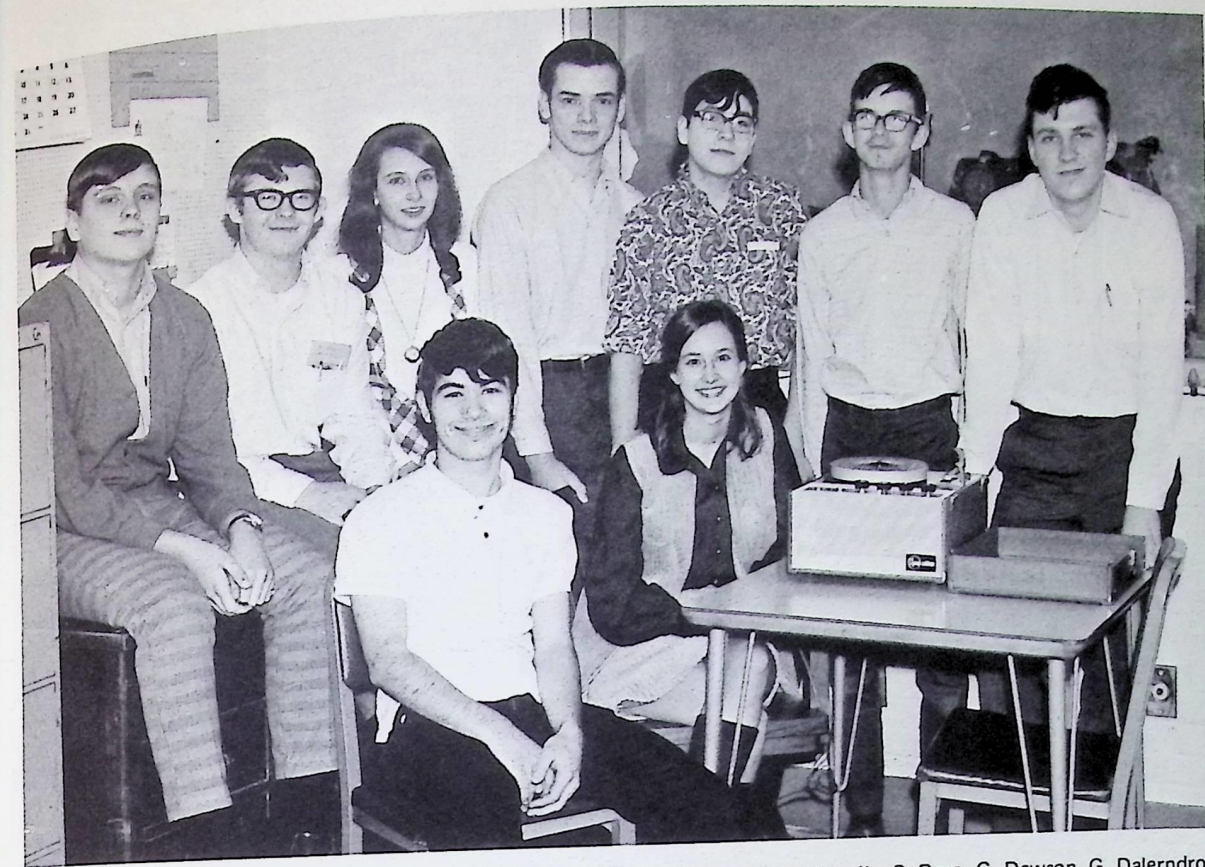

It should be the job of every student to let others know that they have pride in their teams and school. North is GREAT!

