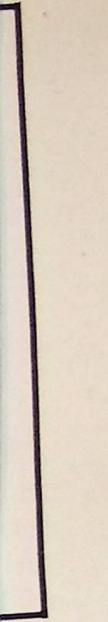
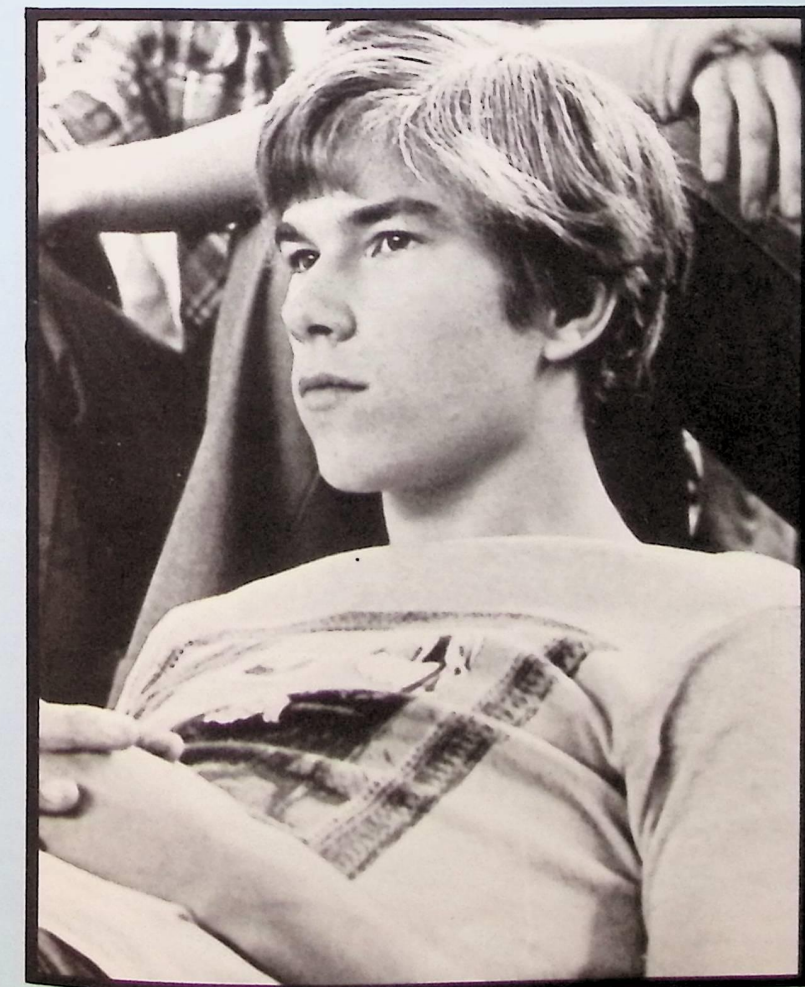
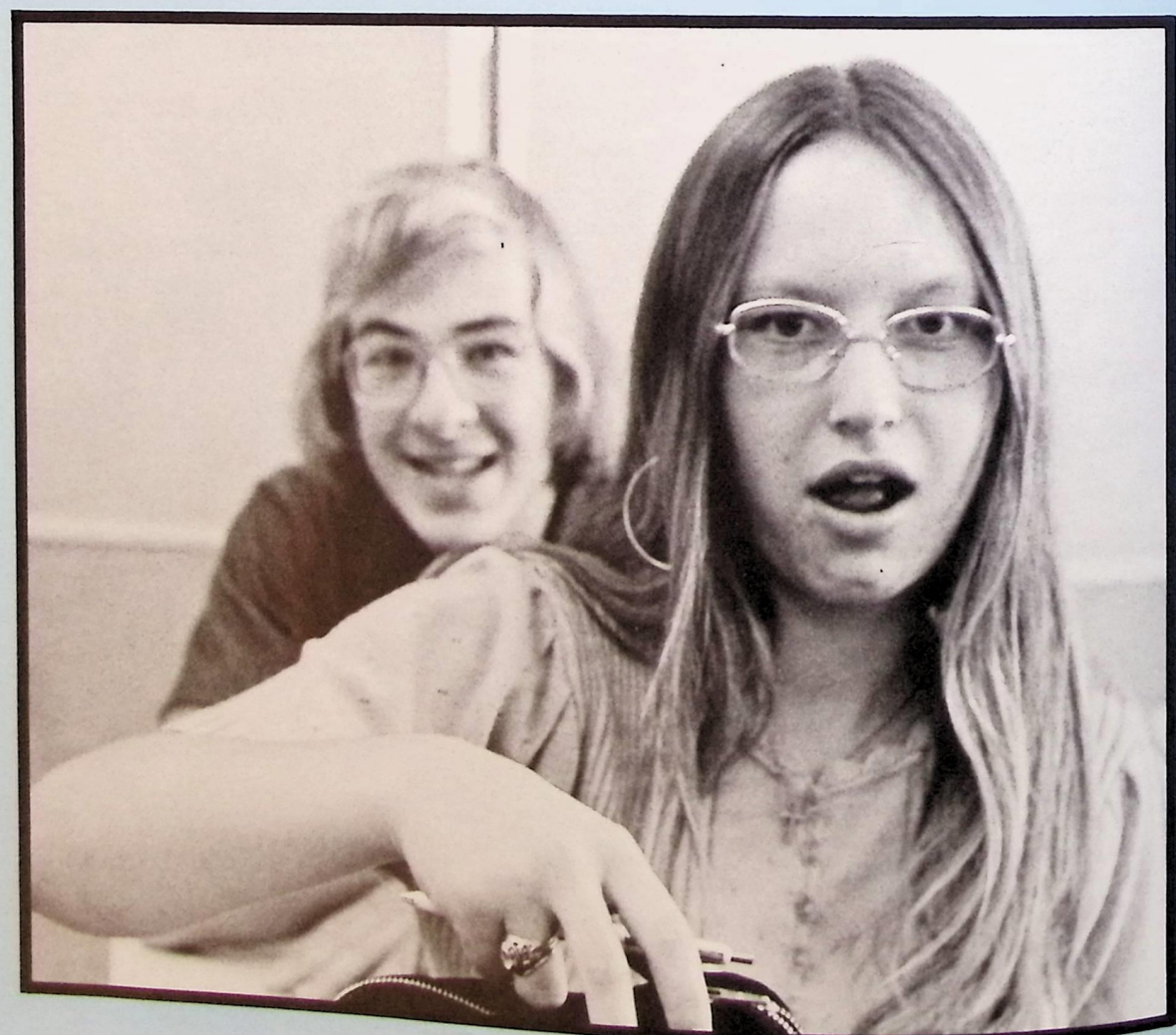
