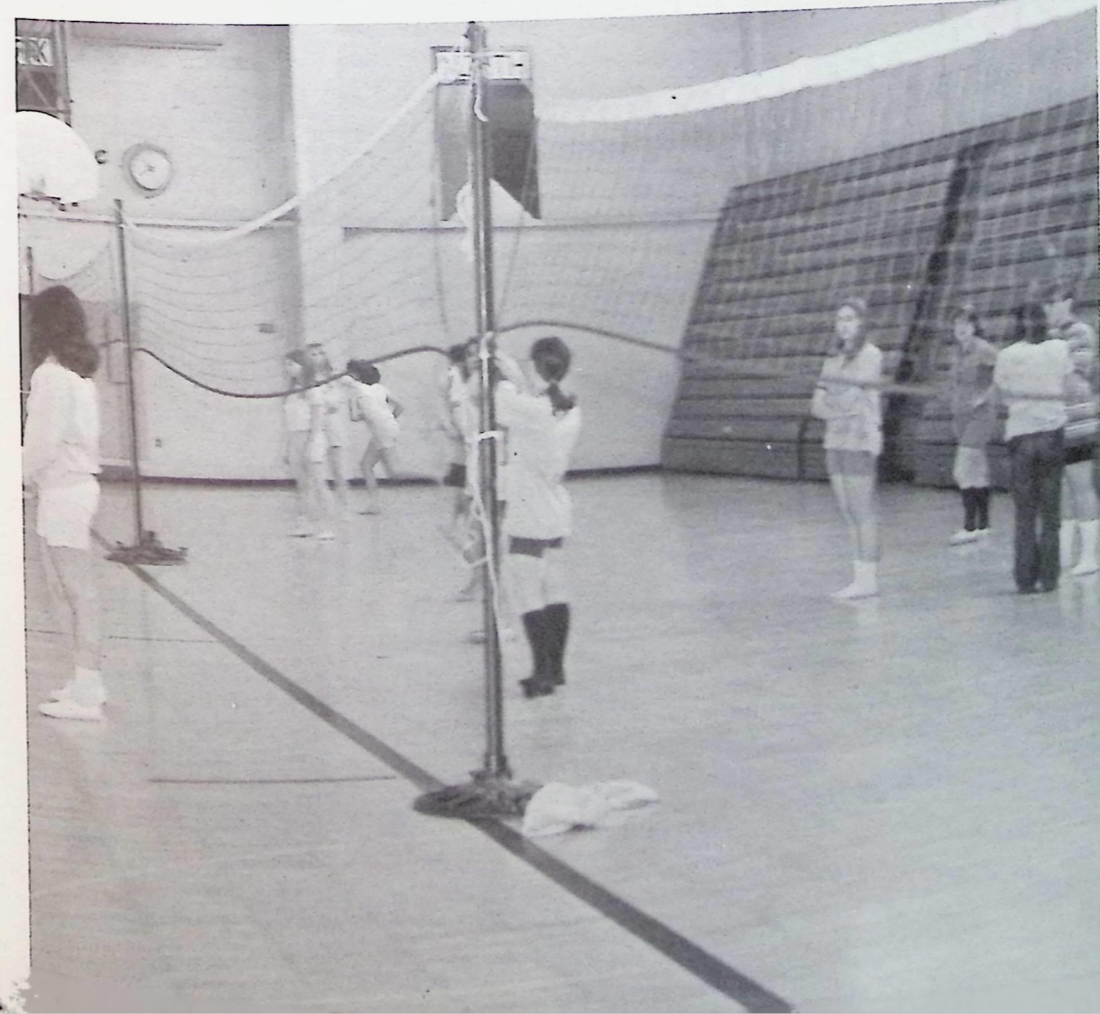
With the new regime of student administrators appointed, the 1970-71 governmental system began. The catalysts of change, these representatives are the mediators in student-faculty relationships.

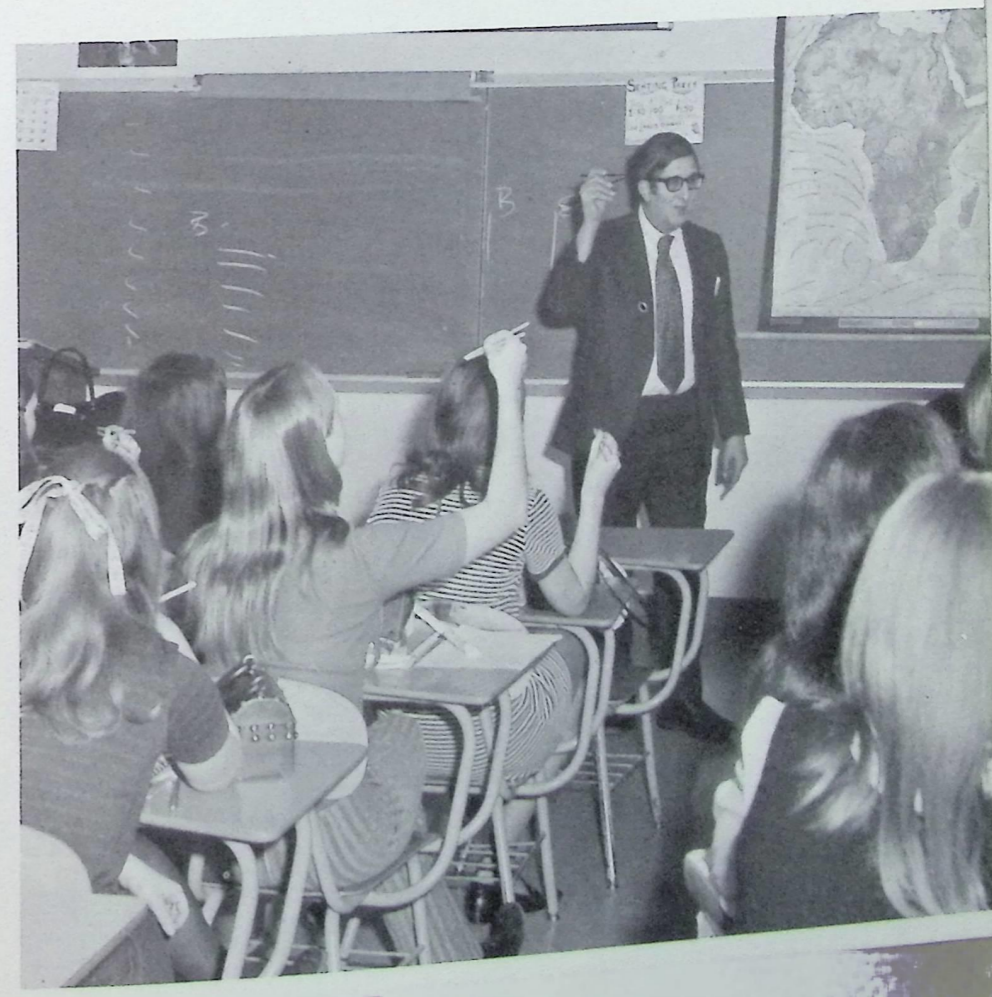


IMBIBING the cultures of foreign peoples