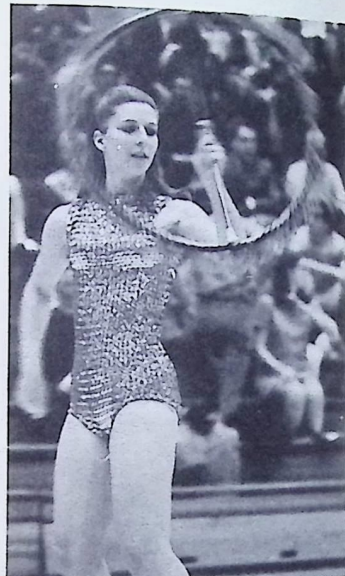
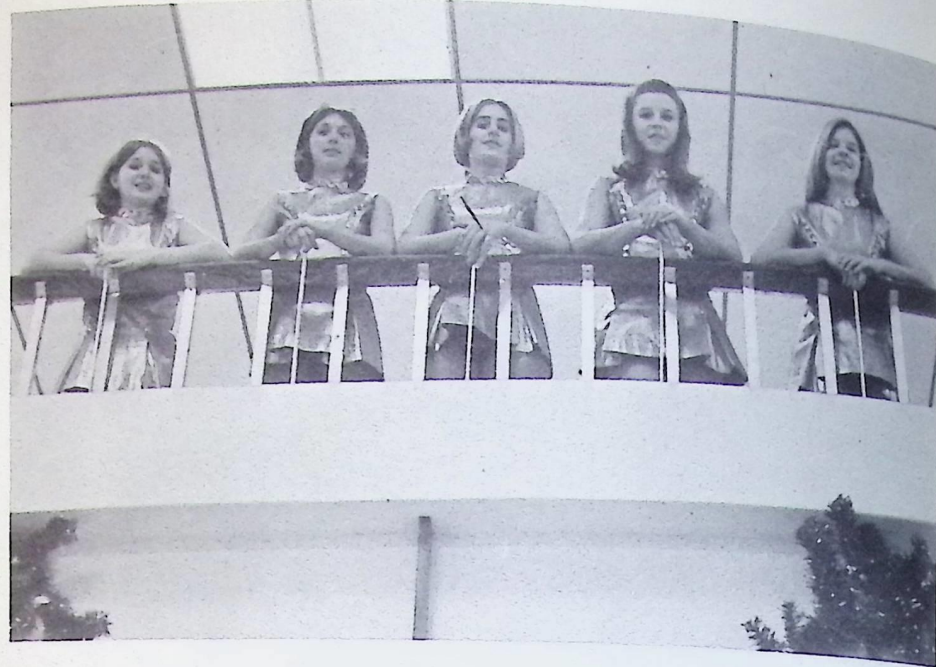