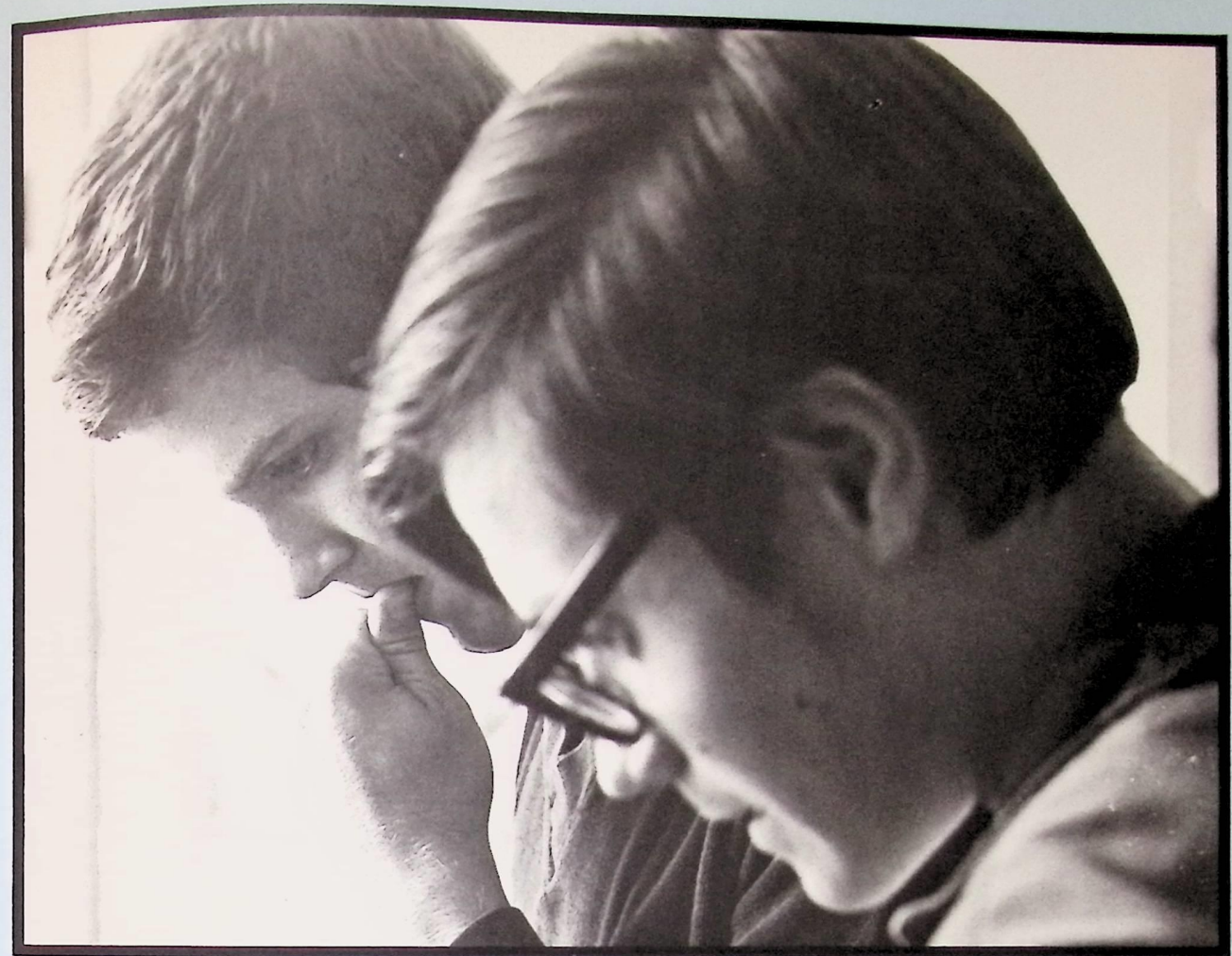
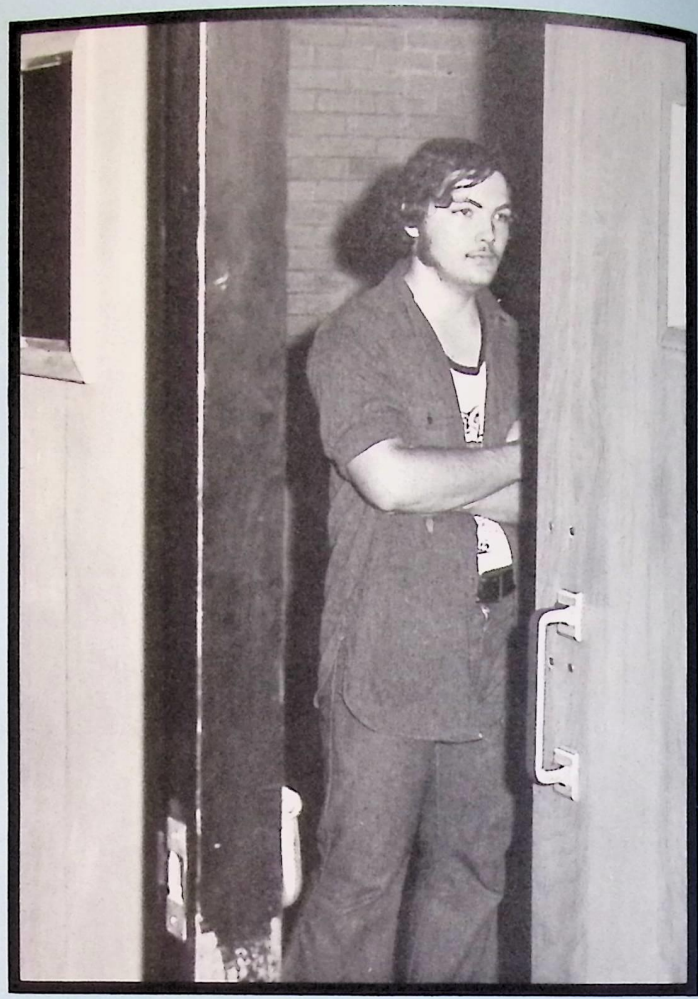