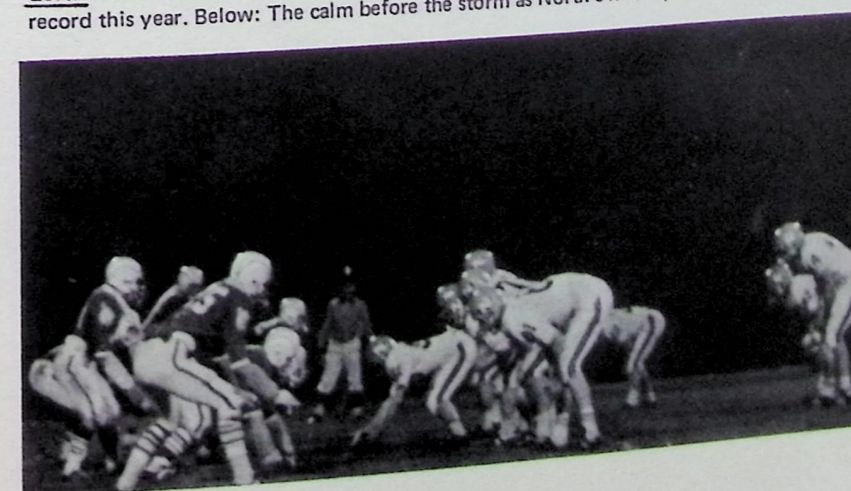

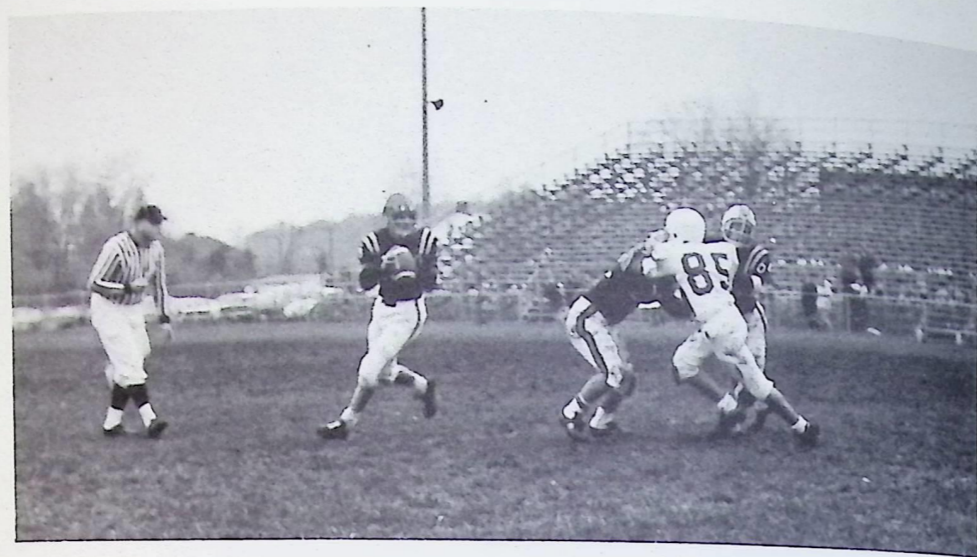
Varsity Football

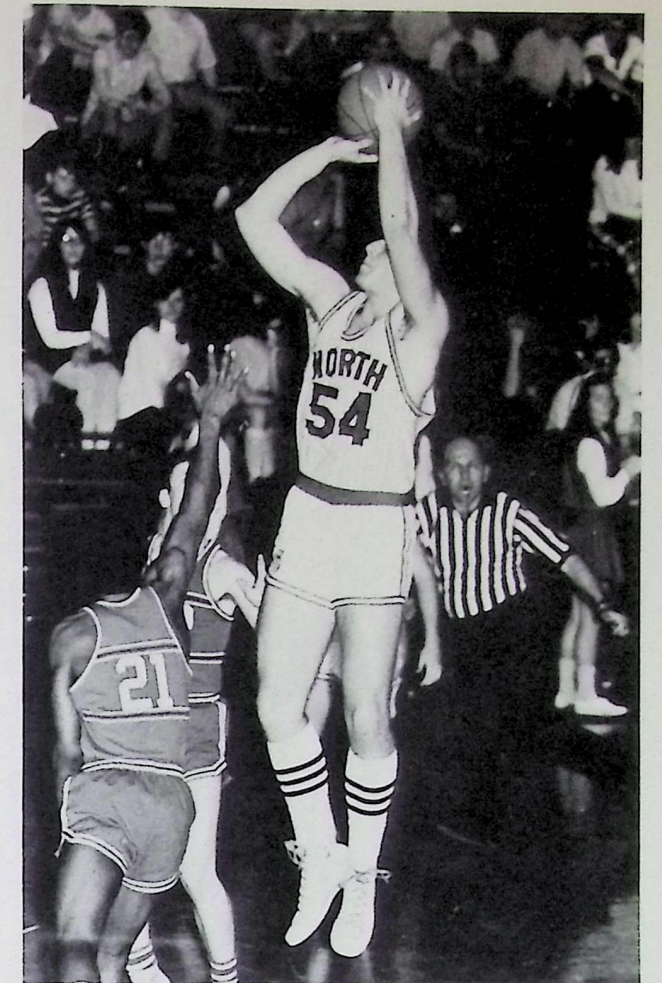

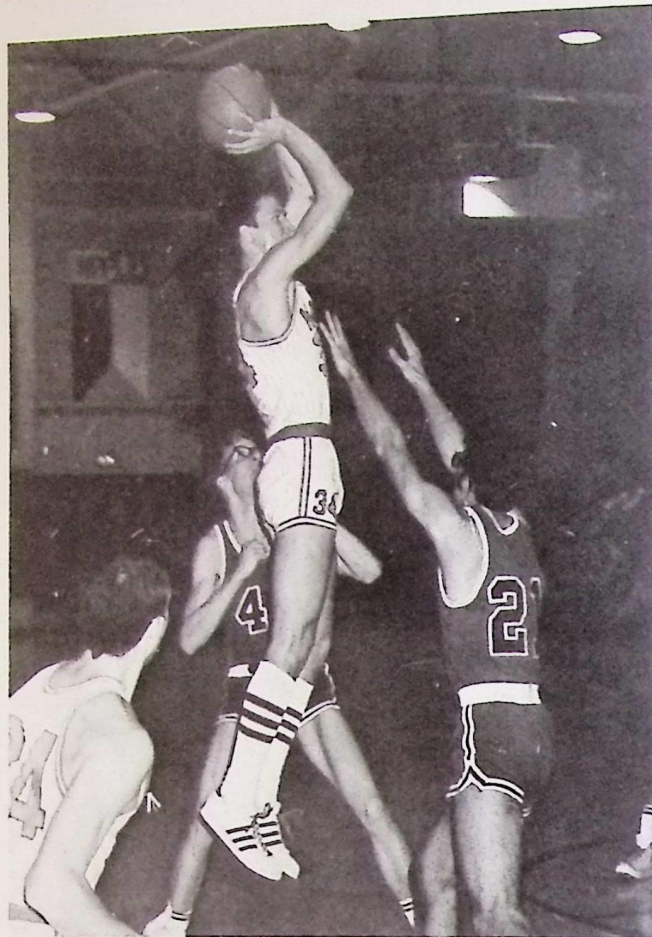

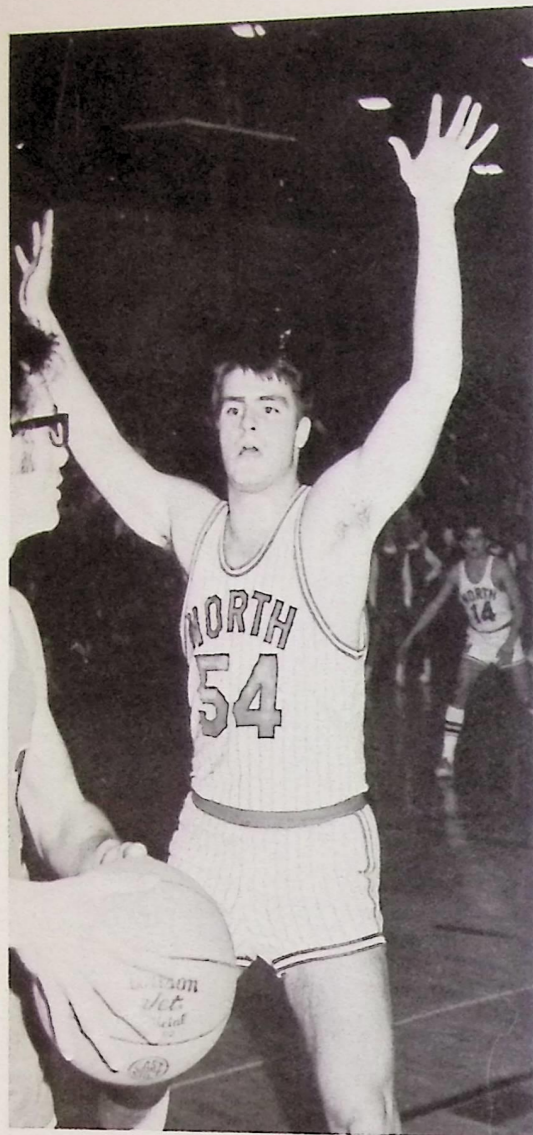

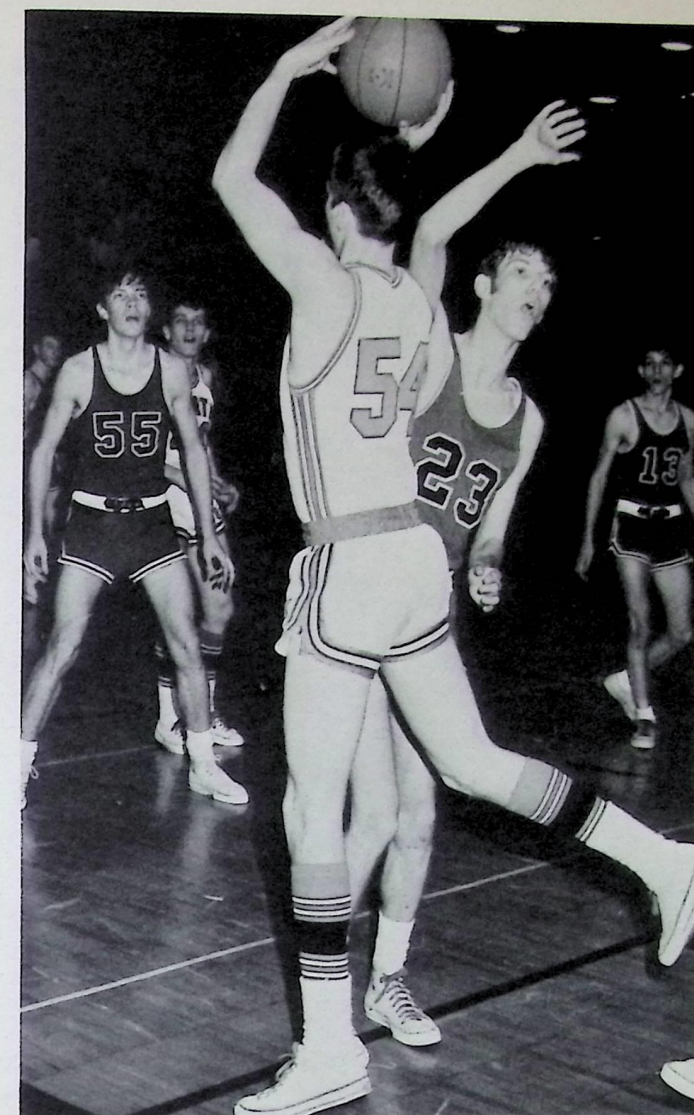


Above—Coach Stern argues a point with the official, it was reported that the officials reply was, "Same to you fella!"