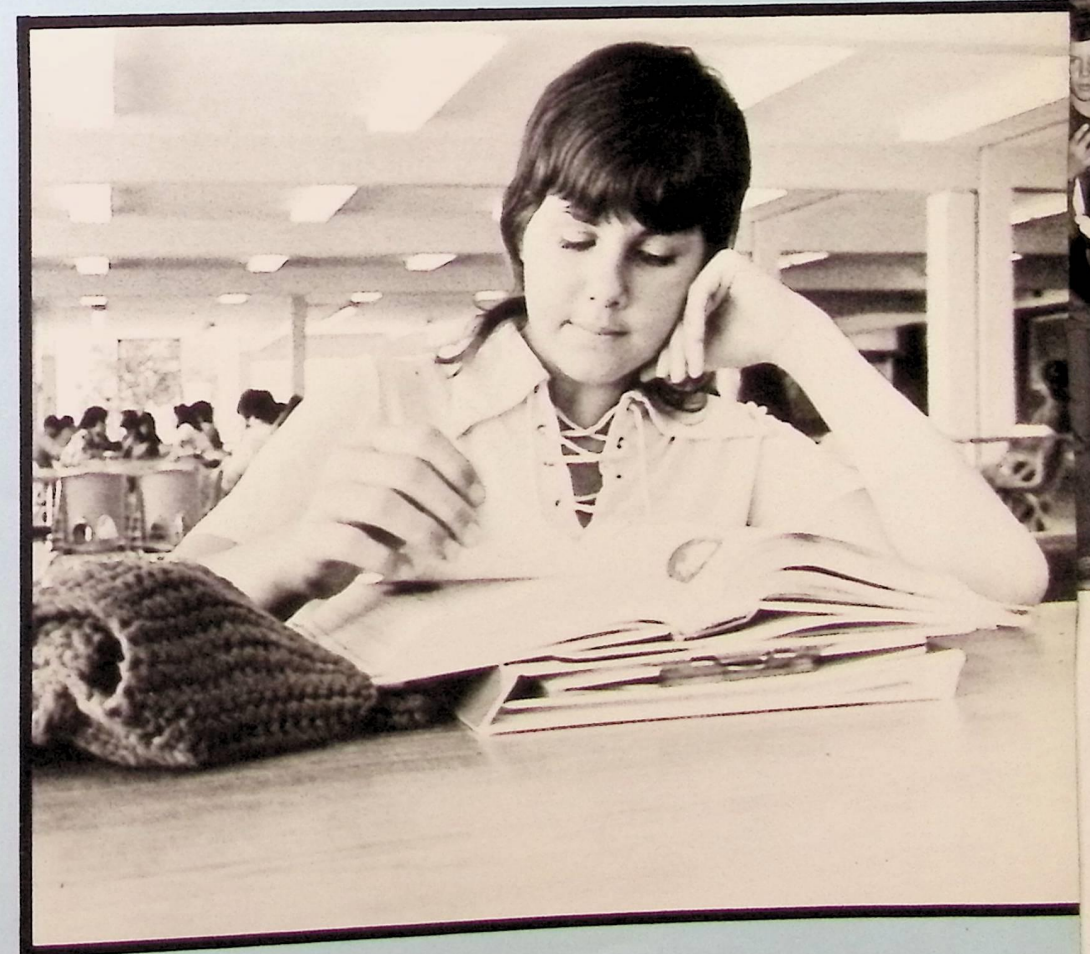
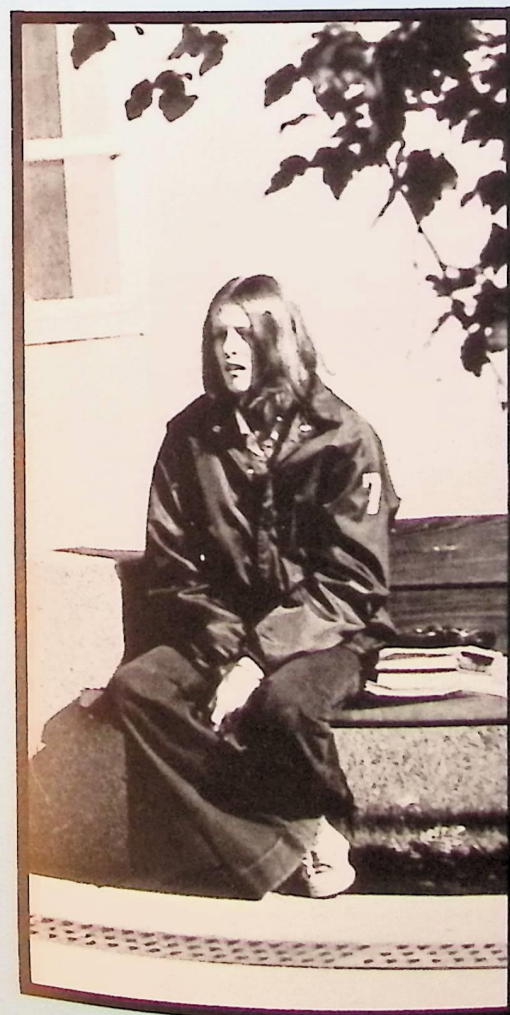
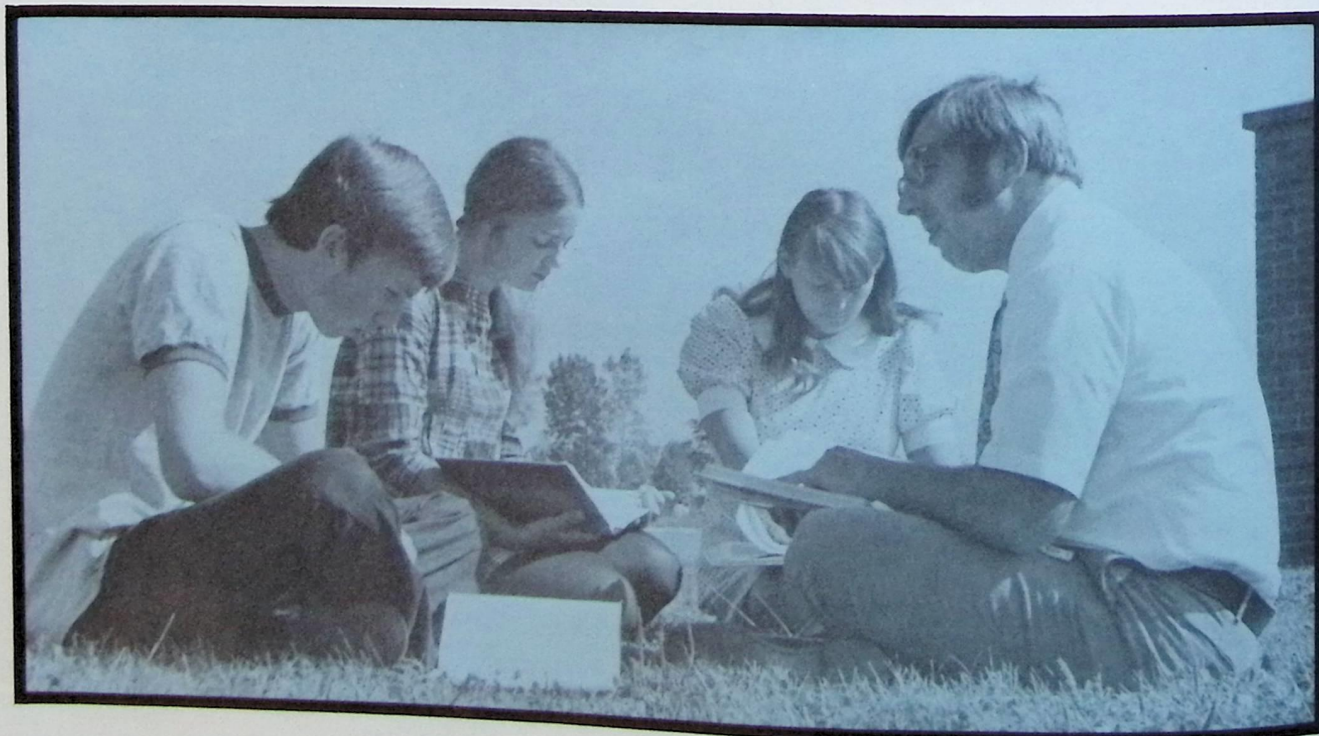
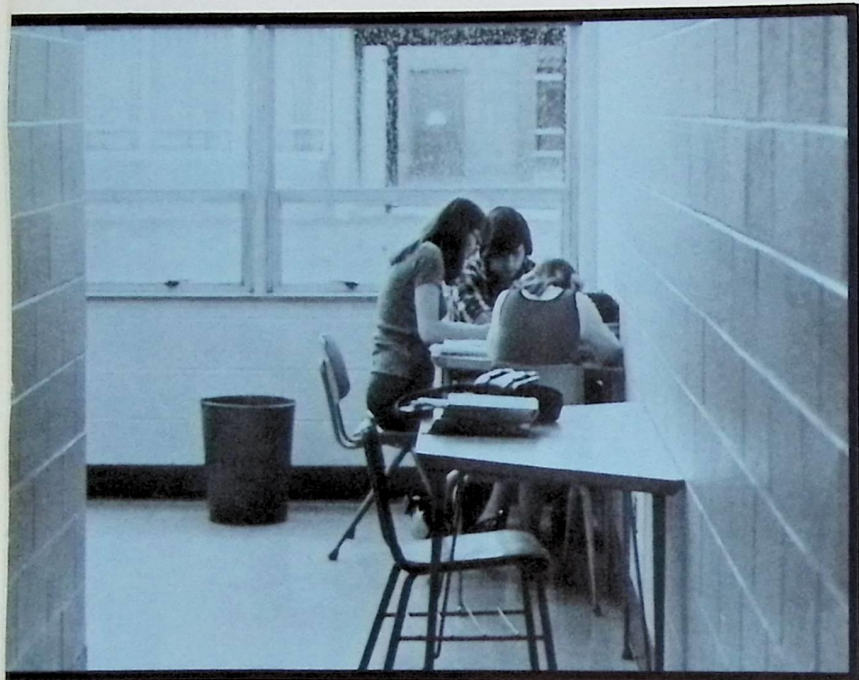
Today's changing world often tends to categorize people. Even though we find ourselves in the midst of these mass groupings it is still possible to stand alone, to be an individual.