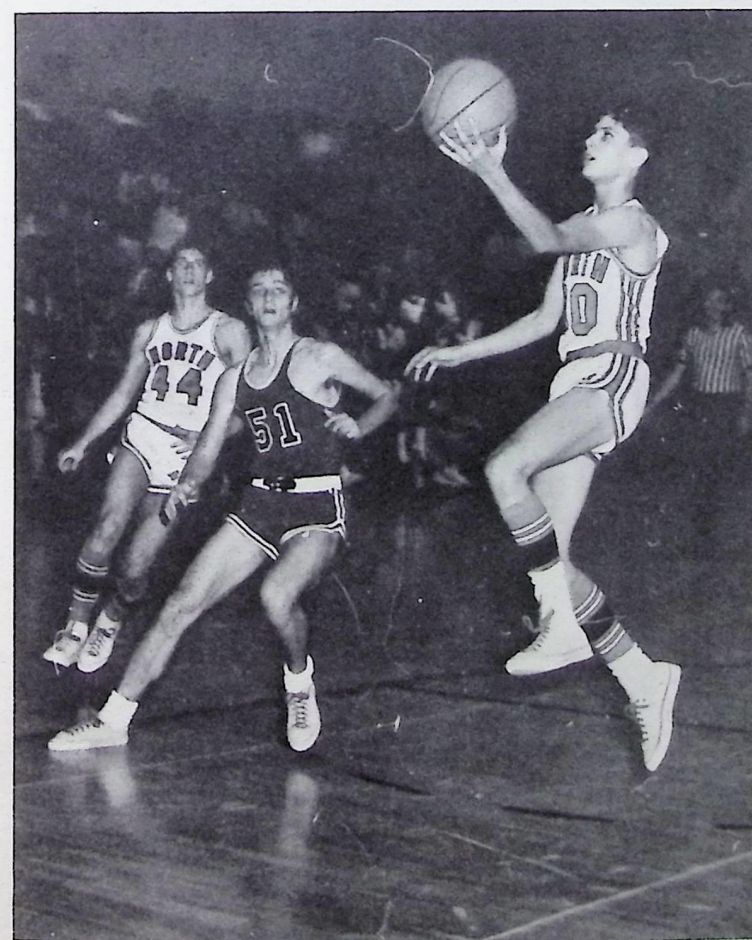

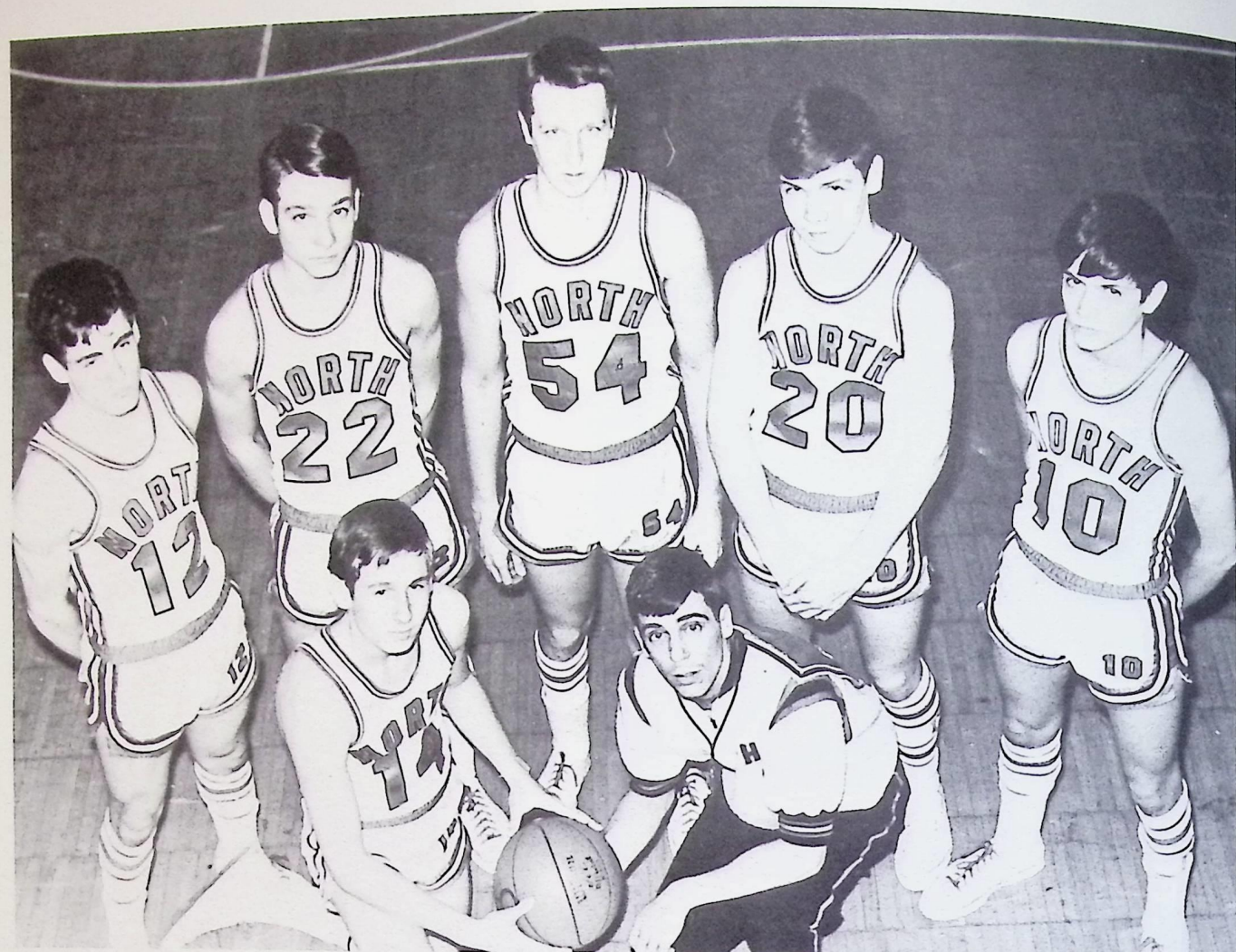


Above—Mike Colgrove (54) supplied some of the much needed height for the J.V.'s.