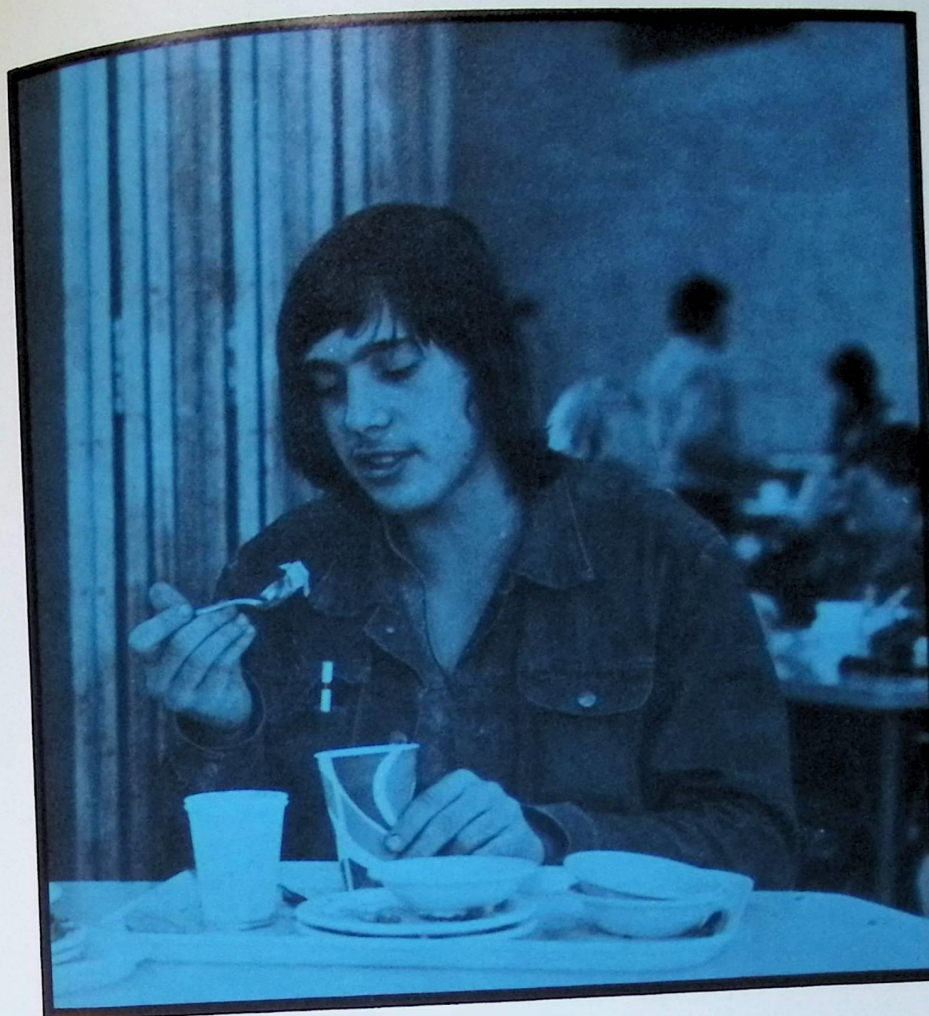
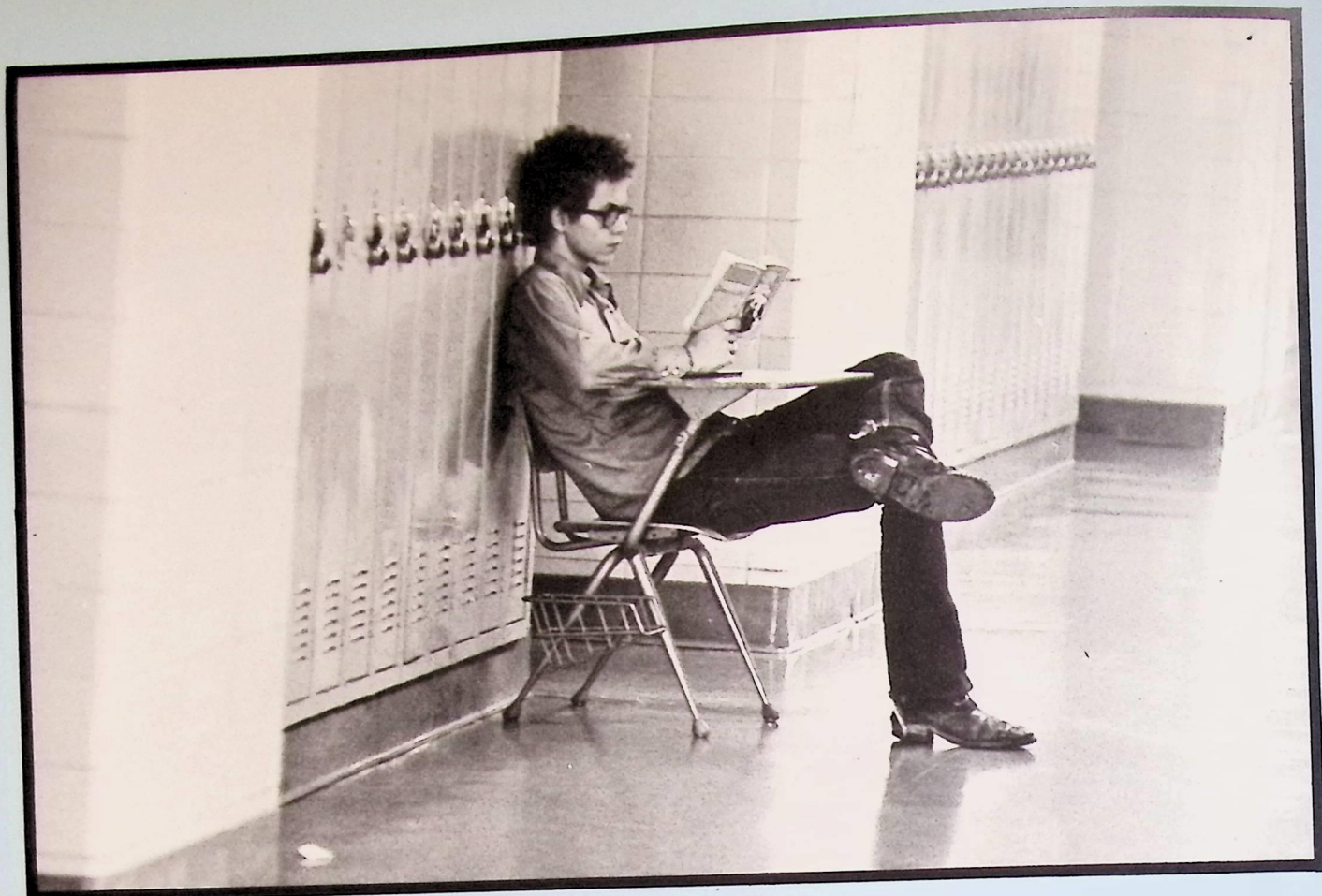
Each one of us has the opportunity to "Do their own thing" and when they feel like it.

It is the Marine Corps belief that physical fitness must be a part of any program leading to a self-disciplined mind and body. Physical fitness demands endurance, mental alertness, and self-discipline.

The exercises consist of a series of push-ups, pull-ups, standing broad jump, and a 300 yd. run. More than 40,000 high school students from more than 400 schools in the Fourth Marine Corps District compete to represent their state in the meets each year. The top three teams in each district compete in the national.

On April 6, 1973, Eastlake North became the second school to be a two-time winner in the Physi-

cal Fitness contest. Under the coaching of Andy Dow, we compiled 2,136 out of 2,500 points. North captured the Fourth Marine Corps District Meet held at the Philadelphia Naval Base on May 9, 1973. North scored 2,250 points out of 2,500 and went on to the Physical Fitness Finals in Washington D.C. on June 14. There North held sixth place in the nation with 1,984 out of a possible 2,500 points. The boys who participated are Don Montgomery, Dave Swansegar, Mickey Sibert, Larry Schedler, John Fabian, and Ed Ogrin. This was the fifth year for the North High to participate in the meet.



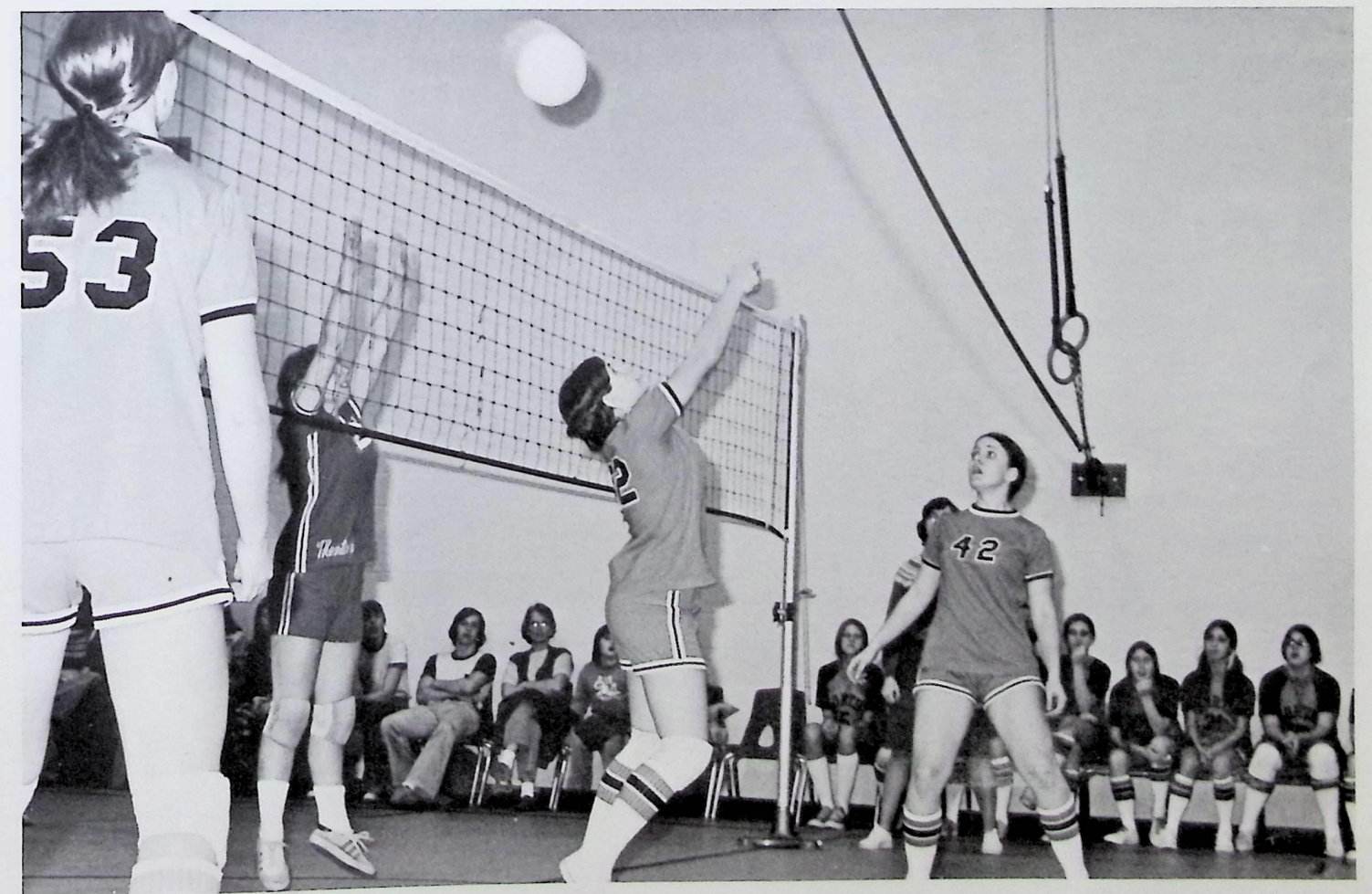

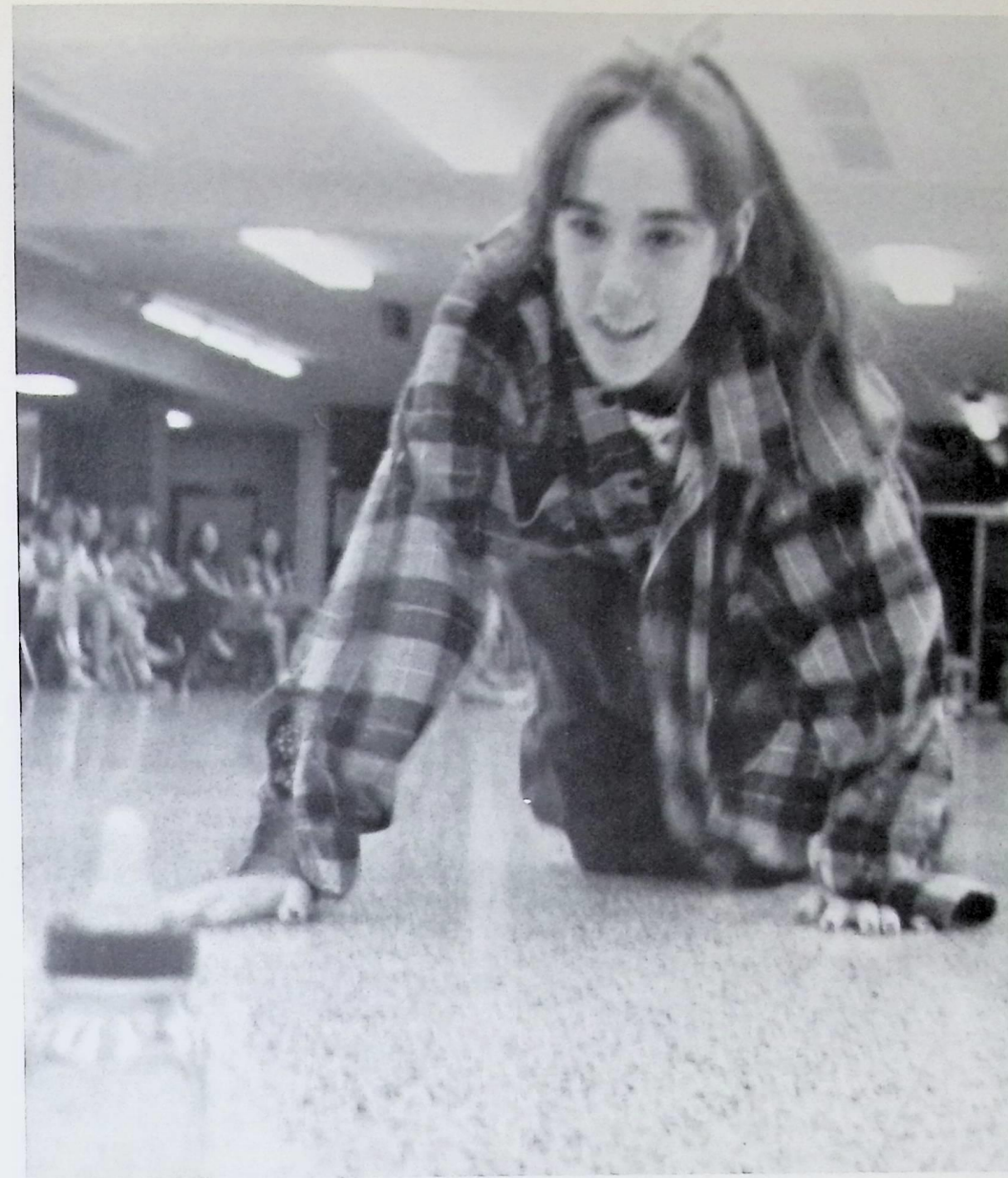
Laura Golden, Dave Brys, Ed McIntire, and alternate Sandy Ellis have shared an experience at North that no one else could—Academic Challenge.