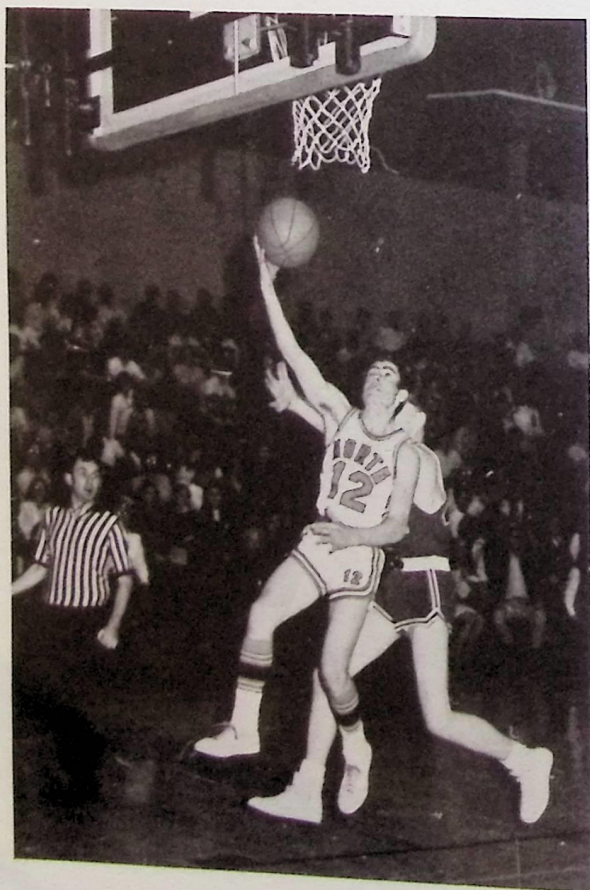

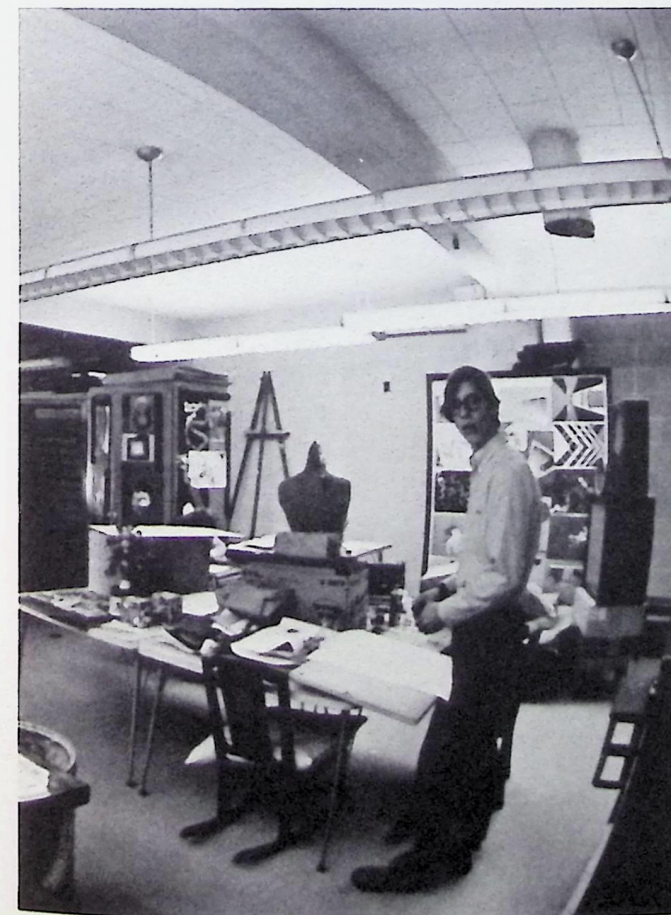
Art I

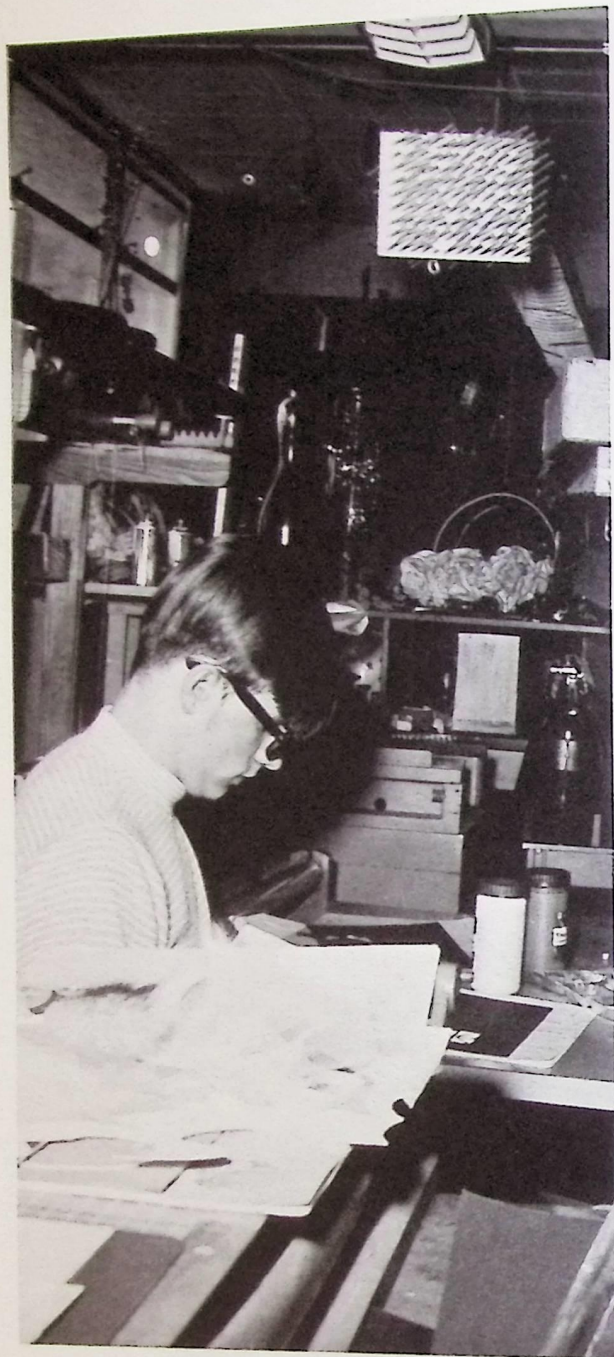

Art III

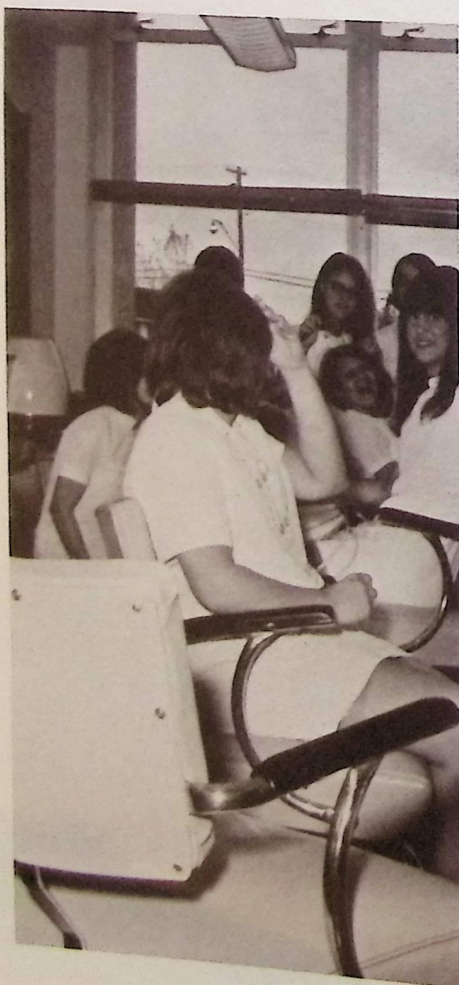

A Tribute to Mrs. Margaret Broderick Meyer

It is generally assumed that every high school will have a yearbook. Back in 1939, this was not the case. Willoughby Union High, the school that became North and South High Schools, until that year had no annual. Fortunately on the faculty was Mrs. Margaret Broderick Meyer, a very popular freshman English Teacher. She had the initiative and foresight to undertake the organization of an all school yearbook. The routine preparation of a yearbook is a difficult enough job, but to establish an annual is an overwhelming task indeed. Mrs. Meyer gave freely of her own personal time and set up the fundamental organizational systems involved in publishing the Lens. These systems continue to be followed today.

Mr. Meyer realized that with each passing year an array of social activities, athletic events, academic achievements, along with the people who were involved in these functions had faded into the past unrecorded. The tragedy of these lost memories was ended by this yearbook pioneer.

Mrs. Meyer, a graduate of Ursuline College, taught freshman English, journalism, Latin, and German, and was well liked by her students. She loved to write poetry and her work was often a part of school functions. She earned her Master's degree from the University of Michigan in 1941, and married in 1942. She recently died of a prolonged illness.

In the first Lens, printed in 1939, a forward opened the book. The last paragraph reads:

"The name "Lens" serves to interpret the motif, that of viewing the life of the school through the Lens of a camera. It is hoped that the reader of this book will gleam from the pages all the pleasures which were installed in them by the senior class.

Mrs. Meyer's spirit, evident in these words, set the tone for each annual that followed, as it does now and will continue to do for as long as the Lens is published.

Our high school years include important memories of laughter, tears, challenges, excitement and achievement. The goal of the 1970 Lens has been to capture and preserve these many elements of our high school years.

As in any concerted effort to achieve perfection, many talents are required. Numerous people must work together to produce a single edition of the Lens. This year's yearbook is no exception. Indeed many people have spent time assisting me, but a few gave unrelentlessly of their energy and fortitude. Ken Club, the Lens photography attended virtually every major event that occurred at North this year and very ably photographed the happenings with his usual artistic flair. Marlene Lombardo and John Baron spent many hours walking from business to business soliciting advertising. And as you will notice as you look through our advertising section, Mrs. Tereslyn Raglow, a North English teacher, was responsible for gathering and organizing five advertisements from her classes. Thanks especially to those wonderful seniors in her classes who supported our efforts so well.

Our adviser, Mr. Lou Cicek, and our publisher's representative, Mr. Mike McKelly both assisted me greatly in the compiling of this book.

In the years to come, I do hope that this volume will provide for all of you the joys of reminiscence and recollection of our high school years.