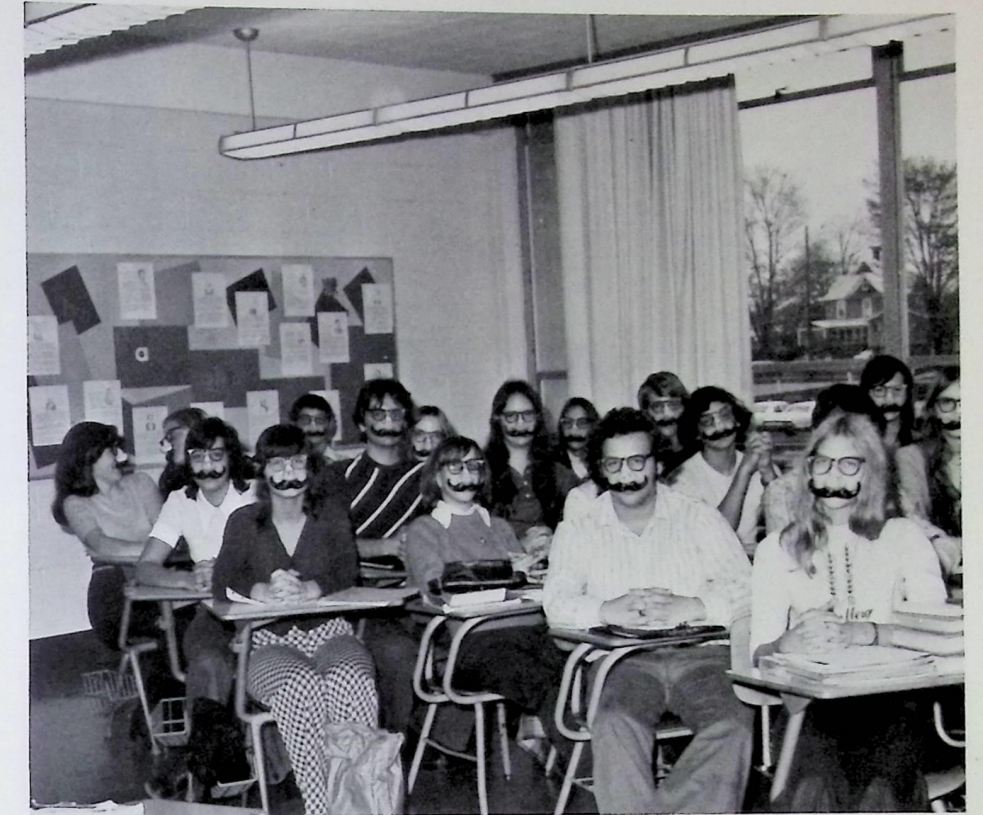

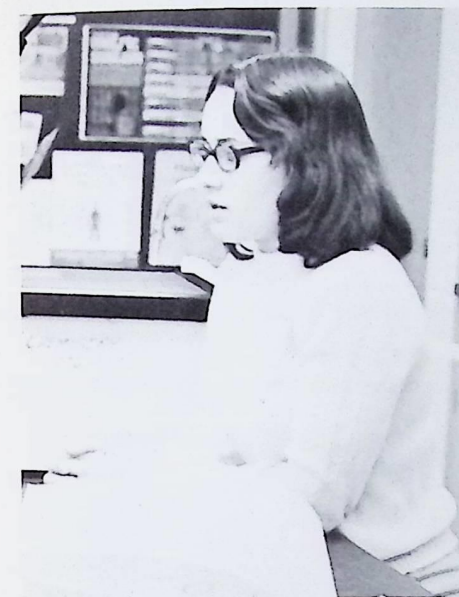

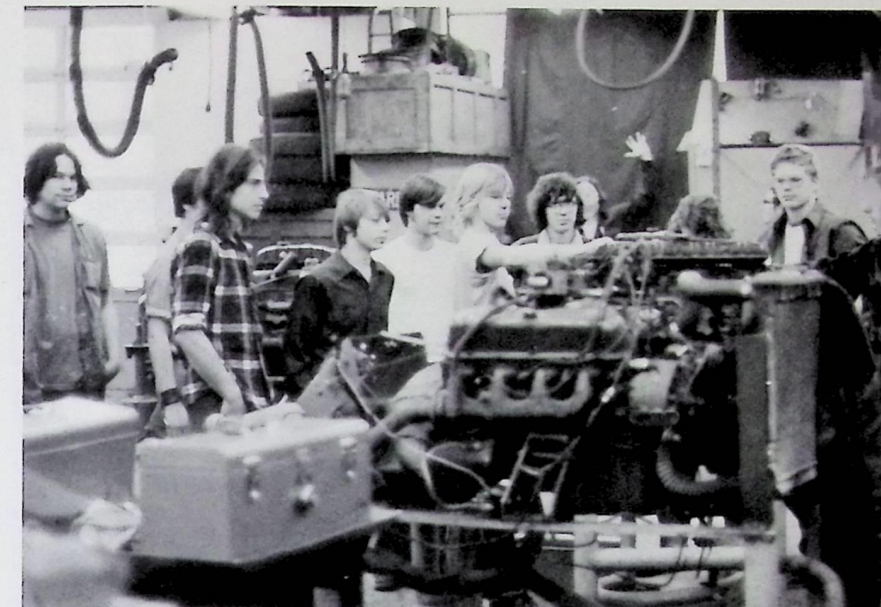

Daylight Savings Time Has Widespread Effect

On Monday, Jan. 7, North students experienced their first winter day of daylight savings time. With the exception of the Mentor school district which started a half hour later, all of Lake County's 44,000 students went to school at regular time.

In Mentor the reaction was very favorable to the change in starting time. Of the first fifty calls received by the board, only two opposed the time change. The rest of Lake County, in particular the Willoughby-Eastlake School District, was jammed with complaints from disgruntled students, parents, and bus drivers.

Most of the concern centers around the Eastlake area where many students have to walk in the dark with no sidewalks. Many parents worried because of the

school. Drivers of both buses and cars have expressed a difficulty in seeing students on the way to school.

Here at North the reaction was rather quiet, the main concern being the students who walk on Stevens Blvd. There were some students and parents who have expressed a desire for a later starting time. However the main problems in this are the number of working students at North and the scheduling. The buses in the system service 42 different area schools, both public and private, at all three levels. A change would require an entire revamping of the schedule by computer, something Mentor did not have to worry about since it services primarily its own schools.

Other steps though are being taken. Lighting in the parking
